

A Grateful Heart

When we moved into our current home three years ago, Lady Connie bought a wall hanging for the master bathroom that says, "Begin each day with a grateful heart." I thought the bathroom was an odd place to put that wall hanging, but she pointed out that it would be a good reminder to us every day as we started our day to always be grateful. Some days it is harder to be grateful than others: days when we're tired, or not feeling well, or know we have a hard day in front of us, or we have received sad news about friends or family.

It's also often easy to take for granted things for which we should be grateful. I looked at that sign in our bathroom recently, after receiving the November issue of the "Knight Templar" publication, and a thought occurred to me. I've never considered being grateful for the simple fact of being able to <u>see</u> that sign. One of the greatest gifts we have is the ability to see, and it is also one of the easiest things to take for granted. If you read your "Knight Templar" publication, you read the story of Livie Klinefelter. She was born with a rare mutation that rendered her legally blind and appeared destined to be totally blind by the time she was a teenager. Thanks to the research and work at the Vision Center at the Children's Hospital in Los Angeles, she now has 20/60 vision, plays competitive soccer, has a blue belt in karate, and a bright future ahead of her.

The research and work at the Vision Center were possible thanks to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. KTEF is the only foundation in the world exclusively devoted to childhood blindness. Whether you are 20, 40, 60, or 80, think about all you have been able to experience because of being able to see. Lady Connie and I have been blessed and fortunate to have experienced many of the wonders of God's world in our travels. What a different experience it would have been to not have been able to actually see the incredible waterfalls, blue skies, waves in the oceans, and majestic mountains that we have been able to visit. Or even worse, what if we had not been able to see the faces of each of our daughters and grandchildren as they were born?

Sir Knights, we have an opportunity to help other children like Livie to see and experience the beauty and wonders of God's world. As we gather with family and friends, and see their smiling faces, the delicious food on our tables, and even the football games on TV, let us be grateful for the blessing of sight. And then let us remember that we can help a child have the same blessing and these same experiences who might not be able to without the work of the KTEF

Before we get to Thanksgiving, there is a day honoring a group of people who also may sometimes be taken for granted – our veterans. Without these brave men and women who are willing to make the ultimate sacrifice for each of us, we might not be able to come together as Brothers and Sir Knights, have a foundation such as KTEF, or celebrate

Thanksgiving. We are grateful for all those who have served and who continue to serve in all branches of the military. "Thank you" does not seem like enough to say, but they are the only words we have to show our gratitude. So, thank you to all our veterans!

The blessing of sight. Men and women who are willing to "support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic." These are just two reasons that we should always "begin each day with a grateful heart"!


