The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana, the first of three sons of Lloyd E. Vaught and Loretta Maxine (Miles) Vaught. He graduated from North Montgomery High School in its third graduating class and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. During college he served for four years in and was a Cadet Major in Air Force ROTC. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church and in December 2000 married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode in a small private ceremony at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville Tennessee. Sir Knight Vaught has two brothers, Dale and Glen, both residing in Indiana. Lady Georgia has a sister, Gloria, living in Atlanta Georgia.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a small national accounting firm in its Indianapolis office, during which time he passed the CPA exam and was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. He subsequently moved to a large local accounting firm in Bloomington Indiana. He advanced in that firm to the level of partner. Since 1995 he has been vice-president of Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C., which has grown to be one of the larger accounting firms in Bloomington, Indiana. 

ROLL CALL OF REPRESENTATIVES

The Grand Commander then called upon the Grand Recorder to call the roll of the Grand Representatives. The Roll Call showed that there were 36 Grand Representatives present, 5 excused, 4 absent and 5 positions were vacant. Grand Commander Conquest thanked the Grand Representatives for their attendance and their good work in assisting to create warm fraternal relations with our sister jurisdictions.

Deputy Grand Commander Conquest then assumed command of the Grand Commandery while the Grand Commander delivered his Allocution as follows:

GRAND COMMANDER'S ALLOCUTION

To the Officers, Past Grand Commanders and members of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

I welcome you to this, the One Hundred Forty-eighth Grand Conclave of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana. We are also honored today by the presence of distinguished guests from both within and outside of this jurisdiction. It is my hope that they will have each receive a full share of our Hoosier hospitality.

As this Templar year draws to a close, it is customary and appropriate that I report to you on my actions, activity, decisions and recommendations. The Grand Commander has great responsibilities to execute during the recess of this body. We have come together and it is now your responsibility to review the actions taken in your name and hopefully in your best interest and to make some choices for the future.

Visitations made are listed in appendices A and B and are included here by reference.

NECROLOGY

The committee on necrology will present a full report later today; however I must report that the death of Deputy Grand Commander William Pruitt came as a great shock to many of us. Perhaps we were overly optimistic, or in denial over the seriousness of his condition. Nonetheless, I for one expected him to complete this year and be elected to this office. He was an important member of this team, and is sorely missed. In future years the impact of his departure will lessen, but the extent of the loss will continue to be remembered by those who had the opportunity to know him.

THREE WAY RECPTION

A reception was held on June 23, 2001 here at the Indianapolis Marriott East in honor of me and the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Lloyd Atterson and Most Illustrious Grand Master, Charles Rhodenhamel. It was attended by 129 people, including Most Worshipful Grand Master, Richard W. Weirzba, and the next three most senior officers of the Grand Lodge. That evening included a brief installation for those Grand Commandery Officers who had been recently advanced or appointed.

SUMMER MEETING

The summer meeting was held on Saturday August 4, 2001 at the Convention Center of Bloomington/Monroe County. The night before many of us gathered together to attend the benefit show at the Little Nashville Opry. The sale of tickets for this event raised money to support the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. A hospitality room was provided before and after the show that night.

On Saturday we held two executive committee meetings, an officer's meeting, the usual general session and the School of Instruction on inspection procedures for the year. A considerable amount of business was conducted, with reports presented, discussed, and decisions made for coming projects and events. A tour of Bloomington was provided for the ladies and an afternoon stress management presentation was available for ladies as well as Sir Knights not involved in the School of Instruction.

A dinner was held after the meetings and we again retired to a hospitality room to relax and enjoy each other's company.

MASONIC HOME FESTIVAL

The Grand Commandery of Indiana sponsored a float in the parade that was held in conjunction with the Masonic Home Festival in Franklin IN. This was on September 8, 2001. There were approximately 104 units in the parade. The Grand Commandery float received third place in the float category. First place went to the Johnson County Public Library.

WINTER MEETING

The winter meeting of the Grand Commandery was held on Saturday January 5, 2002 at the Marriott Hotel on the east side of Indianapolis. We received and discussed committee reports on a number of subjects and ongoing projects.

We continued our custom of taking time at this, the beginning of a year, to discuss the performance of the current officers and to discuss future officer selection and recruiting. In recent years I think we have been successful in identifying and appointing some of the most capable potential leaders for our

fraternity. Some may ultimately choose to accept positions with the Grand Chapter, Council or other bodies instead. Nonetheless we think that taking the initiative in this process has benefited our Order greatly.

The meeting also included a brief installation for those officers that were advanced or appointed since the summer meeting.

We also discussed the situation of a lodge, not named at this time, which may likely possess property belonging to Knights Templar of Indiana. This lodge is located in a building, which at one time had a Commandery, now closed. The lodge in question has in the past been uncooperative in attempts to obtain our property. This year they have been hostile to us and, we believe, have engaged in a dishonest attempt to conceal this property. At the winter meeting your committee on Jurisprudence recommended that no further action be taken "at this time" to recover the property. Destroying an old lodge to obtain mere things would not enhance the reputation of Knight Templary. Further, it is not clear that we could easily obtain the property now that it is in hiding. While it is unfortunate that the funds of our organization will have to be spent to replace this property, it nonetheless seems the best course at this time. Perhaps in future an opportunity to recover this property will occur.

NEWBY – AVERY BANQUET

The Newby Avery Banquet was held the evening of January 5, 2002 at the Marriott East in Indianapolis. It was attended by 78 people including Most Worshipful Grand Master Richard Wierzba, Most Eminent Grand Master William Jackson Jones, Grand Captain General William H. Koon II, Department Commander Donald Estes, and our own Most Eminent Past Grand Master Willard M. Avery, Virginia Ball, and all living Past and Honorary Past department commanders from Indiana. It was a fine meal, followed by a lively hospitality room.

GENERAL ORDERS AND BULLETINS

General Order Number 1 set out the requirements of inspection of constituent Commanderies and related matters.

General Orders Numbers 2 and 3 made changes in the role of officers necessitated by the death of our Deputy Grand Commander.

General Order number 4 related to the departure of Grand Captain General F. Keith Dunn from the line. The officers below him in line were advanced and a new Grand Sentinel was appointed to the bottom of the line.

General Order number 5 announced the requirements for the Distinguished Service Award.

General Order number 6 announced that nominations for the Knight Templar Cross of Honor were being accepted.

General Order number 7 pertained to the 2002 Grand Conclave.

Bulletin Number 1 was the Conclave Digest and reported a number of matters including appointments.

Bulletin Number 2 announced the lodge visitation membership program commenced this year.

Bulletin Number 3 set out a revised policy on introductions. In past years introductions have gotten out of hand in a misguided desire to introduce everybody at least once. This new policy was written in conjunction with the Grand High Priest and Illustrious Grand Master. It is an attempt to reduce unnecessary introductions while retaining recognition of those who have labored greatly in the service of our fraternity.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue support, including funding of DeMolay, Rainbow and Jobs Daughters. In particular I recommend continued funding of one of the social events at the DeMolay conclave. Indiana DeMolay has had two consecutive years of membership growth. These young men, especially those that attend their conclave are an ideal audience as future possible members. We need to be not just supportive but also interested and engaged in a way that connects with them directly.
- 2. I recommend continued participation and funding of the State York Rite Association. While some programs of Royal Arch and Cryptic Masons may differ from ours, we all have a common interest in other projects such as membership, Public Relations and combined classes. The State Association provides a continuing structure to execute these projects or programs.
- 3. As reported above, property has been lost due to a past incomplete closing of a Commandery. We have also seen situations in past years where a Commandery contemplating closure might spend or

give away most of its treasury. If such a Commandery does close, the successor Commandery inherits debts and a moral commitment to care for its new members, but without the treasury that should have come as well. The Assets of a Commandery do not belong to its members. They belong to our organization. The Officers of a Commandery have a fiduciary duty to properly care for the funds and property of the Commandery. Misuse of funds is an act of official misconduct. In the distant past closures were rare. Unfortunately they are no longer rare. Maybe it isn't even unfortunate in cases where we just don't have a population in some communities and since we are starting new Commanderies in areas with growing interest.

Our current procedures are now quite casual about the merger or closing of a Commandery. I recommend that the Grand Commander appoint a committee to serve for three years to study our current law and procedures. The purpose should be to define a new procedure that has as its goal not just the easiest way to make these changes but rather the best interests of the reassigned members and the best interests of the Order of Knights Templar.

4. I recommend that the Indiana Templar Academy be continued. It should however be reviewed and, if necessary, modified in order that it be relevant and be a highly regarded program.

INSPECTIONS

The question is often asked, what is the purpose of an inspection? The inspection procedure in use this year was based on the idea of determining the ability of a Commandery to get the orders conferred in an impressive and capable manner. A Commandery might not be able to confer an Order entirely by itself, maybe not even close. They should each be able to get an Order conferred. The recruiting of help from other Commanderies is customary in our State. In fact I believe it is one of our strongest virtues that we are there for each other and will travel to help out another Commandery. Certainly being able to do the work yourself represents a higher ability to get it done. It doesn't mean the place borrowing people is without worth.

The Deputy Grand Commander has compiled the inspection results, and you will hear any recommendations he and the Grand Inspector General may have. I don't think there is any one right way to have inspections. The officers of this Grand Commandery have spent a lot of time this year discussing the meaning and purpose of inspections. The inspection protocol to be announced for fall 2002 is a product of those discussions and I commend the other line officers of the Grand Commandery for their effort to find the best way to serve the Order.

ACTIONS IN REGARD TO CHARTERS

The dispensations were renewed for St Anselm UD and Crown Point UD

In August 2001 Lebanon Commandery #43 voted to merge with Frankfort Commandery #29, who had voted to accept them.

In August 2001 Tipton Commandery #52 voted to merge with Kokomo Commandery #36, who had voted to accept them. The members of Tipton had considered other Commanderies but after discussions selected Kokomo as being in the best interest of their members and the Order of Knights Templar.

EAST CENTRAL DEPARTMENT MEETING

The East Central Department meeting was held in Indianapolis on March 8 and 9, 2002. The meeting this year was in conjunction with the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons. A number of pertinent topics were presented and the event was considered very worthwhile by the 22 Indiana Sir Knights in attendance.

GRAND MASTER'S YORK RITE CLASS

A class in honor of Most Worshipful Grand Master Richard W. Wierzba was held in Valparaiso Indiana on March 16, 2001. More than 40 brothers received the degrees and Orders of the York Rite. The quality of the ritual work was excellent, and the overall event scheduling and amenities were well thought out. The general chairman was our own Sir Knight Lawrence Kaminsky. He and his team deserve a lot of credit for the success of the event.

EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE

A bus excursion was organized by the Grand Commandery to attend the Easter Sunrise Service in Washington DC on the weekend of March 28 through 31, 2002. There were 33 of us on the bus this year. We have had bigger groups in other years but many states have had trouble getting a sufficient size group together this year. At least we had enough to go as a group.

CONCLUSION

REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES

To The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

The market value of the Permanent Fund of the Grand Commandery as of the latest available report (February 28, 2003) is \$256,695.40 as compared with a value of \$262,097.85 one year ago. This value reflects the depressed market conditions that still affect almost all equity investments in this current time frame. A brighter note is that as this report is being written (late in the month of March, 2002) is that there has been a strengthening of the market that we hope will be sustainable in the months ahead. It would still seem prudent to "stay the course" with our current portfolio rather than to suffer the substantial losses that would have to be taken to move to other investments.

We are pleased to again report that it appears possible to complete the current year's budget without a transfer from the Permanent Fund. While the 2003-2004 Budget has not yet been completed, we hope that it will also be possible to fund that budget with the withdrawal of a minimal amount from the Permanent Fund.

The Life Membership Fund is still invested in Certificates of Deposit and since we have been investing in a "laddered list of maturities", we are still receiving a better-than-current overall average return even though funds that roll over are being invested at lower rates. Again, in the current climate, there are not too many other options. The Trustees will continue to monitor and assess the situation in the coming months.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS March 31, 2002

NOTE I - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments The organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the new standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities. The effect of this change was immaterial.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support. (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted. In addition, the Commandery is required to present a statement of cash flow

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c) (10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

REPORT OF THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana.

The membership statistics for 2001 indicate that Indiana had a net decrease of 167 Sir Knights. On January 1, 2001 there were 5861 members, with 5694 on December 31, 2001. The loss of 167 members is a loss of 2.8% of our membership. We lost 195 to death, 105 demits, and 81 suspensions.

A report of the Grand Recorder, found elsewhere in the Advanced Proceedings, will show the membership changes by Commandery. The following are significant statistics from the 47 Commanderies:

- 174 Knightings total in Indiana from 36 different Commanderies
- 24 Reinstated in 14 different Commanderies
- 11 Commanderies had NO Knightings
- 12 Commanderies showed a gain in membership (not including affiliation gains)
- 4 Commanderies showed a breakeven in membership
- 31 Commanderies showed a loss in membership

Membership development plans have been planned and made available in all corners of the State of Indiana. As the Lodge visitation program, speakers who will visit Blue Lodges upon request, sojourning classes, the Grand Masters Class, and encouragement by the Grand Line Officers. You have been urged to follow the Grand Encampment 5/50 Plan. Yet we still have not been able to increase our membership numbers. The key remains that we need to have inspired leaders to come forward in each Commandery to accomplish membership gains. It can be done!

The committee fully supports the continuation of the Lodge visitation program. The Battalion Commanders summarized the participation of the program in the fall of 2001, finding that 16 Commanderies had made at least two visitations to a local Blue Lodge. These 16 Commanderies are to be commended and are urged to continue. The Commanderies that have little or no activity in planning Lodge visits are encouraged to make initial plans and participate.

The committee met on March 16, 2002 to study the current membership development program and made the following recommendations:

Recommendation 1) Implement a membership award program of a lapel pin that can be worn on garments other than the Commandery uniform. The pin to be round (size of quarter) with the words, "Indiana Membership" on the outer ring printed in gold with a black background. The inner portion of the pin to be a white Maltese Cross, with a black background. The outside rings and Maltese Cross to be outlined in gold. All recipients will wear the same lapel pin. A ribbon will be attached to the pin and will hang at a length of approximately 1 X 2 times the diameter of the pin and the bottom of the ribbon will taper down to the persons tight. The color of the ribbon will correspond to the color of the existing lanyard cord program (either one or two colored) and will be awarded on the same basis as the current lanyard program. As an award winner progresses in top line signings, he will receive a new ribbon for his pin, in addition to the lanyard cord. The pin and ribbon will become the property of the recipient. The lapel pin/ribbon award program will be funded by the Membership Development Fund of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

Recommendation 2) Develop an outreach program for Master Masons to become York Rite members at various state wide or area meetings/conferences, using displays, handouts, power point presentations, etc, with the approval of the Grand Lodge.

Recommendation 3) A two fold plan to reduce the loss of membership through demits be implemented. 1). Reduce demits by making personal contact with members behind on dues payment and/or develop a continuous communication link with all members (newsletters, phone calls, etc.); and 2) Compile a list of demitted members from all Commanderies in Indiana, and make personal contacts with each one to encourage them to reinstate.

We are impressed by the comments some of the pastors have made and I have chosen this one from our pilgrimage in 2001.

Rev. Gary Roberts - It was wonderful to sit and ponder that just maybe my steps fell into the very steps that Jesus took. Someone said being in the Holy Land is experiencing the fifth gospel. This has to be true. Being in the Holy Land did make the scriptures come alive with the help of our guide. Walking the Stations of the Cross and hearing the story at each station was awe-inspiring. To worship at the Garden Tomb was a joy filled moment - I could almost feel the wonder the disciples felt when they realized the story was true. Seeing the place where Jesus may have spent his last night helped me to understand why the disciples ran and denied him. My preaching will never be the same. I will never be the same. How does one say thank you for a life changing experience? How do we say thanks for the gift that transforms?

Into our lives some rain must fall; and surely it did when our guide of some l2 years called me with the news:

Lt. Moshe Eini, 22, from Petah Tikva, was the third and youngest child of Nurit and Ezra. Eini graduated from the Ben Gurion High School and joined the Israel Air Force. After a few months he was transferred to serve in the Engineers Corps. "Moshe was happy, as usual. He was a person who knew how to enjoy life, loved to help others," said Eini's friend. He was buried February 21st. This young lad was a friend - his Dad is the guide we have used over the last 12 years. The family adopted me as their grandfather. His Dad called me with a broken heart. Would that I could have put my arms around that family. Pray for the family of Ezra Elm as well as all the others in this conflict; Palestinian as well as Jewish friends.

To the friends of Eini Ezra, Nurit, Shmulik, Yael & Yaron.

On Tuesday, February 19, 2002, our youngest son Moshe (Moishale) was killed.

Moishale was an officer in the Combat Engineers Corps when he fell in the line of duty. Moishale was 22 years old.

All his life Moishale was a keen sportsman and enjoyed a variety of sports, among them rock climbing and ball games - especially basketball.

Following his tragic death, our family has decided to establish a sports center in his memory. The sports center will be established on the campus of the Association's Rest & Recreation Center for Combat Soldiers in Asbkelon.

This center gives about 600 soldiers every day an opportunity to take a break from their military duties. The center was built about 30 years ago and was developed around one central building. This building originally was a British police station.

In the beginning the soldiers slept in tents. Later, several sleeping quarters were built and they are in use until this very day. During the last few years, 5 new modern buildings of 20 rooms have been established.

Besides the residential accommodations, the resort includes a club, game rooms, a dining room, a swimming pool, a large cafeteria and a room with 20 computers connected to the internet. An entertainment team is in charge of making the stay as enjoyable as possible by organizing games, sports' competitions, disco, etc. All these provide the young soldiers with the comforts they so deserve and enable them to relax both physically and mentally from their military duties.

Our family has decided to assist in establishing a sports center that will include: two basketball courts, a tennis court, a handball court and a soccer field.

A sports center of this nature will be true to Moishale's character.

The sports center will be named: "The Moshe (Moishale) Eini Sports Center".

The cost of the project is about \$400,000. The part that we need to raise is \$150,000 and the remainder by the Association for the Wellbeing of Israel's Soldiers.

We estimate that the project will be completed by the end of the year 2002.

We are asking our friends to do whatever they can to assist us in funding this sports center project and by so doing, help us to perpetuate Moishale's memory.

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

The monies received during the period from May 1, 2001, through November 30, 2001, was down this year, perhaps due to the events after September 11, 2001. Many charitable organizations experienced the same drop in income, but not because people had stopped giving. My office received \$300.00 for the Grand Commander's Club, \$100.00 for one Patron, and \$80.00 for memorials.

Thus far in the Voluntary Campaign, the Sir Knights of Indiana have donated \$12,628.50 (week ending April 12, 2002), putting us at 17th place in ranking for cumulative total and 36th place for per capita giving at \$2.20 per Knight. Seymour Commandery #56 gave us a big boost up front in this campaign with a \$5,000.00 bequest from the estate of Sir Knight Charles Spraugh. With the contributions made by the Indiana Order of the Eastern Star, we should finish in much better shape than normal.

All Commanderies in Indiana have participated in the Voluntary Campaign this year. Per capita goes from \$.12 to \$53.26 per Knight.

NATIONAL CHILDREN'S EYE CARE PILOT PROGRAM

When we were first approached to do a pilot program for the National Children's Eye Care program, there was never a time limit set. Volunteers from several of our Commanderies stepped forward and were trained to do eye screening on four year old children. They received certification from Prevent Blindness Indiana for three years.

The pilot program has been successful to the point that several other Grand Commanderies have tried (with differing success) to copy our example. The partnership with Prevent Blindness Indiana and Dr. Eugene Helveston has enabled us to succeed where others may have failed.

It is now time to re-certify our volunteers, so I believe that it is also time to retire the "pilot program" concept and make this a fully functioning philanthropy. A partnership between the Indiana Academy of Ophthalmology, Prevent Blindness Indiana, and the Grand Commandery of Indiana should be sought.

Second, with this being a Triennial year, National drill competition will be held in St. Louis, Missouri. The committee wanted to encourage more teams to particulate in drills. At this year's triennial "Class-D" teams will be permitted to compete this year. The Indiana drill committee had several requests for information about "How do you start a drill team?" and what do I do with it after I get it started?" But, I do want to thank all the Sir Knights who drill, thank you for your time. ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

General Order No. 1 – Vaught – 2001-2002

April 28, 2001

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. Each Commandery shall be inspected by its respective battalion commander, except as follows. The designated primary Commandery of each Grand Officer excluding the Grand Prelate, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Inspector General and Grand Organist will be inspected by the Grand Inspector General. Other exceptions or substitutions may be made as authorized by the Grand Commander.
- 3. Each Commandery will be inspected individually with the exception of LaValette Commandery No. 15, Vincennes Commandery No. 20 and Wright Commandery No. 64 which may participate in Joint Inspections.
- 4. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander. The date and time may not be changed after the Official Inspection Schedule has been approved except by a special dispensation issued by the Grand Commander.
- 5. Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Duties, and confer the Order of the Red Cross, Order of Malta or Order of the Temple. Conferring the Order upon an actual candidate is encouraged, as are open inspections.
- 6. The full form Opening and the conferring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent official interpretations thereof. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used.
- 7. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the inspection. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to supply or provide any assistance that another Commandery may need. If an actual candidate is present the quality of the impression made upon such candidate shall be of prime importance.
- 8. An Instructional meeting may be held instead of any, or all, ritualistic work when the Inspecting Officer deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.
- 9. The Inspecting Officer shall examine the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery and shall issue such instructions of comments that he may deem necessary in reference to these items.
- 10. Each Inspecting Officer will send a Notice of Inspection courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder in advance of the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival, and request certain reports to be completed. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival. In addition, the Recorder will gather all Rituals from the Officers and make them available for review by the Inspecting Officer.

11. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so may cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.

Upon completion of each Inspection, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first and then the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times if the Grand Commander is not present, then the Inspection Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Commander is present, he will be the final speaker unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance in which case the Grand Master will be the final speaker.

- 13. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Deputy Grand Commander and the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the Commandery inspected.
- 14. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred. All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose. A full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given at the Annual Conclave in Indianapolis on April 26, 2002.
- 15. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 16. It is suggested that if a Commandery is unable to comply with this General Order without assistance, that they contact surrounding Commanderies for assistance. NO COMMANDERY WILL BE EXEMPTED FROM MEETING FOR AN ANNUAL INSPECTION OF THE RECORDS OF THE TREASURER AND RECORDER.
- 17. Each Grand Officer excluding the Grand Prelate, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Inspector General and Grand Organist shall be authorized to open or close a Commandery in ample form on such occasions, as he may consider appropriate. The authorization to do so rests exclusively with the highest ranking such officer present.
- 18. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

147TH CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 147th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel, Indianapolis. The Sir Knights of Lafayette Commandery #4, the home Commandery of the R. E. Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave.

The lines were formed by the Knights of Fort Wayne Drill Team, under the direction of S.K. David Ulrich as Captain. Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S.K.'s Steven J. Barton, K.C.T., P.G.C., and Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., K.C.T., P.G.C. Inspecting officer was S.K. William Henry Thornley, Jr., Most Eminent Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment and Personal Representative of William Jackson Jones, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, of the United States of America. Also present was S.K. Donald M. Estes, R.E. Department Commander of the East Central Department. In addition, S.K. James S. DeMond, K.G.C., and Past Department Commander, as well as S.K.'s Robert E. Price, K.G.C., R. Frank Williams, K.C.T., and Willard R. Clutter, K.C.T., Honorary Past Department Commanders, were in attendance. S.K. Roger S. VanGordon, Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana, represented Gail N. Kemp, M. W. Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana and took an active part in all of the proceedings. The colors were presented by the officers in the West and all present participated in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 37 were present, 4 absent, 3 were excused, and 4 are vacant. The Report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 190 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest, including Edmund F. Ball, P.G.C. These named Sir Knights were appropriately eulogized and Past Grand Master Willard M. Avery presented an excellent tribute to Sir Knight Ball. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 148 for the year 2000 with 164 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Eye Foundation Committee reported that contributions to the Voluntary Campaign, December 1, 2000 through April 30, 2001, totaled \$4,166.00 The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee reported that 14 Indiana Pastors had been given the opportunity to visit the Holy Land during the past year, a new single- year total. This brings to a total of 164 the number of Indiana Pastors who have participated in the program. The Camp Crosley Committee reported that 32 boys and girls attended Camp Crosley in 2000 as guests of the Commanderies of Indiana. The Educational Loan Foundation Committee reported that 3 loans aggregating \$39,000.00 were made during the year and that total loans outstanding totaled \$100,065.15 at years end. A continuing shortage of applicants has curtailed the lending, even though allowable loans were raised to \$3,000.00 per year or a total of \$6,000.00 per applicant.

The official Conclave Program Book, now entitled "The Templar Crusader", was again made available to those present, and a donation was made to the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee and the Camp Crosley program in the amount of \$910.00. A total of forty-nine persons traveled from Indiana to attend the Easter Sunrise Pilgrimage in Washington, D.C., and the Indiana Sir Knights, joined by a number of others, including the M.E. Grand Master, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Each local York Rite body should plan and execute one of the following membership development programs.

- 1 A lodge visitation program in which visitations are made to a local lodge. The lodge should be selected from those, which have no known active York Rite members as members. The lodge should be visited by a group of at least four members of the York Rite at least four times during the year. If requested to make a York Rite presentation to the lodge it may do so but this program does not require it.
- 2 A guest program with involves inviting eligible Master Masons who are not York Rite members to an event the primary purpose of which is to present information on the York Rite and solicit them to join our bodies. This may be done with a dinner or some other event. The presenters may wish to use materials such as the Grand Chapter slide show or other presentations as may be developed.

Any York Rite body that believes that neither of these programs would be effective or practical in their case may conduct any other reasonable program that they choose. An alternate program may be elected by making request to the battalion commander who will then contact the Grand Commander to determine if the alternate program should qualify. No reasonable program will be rejected. The objective is that each York Rite should plan and execute some definite program for membership development.

To encourage and assist local bodies, the Grand bodies will provide or make available the Grand Chapter slide presentation, the State York Rite Association, brochures, the existing award programs, and advertising in the Indiana Freemason and such other materials as may be developed.

Introduction Policy

Companions and Fraters:

Over the years, the lists of people to be introduced at an instructional meeting, inspection or other occasion has grown to a point un-imagined by our founders. While well intentioned, it has produced some unfortunate effects. Introductions have become a lengthy process. People are introduced who were never intended to be included, and when we have tried to speed up the process we often do so, not by reducing the number of people to be introduced, but rather by giving minimal recognition to those who work the hardest for our fraternity. We also lose sight of the patience and endurance of those on the sidelines who must await the entrance of distinguished guests.

In a joint effort to improve on these conditions, we, the three presiding officers of Indiana York Rite, in consultation with others of our respective organizations and each other have drafted this joint statement of policy defining and clarifying who is to be introduced on most occasions. For the 2001 - 2002 York Rite year only people holding the positions listed on the attached pages should be formally received at the altar, or through the lines of a Commandery. In general this list provides for introduction of all Grand Officers of all Masonic bodies. Companions and Sir Knights who once held an office such as Past Grand High Priest are introduced only if they retain a permanent rank under the rules of their branch of Fraternity.

There will be exceptions for certain events and they will be addressed as they arise. It should also be noted that this policy in no way limits the prerogative of an officer to refer to, welcome, congratulate, or introduce someone on the sidelines during his official or unofficial remarks. The Commandery for example will be introducing Deputy Battalion Commanders working at a particular inspection from their places on the sidelines.

Future leaders may well make modifications to this policy. However, we ask and direct that this policy be applied for this year. All the members of our great fraternity will ultimately contribute to future policy by their expressions of opinion, opinions that we all try to respect and reflect.





ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 – Charter date September 1853. Greensburg No.2 was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was re-organized and located in Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was changed to Baldwin No.2.

Cambridge City No. 6 – On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville No.6 was changed to Cambridge City No.6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No.7 – Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was "surrendered".

William Hacker No.9 – Organized April 4, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown #9 on April 28, 1874.

Warsaw No. 10 – Chartered April 17, 1868. Merged with Goshen No.50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No.14 – Chartered April 14, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No.14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No.16 – Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No.16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No.17 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929. Revoked by action of the Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000, and merged with Anderson No.32.

Marion No.21 – Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changed to Grant County No.21 on April 20, 1990.

Caleb Schmidlapp No.22 – Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No.22 on April 1, 1873.

Madison No.22 – Successor to Caleb Schmidlapp No.22. Charter surrendered June 12, 2001, and merged with Columbus No.14.

Franklin No.23 – Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No.23 on April 20, 1900.

Plymouth No.26 – Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No.13.

Washington No.33 – Chartered April 16, 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes No.20.

Cyrene No.34 – Chartered May 2, 1891. Names changed to Columbia City No.34 on May 9, 1947.

Princeton No.46 – Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette No.15.

Rushville No.49 – Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville No.6.

Mishawaka No.51 – Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973, and merged with South Bend No.13.

Tipton No.52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo No.36.

Winchester No.53 – Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No.18.

Sullivan No.54 – Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 29, 1979.

Martinsville No.55 – Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered December 1, 1932.

Gary No.57 – Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No.57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995. Granted a change of location by the Grand Commander in 2000, Gary No.57 moved to Hobart.

East Chicago No.58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No.41 at same location.

Greensburg No.59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered September 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No.14.

Peru No.60 – Chartered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989, and merged with Wabash No.37.

DeMolay No.62 – Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No.62 on May 12, 1941.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA (cont.)

Oriental No.62 – Successor to DeMolay No.62. At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No.62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No.62, but no record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No.62 – Charter was arrested by Grand Commander, March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the Charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, Calvin Prather Lodge No.717.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001, to form a Commandery at Crown Point.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. – Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to form a Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.
