

Old Words on Restored Old Velum

FORT WAYNE—
Almost exactly 169
years ago, Ft. Wayne
Commandery No. 4
received their charter. Since then, it
has hung on the
walls of three different Masonic Temples, surviving a fire
in one of them and



suffering water damage, said Gram Commander Ed Fodrea, KCT, who is also a Past Commander of the commandery. Not only could it seem miraculous that it survived at all, Fodrea said, but the document has been conserved by an expert of national renown and now, in late April, it will be moved to Muncie, there to permit Ft. Wayne Commandery's officers to open on the Order of the Temple, after which the Grand Officers of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana will open and conduct this year's Grand Conclave.

And it will be that old document, those words printed on velum, a thin form of untanned calfskin, that will authorize that to happen.

Ft. Wayne "Encampment" No. 4 was chartered on May 13, 1853, by the "General Grand Encampment" Knights Templar of the United States. In hose days, the state-level bodies were known as Grand Encampments, to which "General" was added to the title of the national governing body, as is till true of the General Grand Chapter and Royal Arch Masons and the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons.

Beginning about a year after Ft. Wayne was chartered, national leaders saw the need for a change and named local bodies Commanderies, and state bodies Grand Commanderies, but retained the "Grand Encampment" wording for the national body, only dropping the "General".

As said above, velum is treated, but untanned, calfskin. As a natural substance, it is constantly being affected by slight changes in temperature and humidity, shrinking or expanding accordingly—and remember, this particular piece of velum had gone through three building changes, a fire, and water damage. The effect on the Ft. Wayne Charter was that it acquired a series of wrinkles across the velum. The official seal of authenticity, in the lower left corner, was an embossed paper seal attached to a strip of black ribbon, and the ribbon was attached to the charter

by being woven in and out of the seven horizontal cuts in the velum. And that is where the worst damage lay: one of those maybe two-inch cuts had been ripped to seven inches long.

In 2013, when SK Bobbly Roberts, KCT, was Grand Commander, the charter was deemed too fragile to be moved to the Grand Conclave site, and that charter's authority was conveyed there by a photo-copy. Later in 2013, SK William W. Pond, a physician who was eminent commander at the time, decided that after 160 years the charter was in need of conservation, so he set out to make it happen. A PowerPoint presentation he completed after the restoration explains the whole process.

Pond said he first showed it to a framer in Ft. Wayne, then to a binder of rare books in Manchester, and both agreed it needed specialized care, so Pond began a nationwide search for such an expert.

He ultimately fount Tahe Zalal, senior paper conservator with Etherinton Conservation Services in North Carolina. Zalal found the document had been nailed to a piece of cardboard by 151 small nails. Pond thinks that may have been done to stretch it back into shape after it received water damage.

In any case, Zalal carefully cleaned it, repaired the tear with painter's tape, humidified it, removed the tape, then, four times, put it between sheets of blotter paper and used a press to flatten it out, starting first with light pressure to quickly remove the humidity, letting it rest, then pressing it again with heavier pressure. The tear and other weak spots were then repaired with "Japanese paper and wheat starch paste." The result: the "cockling," as its wrinkled state was technically

called, was removed and the charter is flat and full-sized again.

Zalal matted the charter, put it in a new frame and protected it with glass which blocks 99% of ultraviolet light.



And now, all Sir

Noblesville Lodge #57




