Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Sir Knight William Howard Koon, II Most Eminent Grand Master Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA



William H. Koon II, GCT M. E. Grand Master (2007 - 2012) of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar President of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc.

S.K. Koon was born in Lima, Ohio on March 12, 1949 to William H. and Vivian Brown Koon. He is a graduate of Bath High School, and attended the Ohio State University. He is a member of the Columbus Grove United Church of Christ. Bill is married to Elizabeth Jane Thornley, and they reside less than a mile from the family farm where he grew up near Columbus Grove, Ohio. They have a daughter, Andrea Koon Gillespie; son-in-law, Adam Gillespie; two grandsons, Adam Kade Gillespie, Silas Robert Gillespie; and son, William Steven Winebrenner. Bill is the President of Lord's Enterprises Inc. and Republic Mills Inc., both family agri-businesses including, livestock feed manufacturing, grain elevators, and a farming operation. He is involved in many professional and civic organizations, both locally, and statewide.

Masonically, Bill is a Senior DeMolay of Fidelity Chapter in Lima, and holds the Chevalier, Cross of Honor, Active Legion of Honor, is an Active Member of the International Supreme Council Order of DeMolay, and in 2006 was invested with the DeMolay Grand Cross. He was raised a Master Mason in 1970 in Ada Lodge No. 344, and demitted to Rufus Putnam Lodge No. 364 in Columbus Grove, where he served 3 years as Worshipful Master. In 2001 he became a dual member of Ft. Amanda Lodge No. 706 in Lima. He is a Past High Priest of Lima Chapter No. 49 RAM, and Past Illustrious Master of Lima Council No. 20 R&SM. In 2008 Bill was appointed the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Romania R&SM near the Grand Council of Ohio. He was knighted in Shawnee Commandery No. 14 by his father on March 13, 1971, and was elected Eminent Commander in 1980. He is a member of Shawnee Commandery No. 14 Drill Team, marching in 7 Triennial Drills beginning in Chicago in 1973, including twice as Captain. He is a member, and Charter Commander of St. George Commandery No. 76, Ivanhoe Commandery No. 54, Van Wert, OH, St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, Denver, CO, Frankfort Commandery No. 4, Frankfort, KY, and Blaney Commandery No. 5, Tremont, IL. In addition to Ohio, Bill is a member and voting delegate of the Grand Commanderies of Ohio, Colorado, Illinois, and Kentucky. In 2006, Bill was elected an Honorary Member of the Wyoming Black Horse Troop.

Sir Knight Koon first served the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio, as an Aidede-Camp to S.K. William J. Faul, KCT, during his term as Grand Commander and received the Meritorious Service Award for his efforts in 1981. Bill served the First Division of the Grand Commandery of Ohio as Deputy Division Commander from 1985 - 1987, and was appointed Grand Sentinel by Sir Knight Frank W. Crane, KCT, REGC in 1987. He was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio on September 13, 1996. In 2007 he was declared a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio and its Jurisdiction, PHA. In 2009 he was made an Honorary Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Virginia. In June 2009 he was elected an Honorary Past Commander of King Ferdinand Commandery No. 1 in Bucharest, Romania, and at the LXIV Triennial he was elected an Honorary Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Romania, which was the first official action taken after the formation of that Grand Commandery.

Bill served the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA, as a member of the Easter Sunrise Breakfast Committee, and an ad-hoc member of the Committee on Drill Regulations from 1991 - 1994, and was Co-Chairman of the Committee on Drill Regulations during the 1994 - 1997 Triennium. He served 8 years as the personal Aide to S.K. Ned E. Dull, GCT, MEPGM of the Grand Encampment, and as the Affinity Coordinator for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation MasterCard program from 1991 to 1999. Bill was invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple by the Grand Encampment in 1992, and is currently the Deputy for the Ohio KCT Program. He was appointed Department Commander of the East Central Department for the 1997 - 2000 Triennium. Bill was elected Right Eminent Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment on August 15, 2000 in Nashville, Tennessee. Upon Installation into that Office, he was invested with the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple. On August 16, 2006, he was installed as Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment. In 2007, he was appointed Grand Representative of the Great Priory of the United Masonic, Religious and Military Orders of The Temple and Sepulcher and of The Hospital of Saint-John of Jerusalem and of Palestine, Rhodes and Malta for France near the Grand Encampment, and in 2009 was advanced to the Honor and Dignity of the Knight Grand Cross (pro causa). Upon the resignation of S.K. Richard B. Baldwin, GCT, MEGM on August 28, 2007 for reasons of health, he was installed as Most Eminent Grand Master by S.K. Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. On August 18, 2009, he was elected by acclamation as Most Eminent Grand Master for the LXV Triennium, and was installed the next day, again by Sir Knight Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. Five Days later he was made an Honorary Member and Honorary Past Supreme Grand Master of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada.

Illustrious Brother Koon is a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Toledo and a dual member of the Valley of Dayton, receiving the Thirty-Third Degree from the Supreme Council Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, NMJ, in Grand Rapids on September 23, 1997. In June, 2004 he was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Valley of Toledo, and in 2008 was elected Chairman. In 2007 he was made an Honorary Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) of the Valley of New Orleans, Louisiana.

He is a member of appendant organizations including, Royal Order of Scotland; Zenobia Temple AAONMS of Toledo, OH, their Crusader Unit, and the Lima Shrine Club; Charter Sovereign and current Recorder of Charlemagne Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine in Lima, OH, Dual Member of Holy Grail Conclave, in Dayton, OH, Honorary Member of St. Leonard Conclave, in Jackson MS, St. Hilary Conclave, Ft. Wayne, IN, Lafayette Conclave, Athens, OH, St. Columba Conclave, Cincinnati, OH, and served the United Grand Imperial Council of the Red Cross of Constantine as Grand Herald 1999 - 2000, Intendant General at Large 2002 -2003, and was invested with the Knight Commander of Constantine by the Imperial Council RCC of France in 2007; Past Preceptor of Prince of Peace Tabernacle X, HRAKTP, Past Grand Preceptor of the Grand College of America, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests. and awarded the GC (Grand Cross) of the Order, One of Five Honorary Members of the Grand College of Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, York, England, and recipient of their Certificate of Merit. In 2009 he was Knighted in Rose of Sharon Priory No. 2, Knights of the York Cross of Honor and advanced to the rank and dignity of Knight Grand Cross of the York Cross of Honor with one Quadrant. He is an honorary member of Lily of the Valley Priory No. 1.

Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. He graduated from North Montgomery High School and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In December 2000 he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm, during which time he was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. Since 1995 he has been with Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C. in Bloomington IN. Since October 2008 he has been president of that firm. Professionally, not-for-profit entities are his primary specialty. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants.

His Masonic history began on April 30, 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Vaught was initiated, passed and raised a Master Mason in Montgomery Lodge, no. 50, in Crawfordsville IN. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1993 receiving the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. He served on several Grand Lodge committees and was appointed as the Grand Representative of Oregon. He was elected the 157th Most Worshipful Grand Master of Indiana for 2007 – 2008. In May 2008 he was elected a Trustee of the Grand Lodge and in 2009 became president of the board of Trustees.

Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry in 1977. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon and in 2007 the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Arkansas.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service and Knight Commander of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught was later appointed to the finance committee of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Vaught is a Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and has served as Secretary of his council for the last ten years. He is currently chairmen of the Grand Council AMD finance committee.

Duane Vaught is currently serving as Puissant Sovereign of St Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and as an officer of St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross, of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSCRIF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Knights of Pythias, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, and Indiana Past Commanders Association. In 2005 he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, NMJ. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

In August 2007 he was appointed and installed to the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment KT when that office became vacant upon the regretted resignation, due to health, of Grand Master Richard B. Baldwin and the advancement of the other members of the Grand Encampment line.



RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue financial support to the Order of DeMolay, Jobs Daughters and Rainbow for Girls with particular emphasis on our presence. All Officers of the Grand Commandery should attend their events.
- 2. I recommend that the Grand Commandery make every effort to rebuild the State York Rite Association and have it function properly. We desperately need a unified YORK RITE.
- 3. I recommend that leadership training be re-engaged, such as the Indiana Templar Academy and schools of instruction, or informal session's one on one for Officers and Members of Commanderies.
- 4. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to put great emphasis on the duties of the Inactive Membership Committee. This is the only way to reduce demits.
- 5. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to put increased emphasis on drill team formation and competition statewide.
- 6. I recommend that changes be made to reduce the burden of the Grand Commander and his lady in relation to the transportation and storage of equipment and supplies. This would include the hospitality rooms, storing of the flags and banners. Many times a storage truck is needed to haul items to and from Grand Conclave.
- 7. I recommend that all Stocks, Bonds and Certificate of Deposits owned by Constituent Commanderies within the Jurisdiction of the Grand Commandery of Indiana, be reported on their Annual Reports.
- 8. I recommend that a permanent Grand Conclave Arrangements Committee be formed to take a management role in all the necessary site preparations and performance necessary for a successful Conclave. The duties of this Committee will be to work with the other York Rite Bodies to review potential sites for Grand Conclaves in the future, negotiate contracts with the host hotel, make room arrangements and determine equitable food costs. In addition, this Committee will be responsible for the handling of all reservations and full accounting of all collections and expenditures for Grand Conclave.
- 9. I recommend that an assistant Grand Recorder be appointed to assist the Grand Recorder in his duties and to serve as his backup in the event of illness.
- 10. I recommend that the Laws of the Indiana Grand Commandery be revised to insure that the Annual Grand Conclave will always be held within a 20 mile radius of Indianapolis.





NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through October 21, 2011, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

And 2010 -2011 VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana

During the past year, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation has changed the direction of its focus as announced the Knights Templar Magazine.

ANNOUNCEMENT **Knights** *Templar* **Foundation** Change Direction Eyein With the passage of the new Healthcare Reform Bill by Congress and a number of other related events, the Trustees of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. on August 14, 2010, voted to move out of case processing and redirect the dollars allocated for treatment to research and education. Effective December 31, 2010, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation will no longer be participating in direct patient care except as is currently done with the Seniors Eye Care Program in partnership with Eye Care America and the Foundation of the American Academy of Ophthalmology. There were a number of other circumstances involved in the decision such as compliance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act privacy regulations, computer software replacement, staff retirement, etc., but primarily, the passage of national healthcare was the underlying factor. The need for our services will be greatly reduced or eliminated. Further, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation had moved over the years from primarily treating children to almost exclusively treating adults for cataracts. Additionally, our cases were processed primarily in only about 25% of the United States due to state government programs. The trustees further felt that research benefits

everyone's eyesight no matter where they live, whether in this country or in the other countries where the Grand Encampment has Grand and Subordinate Commanderies. We have learned over the years that our efforts in funding pediatric ophthalmology research have been the primary reason that we have had fewer and fewer children with strabismus (crossed eyes) to treat. Our research dollars have helped develop new, non-surgical treatments for this problem. Your Trustees are excited about the prospects of being able to benefit more of humanity by redirecting your generosity from treating 2,000 individuals per year to benefiting untold millions in generations to come.

This change was illustrated to us locally this past Templar Year in two ways.

First on November 13, 2010 our then Right Eminent Grand Captain General S. K. Duane L. Vaught presented a \$40,000.00 grant from the Eye Foundation at the reception for the Grand Commander held at Raper Commandery #1. The presentation was made to Dr. Liyun Zhang MD PHD from Purdue University. Dr Zhang gave an interesting presentation about his research to the group present.

Second on January 8, 2011 our Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo Duane L Vaught presented a \$40,000.00 grant from the Eye Foundation to Dr. Yang Sun, MD PHD of the Indiana University School of Medicine. Also present were Louis B. Cantor M.D. department chair and his wife Linda Cantor who is a fund development professional with Indiana University. Dr. Zhang also gave a presentation about his research.

VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN

For the Voluntary Campaign as of week 32 Indiana had donated \$16,454.42 to rank 20th and \$2.89 per capita to rank 38th.

Funds and applications for twelve new Life Sponsorships have passed through my hands.

I wish to point out Angola Commandery #58 and Kokomo Commandery #36 for their activities in fund raising and promotion of Life Sponsorships. I am certain there are other Commanderies in Indiana that also participate fully in this great work. I would encourage all Commanderies to follow this example. Thank you, Grand Commander for the opportunity to serve on this committee.

Robert Eugene Price age 81 a lifelong Connersville resident passed away Saturday November 13, 2010 at the St. Vincent Hospice in Indianapolis. He was born October 21, 1929 in the Alquina Community, the son of the late James Thomas and Geneva McClain Price. He is a 1947 graduate of Alquina High School. In 1947 immediately upon graduation from high school he was employed with the Central State Bank of Connersville as a bookkeeper. He rose through the ranks to become President and Chief Executive Officer in 1971 and Chairman and Chief Executive Officer in 1985. When Central State Bank was sold to Fifth Third Bank of Cincinnati in 1989 he continued in the same position with Fifth Third Bank of Eastern Indiana. Following the merger of that bank with Fifth Third Bank of Southeastern Indiana in 1990 he retired as an active officer but continued for several years as a member of the board of that corporation. During his career he graduated from many professional schools including Stonier Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University, the Bank Marketing School at Northwestern, and the Senior Bank Officers Seminar at Harvard University. Bob was active in banking trade organizations, serving as a Regional President of the Indiana Bankers Association, President of the Community Bankers of Indiana and as a member of the Board of Directors and many committees of the Independent Bankers Association of America. In 1974, he formed Central State Travel and, with his

wife, organized and escorted many trips for the agency, in all visiting more than 30 countries. He was also President of Central Insurance Agency, a subsidiary of Central State Bank. In 1951 Bob entered the US Army, serving as a member of the Finance Corps and was stationed at Ft. Bragg, N.C. He was discharged in 1953 as a Sergeant (E5). The Price family has been active members of the Trinity Episcopal Church for over 50 years. Bob has served as Vestryman, Senior Warden, Lay Eucharistic Minister, and as Treasurer for many years. Bob has a long history of civic involvement. He has served as President of the Connersville Chamber of Commerce, the United Way of Fayette County, the Greater Connersville Progress Committee. He was instrumental in the founding of the Fayette County Foundation, and in 1976 was honored as Connersville's Distinguished Citizen. He is the longest serving member of the Connersville Lions Club, having been a member for 59 years. He served as president in 1956 and has received the W.P. Woods Award and the Melvin Jones Award. During his 50th year of service he was honored by the International Board of Directors as a Life Member of Lions. Bob is known throughout the state as well as the United States as a Masonic Scholar and is a member of many Masonic organizations. He became a member of Brownsville Lodge # 70 F & AM in 1951 and served as Worshipful Master in 1957 and has remained an active member of his lodge throughout his life. Bob is also a dual member of Warren Lodge # 15 and is a life member of both lodges. He served the Grand Lodge of Indiana in many positions. He was a board member of the Indiana Masonic Home from 1990-1995 and served on the board of the Indiana Masonic Home Foundation for over 15 years, and served as a board member of the Indiana Grand Lodge Library and Museum. In 2002 in recognition of his Masonic service, service to his church, civic and philanthropic activities, the Grand Lodge of Indiana presented him with the Caleb B. Smith Medal of Honor, the highest award conferred by that body. He entered the York Rite of Freemasonry in 1961 and served as presiding officer of each of the Connersville bodies and is a life member of all of them. In his youth, he served as the Charter Master Councilor of the Elmhurst Chapter of DeMolay. He was awarded the Degree of Chevalier and the Active Legion of Honor. He served as a member of the Indiana DeMolay Foundation for over 20 years. In 1970, Bob was elected Grand Captain of the Guard of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana and served progressively through the line, being elected and installed as Grand Commander in 1978, becoming a permanent Member of the Grand Encampment of the United States of America in 1979, upon completion of his term. In 1985, he was appointed to the office of Grand Recorder of Indiana, in which he served until his retirement in 1998. Bob is a member of the Indianapolis Valley of the Scottish Rite and in 1980 was coroneted a Sovereign Grand Inspector General 33rd Degree. In 1999 he was the 5th person to be presented with the Medal of Honor of the Council of Deliberation of Indiana. He is also a member of the Murat Shrine Temple and the Sahara Grotto in Indianapolis, as well as a member of the Connersville Chapter #346 Order of the Eastern Star. He is a member of the Red Cross of Constantine and served as Intendant General for Indiana from 1995 to 2005. He is an ardent fraternalist and a 59 year member, past Chancellor and past District Deputy Grand Chancellor of the Knights of Pythias; a member and Past Sachem of the Improved Order of Red Men; as well as a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. Bob was instrumental in the founding of Historic Connersville, was active in the Connersville Band Boosters, and was honored as a Kentucky Colonel. He is also a 50 year member of the American Legion, the Elks Lodge, Indiana Historical Society and the Society of Indiana Pioneers. His hobbies are fraternal organizations, genealogy, and collecting fraternal memorabilia, Buck Rogers's toys and related items and was a stamp collector since childhood. Bob is survived by his wife Nancy Kay Riggs Price to whom he was married March 2, 1957 at the Trinity Episcopal Church. He is also survived by two sons and daughters in law, Deron J. & Teresa Price, Connersville; and David L. & Jennifer Price, Connersville; five grandchildren, Dustin J. Price; Brady T. Price; Ethan T. Price; Abigail S. Price and Emma F. Price. One sister and brother in law Elaine & Byron Parvis, Lafayette, IN; one brother and a sister in law Bruce & Beverly Price, Arlington, IN. He is preceded in death by a grandson, Noah T. Price and a grandson Jacob Price. Funeral services will be conducted at 1:00 P.M. Thursday at the Trinity Episcopal Church with Rev. Keith Dobyns

officiating. Burial will be in Dale Cemetery. Friends may call from 4-8 P.M. Wednesday at Urban-Winkler Funeral Home. Masonic memorial services will be conducted by Brownsville Masonic Lodge at 8:00 P.M. Wednesday at the funeral home. The Connersville Lions Club will assemble at the funeral home at 6:00 P.M. Sir Knight Thornley was born December 21, 1924, in Meyersdale, Pennsylvania. He attended Carnegie Institute of Technology before the War, and went to Colorado in1946 to attend the Colorado School of Mines. He has three children: Elizabeth (Mrs. William H. Koon, II), William III and Robert. His wife, Shirley Jane, died in September, 1991.

A Registered Professional Engineer, Sir Knight Thornley is a consulting Materials Engineer. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers, a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, American Institute of Mining Engineers, Society of American Military Engineers, U.S. Committee for Large Dams, International Committee for Soil Mechanics and Foundation Engineering and the American Society for Testing Materials.

Sir Knight Sid Cornelius Dorris, III was born November 3, 1947 in Nashville, Tennessee. He attended public schools in Goodlettsville, Tennessee and graduated from the School of Modern Photography in 1968. He served in the United States Army Reserves as a Public Information Office Photographer. Sid was employed for forty years at the United Methodist Publishing House in Nashville, Tennessee as Photography Manager and retired August 2005. Sir Knight Sid married Sherry L. Damron in 1970. Lady Sherry predeceased Sid on August 9, 2010. They are survived by one child Chad Brandon Dorris, his wife, Tia, and two grandchildren, Barrett Grey and Kate Elizabeth Dorris. Sid and Sherry were active members of Hermitage United Methodist Church.

Brother Dorris began his Masonic career in 1974, when he was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason at McWhirtersville Lodge No. 375 in Donelson, Tennessee, where he served as Worshipful Master in 1985. Sir Knight Dorris was elected Most Worshipful Grand Master of Free & Accepted Masons of Tennessee on March 23, 2006.

Sir Knight Dorris was an active member of many Masonic Affiliated Organizations:

Exalted in Donelson Chapter No. 234 in 1975, he served as the High Priest in 1985 and 2001 and received the Order of the High Priesthood in 1986. He received the Bronze Medal for Distinguished Service from the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International. Companion Dorris was greeted in Nashville Council No.1 in 1975 and served as Illustrious Master in 1986. He received the Order of the Silver Trowel in 1987 and served the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons as Grand Conductor of the Council in 1986.

Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, in the Valley of Nashville, where he was Invested a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in 1991 and Coroneted a 33° Inspector General Honorary in 2003; Masonic Societas Rosicruciana In Civitatibus Foederatis in Tennessee College where he was Past Celebrant and Past Secretary, IX Grade and First Ancient of the High Council of the Order; Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priest in Holy Tabernacle No XLVIII and Grand Inner Guard of the Grand College of America.

Other memberships included:

Tennessee Priory No. 15, Knights of York Cross of Honour, where he served as Prior in 2006; Old Hickory Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, where he served as Sovereign in 1997; Middle Tennessee York Rite College No. 143, where he served as Governor in 1992; Arch E. McClanahan Council 358, Allied Masonic Degrees, where he served as Sovereign Master in 2004; Tralee Council No. 41, Knight Masons; Royal Order of Scotland; Buchanan Chapter No. 286, Order of the Eastern Star; AI Menah Shrine Temple; Tennessee Lodge Of Research; National Sojourners and Hero's of 76.

He was a recipient of the DeMolay Legion of Honor and honored with the Order of the Purple Cross from the York Rite Sovereign College of North America.

Sir Knight Dorris was knighted in Nashville Commandery No. 1 in 1975 and served as Commander in 1986. He served the Grand Commandery of Tennessee as Right Eminent Grand Commander in 1994.

In the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar, he served as Aide-de-Camp (1997-2000) for Grand Master James M. Ward and was the Co-Chairman of the 61st Triennial Conclave held in Nashville, Tennessee in 2000. Sid received the Knight Commander of the Temple in 2000 and served on the Public Relations Committee from 2000 to 2003. He served as the Southeastern Department Commander (2003-2006) for Grand Master Kenneth B. Fischer. Sir Knight Dorris was elected Right Eminent Grand Captain General and received the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple in our Order in August 2006. He was elected Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo in 2009 in Roanoke, Virginia and was serving in that office at the time of his death.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

Actions of the Grand Commander (Appointments)

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Indiana

The Jurisprudence Committee, in reference to the Grand Commander's allocution section dealing with appointment to represent the Grand Commandery in a foreign Jurisdiction and the appointment of a Grand Representative near the Grand Commandery of Indiana is consistent with Templar Law and are acceptable.

The Jurisprudence Committee has reviewed the appointment of Irvin L. Bitting as Eminent Commandeer of H. W. Matthewson No. 66 due to the death of the Eminent Commander. While the committee cannot praise to highly the great talent, extensive knowledge, noted diplomacy, and extensive leadership and deep humility of this Templar leader, we must none the less regretfully note that this was an error in Templar Law. In accordance with section 72 of the Constitution of the Grand Encampment, the Generalissimo succeeds the Eminent Commander when a vacancy occurs in the position of Eminent Commander. We disapprove this action, but note that the issue has passed and time of consequence and no harm has been done. With regard to Special Deputy of Baldwin Commandery No.2 and Muncie Commandery No. 18, we find that these actions are consistent with Templar Law and are acceptable.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

Recommendations 6, 9, 10

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Indiana

Recommendation number 6 relates to transportation and storage of equipment by the Grand Commander. Our original judgment was that we had to do it so shouldn't everyone else. After a good laugh we recognized the difficulties but suggest that each Grand Commander may have different circumstances and choice of alternatives. We believe the Grand Commander will find over the course of the year that he may need ready access to the equipment but that might be in his home or a nearby Commandery Asylum. We believe each Commander may have to address this within his parameters.

Recommendation No. 9 relates to an assistant Grand Recorder. No such position may exist as an officer per se, but subject to the views of the Grand Recorder we see no difficulty with his recruiting of volunteer assistants under his responsibility.

Recommendation No.10 would require that the Grand Commandery meet within 20 miles of the city of Indianapolis. We consider the central location to be generally a benefit to our members and strongly support that any motive, as well as the desire to corporate with other bodies. We feel however that any artificial limitation may result in problems at some future stage and that we are better served by the good judgment of a fair minded Grand Commander and the process of submitting such questions to approval each year at the annual conclave. We move that recommendation No. 10 be disapproved.

BATTALION MEETINGS

While most of their Knightings were done at One Day Classes, the Order that was done in house was conferred in very good fashion. They have the basis to be a very good Commandery with continued work.

<u>Michigan City #30:</u> Hosted a 10 Man Open Reception for the Grand Commander with Valparaiso. Michigan City is able to confer all three orders in full form with little outside help. I would like to see them do more outside activities for the coming year.

<u>Hammond #41:</u> Hosted a 10 Man Open Reception with E. H. Gary for the Grand Commander. Hammond has been very busy visiting blue lodges and promoting the York Rite Freemasonry. They are able to confer all three Orders in very good fashion, with very little help.

E. H. Gary #57: Participated with Hammond with a 10 Man Open Reception for the Grand Commander. E. H. Gary is a Commandery in transition. They have lost some of their older members and as a result their newer members have to step up into line a little sooner than normal. With some leadership and support from the more experienced members they will be a strong Commandery in the future.

Summary:

Battalion #1 is very strong. There has been and continues to be great cooperation between the Commanderies. All Commanderies in the battalion with the exception of two had a net increase of membership. I would also like to thank my Deputy Battalion Commanders, Carl Dykman and Gerald Cook for their help this past year.

Due to Vincennes's central location they have been the site of most Battalion #8 meetings. They hosted the Grand Commander's Reception and Inspection in 2009 and did so again this year. In addition they assisted with the One Day York Rite Class honoring the Grand Master in Evansville. Vincennes hosted a Grand commander's Reception and Inspection on August 28th. 2010

Summary Remarks

NEWBY-AVERY REPORT

To Right Eminent Grand Commander, Past Grand Commanders, Grand Commandery Officers, and Sir Knights:

The Newby-Avery Fund is a program that was established to help grow the Grand Commandery's Permanent Fund, thereby reducing the need to continually raise per-capita. All donations to the Newby-Avery Fund go into the permanent fund and only the interest may be drawn off. The principle is protected by limits of when interest can be drawn off.

The program enables a anyone who donates \$250 to become a "Fellow." Once a Fellow, they receive an invitation to the Annual Banquet, one of the highlights of the Templar year. A Commandery may also donate \$250 to the fund and receive recognition as a "Chair." The Chair is recognized for a period of 5 years, during which time, the Eminent Commander will receive an invitation to the Annual Newby Avery Banquet.

The current Grand Commander hosts the Newby Avery Banquet each year, usually on the first Saturday of January in conjunction with the Grand Commander's Winter Meeting. Currently, the banquet is the sole responsibility of the Grand Commander and generally is a losing proposition for him personally.

Here are some suggestions to further promote the Newby Avery Program and to relieve the Grand Commander of some of the expense of the banquet:

- 1. Design and publish a pamphlet
- 2. Raise the fee to \$275.00 with the extra \$25.00 going towards the cost of the Banquet
- 3. Establish a permanent fund raiser which is used solely for the Newby-Avery Banquet
- 4. Change the date of the Banquet to late summer or early fall to eliminate the possibility of inclement weather and maybe encourage more Sir Knights to attend. Weather has been an issue in the past and occasionally has forced people in attendance to spend an additional night in a motel. This could cut down the cost of attending and encourage more to attend.

For the year 2010-2011 this Program generated \$5000.00 for the future of Grand Commandery.

Credentials: A preliminary report of the Credentials Committee was called for and a quorum was present.

Grand Recorder: The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 118 for the year 2009-10 with 180 new Sir Knights having been created. Star Recorder of the Year: This Award, based on criteria set up by the Grand Commander and Grand Recorder went to Mark A. Kester, Sr., Recorder of Terre Haute Commandery No. 16.

Holy Land Pilgrimage: The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee reported that two ministers went to the Holy Land this year. They included: Rev. Amanda Hines from Richmond Commandery #8 KT and Rev. Bradley Napier from Seymour Commandery #56 KT.

Trustees: The Permanent fund is invested with Raymond James in a moderate growth account with a ten year investment horizon. During the past 12 months, the funds have increased in value 39%. The account is down in value by 3% since 12/31/2007. The Grand Commandery withdrew \$10,000 for operations this year.

The Educational fund is also invested as above. During the past 12 months, the funds have increased by 39%. The account is down in value by 4% since 12/31/2007. The Trustees have withdrawn \$11,000 for scholarship grants this past year.

Necrology: The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 100 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. After Acting Grand Prelate Rev George P. Weister gave his report, Most Illustrious Grand Master, Terry L. Smith read a Eulogy in memory of Sir Knight James W. Roberts, KCT, PGC, 1995-96.

Education Foundation: The Educational Loan Foundation Committee reported that there will be one \$5,000 grant presented to a graduate divinity student. The school and student are yet to be determined. The Committee is looking up north for a school to support. Outstanding loans totaled \$21,300 at years' end. There was 1 loan paid off last year. A decision has been made by the Education Foundation Board to aggressively pursue collection on the remaining outstanding loans.

Crusader: The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and Richmond Commandery No. 8 received the traveling award for selling the most ads.

Elections: The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Bitting, KCT, PGC, GIG; Donald D. Olvey, GStdB; Gary A. Nicholson, GSwdB; Joseph K. Hedges, GW; and Lawrence J. Williams, GS.

Finance: SK George A. Ingles, Jr. KCT, PGC and Chairman of the Finance Committee made a presentation on the finances of the Grand Commandery and explained in detail the financial problems facing the Grand Commandery and offered a multiple step plan to correct our situation. The resulting plan was voted on and passed to increase the dues to Grand Commandery by \$.50 this year and to change the Knighting fee from \$10 to \$20 for each new Sir Knight. In addition, the Grand Commandery will impose a \$5.00/member assessment for the next 5 years (which will be looked at yearly to determine its necessity). In addition, the law was changed to no longer deposit the \$1/member into the permanent fund during the next 5 years. This has not been an easy problem to solve. This situation was brought about by the losses in our permanent fund and the slow recovery of those funds. As a result, we have been unable to draw on the interest of that fund to help run the Grand Commandery. We need to increase the permanent fund so that interest may be drawn and that will lower the need to continue the assessment. Sir Knight Ingles was commended for several month of hard work trying every possible avenue to make this work.

In summary the per capita now looks like this: Grand Encampment: \$9.00. Grand Commandery: \$9.50. Eye Foundation: \$1.00 (not assessed if member is a Life Member of the Eye Foundation). In addition, the Grand Commandery also imposed a \$5 per member assessment on all members, including Life Members and 50-year members.

On Wednesday, March 31, they boarded our bus early in the morning from the Marriott Hotel and arrived in Gettysburg, PA around 6:30 PM that evening, and checked into the motel, and then they went out to dinner. On Thursday morning they toured the Gettysburg Museum and were treated to a very informative guided tour of the Gettysburg Battle Field. This tour ended at the Masonic Memorial of "Friend to Friend". They then headed to Hershey, PA to tour the Chocolate Factory where they learned how the candy was made from start to finish. Afterwards you could find many Sir Knights, ladies and family members at the ice cream booth enjoying the wonderful treats! They then headed on to Alexandria, VA to their hotel. Friday was spent touring the Monument Area in DC, and the Historic Downtown Alexandria. They were very fortunate to see the Cherry Blossoms at their peak; however, the blossoms also provided traffic gridlock in DC! GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION OF MINISTERS

The following are the selection criteria used choosing ministers for the Knight Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage. Please consider these guidelines before inviting ministers to apply. Ministers who fall outside of these guidelines will rank lower in the process of selecting ministers from the pool of those nominated.

- Having never traveled to Israel before.
- Fully <u>Ordained ministers</u> (copy of Ordination Certificate or judicatory documentation must accompany the application). Youth coordinators, program directors, lay pastors, etc. rarely have ordination status.
- Serving in <u>full time</u> ministry, currently. This means that they are employed by the church full time and it is their primary source of income.
- Having served at least four years in full time ministry.
- Having at least ten years of full time service yet to go.
- Be of **good physical health** (if the idea of walking a brisk mile or more uphill, non-stop, with steps is a concern, this may not be the program from which this person would benefit).
- Willing to travel with an <u>ecumenical group</u> of other ministers from many denominations and religious groups, male and female.
- Willing to travel in a program sponsored by the <u>Knights Templar</u>, an appendant organization of <u>Freemasonry</u>.
- Willing to travel without their spouse. This is non-negotiable.
- Having the understanding that this is a <u>strenuous educational and spiritual</u> <u>study seminar / historical & cultural immersion experience</u> and not a vacation trip.

When you submit the materials for your pilgrim ministers, you will need to include three items: Certification form (signed by the Grand Recorder and the State Holy Land Pilgrimage Chairman) the Nomination form (filled out completely by the pilgrim minister) and the full fee of \$2,900.00 (check made out to HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE, INC.). All of these items are due by October 15, 2010.

Please note that this program is for ministers who might not otherwise have this opportunity. Any minister who has previously traveled to the Holy Land would not meet this criterion. The Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage is intended for first time pilgrims.

General Order No. 1 Dove May 1, 2010

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. Each Commandery shall be inspected by its respective Battalion Commander, with the following exceptions. The designated primary Commandery of each Elected Grand Officer excluding the Grand Treasurer, and Grand Recorder, will be inspected by the Grand Inspector General. Other exceptions or substitutions may be made as authorized by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The Inspection shall consist of a report on the Commanderies' membership efforts, examination of the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery. No inspection shall be considered complete until the Commandery shall have participated in a Reception as described in paragraphs eight and nine below.
- 4. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander.
- 5. Each Inspecting Officer will send a Notice of Inspection courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder in advance of the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request certain reports to be completed. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival.
- 6. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so may cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.
- 7. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Deputy Grand Commander, the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the Commandery inspected. A Full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given at the Annual Conclave.
- 8. Receptions: Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive the Commander, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Lines, Personal Inspection, form the Triangle and perform the Flag Ceremony. Those will have the addition of 50 points for a closed and 100 for a public reception to the activities score sheet for that Commandery. For Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the 50 or 100 points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work providing however, that there are at least 6 members of each Commandery present in order for a Commandery to accumulate points. For those Commanderies that will attend an Instructional no score will be awarded only Inst. shall appear in this column.
- 9. A Full Form Opening with subsequent Order shall be voluntary, and may be held with other Commanderies as agreed to by the Battalion Commander. An optional Instructional will be held in each battalion. Each Commandery must participate in one of the three options listed below.

- a) Those Commanderies performing a separate Opening, Closing and Order will have the addition of up to 200 points to the activities score sheet for the Commandery.
- b) Those Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work again provided there are at least 6 members of each Commandery present in order for a Commandery to accumulate points.
- c) To assist in the proficiency of the work, eight different instructional meetings throughout the State will be scheduled and conducted by the Battalion Commanders. Commanderies in attendance will receive additional points on the activity sheet on a per-officer and member attending bases at the discretion of the Battalion Commander.
- 10. The full form Opening and the conferring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent official interpretations thereof. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used.
- 11. The Battalion Commander will schedule (2) two Battalion meetings for information and/or ritual instruction during the year.
- 12. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the visit. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to supply or provide any assistance that another Commandery may need. If an actual candidate is present the quality of the impression made upon such candidate shall be of prime importance.
- 13. Upon completion of each Reception, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first. The Inspecting Officer will then call for comments from the sidelines. Finally, the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times, if the Grand Commander is not present, the Inspecting Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Commander is present, he will be the final speaker unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance in which case the Grand Master will be the final speaker.
- 14. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion with the highest activity score. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

15. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

ITEM NO. 2 Dispensation is hereby granted to all Constituent Commanderies to move their Charter and to appear in uniform at any time to portray the Orders of Templary or to assist in any ceremonies at the Indiana Masonic Home.

ITEM NO. 3 Constituent Recorders are hereby requested, prior to requesting a Dispensation for any purpose, to first ready the following Sections of the Constitution and Laws of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar 214, 215, 48(f)3, 177, 76, 145, and 48(f)1.

ITEM NO. 4 Constituent Commanderies are strongly urged to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag at the opening of each Stated and Called Conclave.

ITEM NO. 5 A Constituent Commandery is not required to obtain special permission in order to meet and conduct business jointly with Chapter and/or Council. Such authority is found in Section 65(c) of the Laws of the Grand Encampment.

This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237½ of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
 - (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
 - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider all nominations made by Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in any one year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
 - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by him to the Grand Master.
- (5) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof.

The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the Commandery uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate of Award shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall be the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof shall be sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006. Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Jeffersonville No. 27 - Chartered April 26, 1876. Charter surrendered October 13, 2008, and merged with New Albany No. 5.

Washington No. 33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes No. 20.

Mishawaka No. 51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Tipton No. 52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo No. 36.

Winchester No. 53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No. 18.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941,

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010).

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the Commandery will be voting to permanently move the Charter to Dubois Lodge, subject to approval at Grand Conclave 2010. (Approved April 24, 2010).
