Biography

Jeffrey N. Nelson was born on November 25, 1957, in Tioga, North Dakota, to Patricia C. and the late Dr. Norman M. Nelson. While in law school, he participated in moot court, was published in the North Dakota Law Review, and was a member of the inaugural student exchange program with the University of Oslo School of Law, spending a semester studying in Oslo, Norway. He is also a graduate of the Legislative Staff Management Institute, Hubert H. Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs, at the University of Minnesota. He is a member of Zion Lutheran Church. Jeff is licensed to practice law before the Supreme Court of North Dakota, United States District Court for the District of North Dakota, United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit, and United Sates Supreme Court. Bobby had early exposure to Freemasonry by his Grandfather, Brother John Day, and he was subsequently raised a Master Mason in 1967, as a member of McLeod Lodge No. 424 in Ocean Springs, Mississippi. 

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through July 18, 2021, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
- (i) The Organization expense advertising expenses as incurred. Advertising expense for the year was \$ 1,587.



His Masonic memberships and affiliations included, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite 33rd degree, Orak Shrine, DeMolay, Hobart Shrine Club, Royal Order of Jesters, Past Masters' Unit, Arab Patrol, York Rite, Royal Arch Masons, Cryptic Masons, Knights Templar, Saint Basil Conclave, and Red Cross of Constantine.

The honors and awards bestowed upon him were cherished by him and his family.

He was an advocate in helping those in need through The Shrine Children's hospital and the Indiana Masonic Home.



Robert R. "Gus" Stevens, a lifelong resident of Vincennes, passed away peacefully on January. 20th at the age of 89.

Gus Stevens was a direct descendant of the earliest settlers of Knox County dating back some seven generations. In 1804, President Thomas Jefferson appointed his great-great-great-great grandfather, John Badollet, as the Registrar of the Land Office for the Indiana Territory in Vincennes thereby establishing a personal lineage in our community that spans nearly the entire history of our country. Gus' lifelong commitment to family and hometown, increasingly rare in modern times, is reinforced by the fact that his family still calls Vincennes home today. His passing is a watershed moment for the "Old Post" along the Wabash.

Born Robert Nelson Gaskins, Jr. in Vincennes on February 14, 1931, his name was changed in 1945 to Robert Reller Stevens upon his mother's marriage to Hugh Q. Stevens, President of the Vincennes Steel Corporation.

During his high school years Gus attended Kemper Military School in Booneville, Missouri and then Vincennes Lincoln where he graduated in 1948. After a brief stint at Purdue University, he enlisted in the United States Army in 1949 and served in the Korean War in 1950-51 with the 89th Ordinance Field Maintenance Company earning the Korean Service Medal with five campaign stars. Upon discharge in 1952, he attended college on the G.I. Bill, graduating from Vincennes University in 1954, where he was the President of the Student Senate, and Indiana University in 1956.

While attending school he supplemented the GI Bill as a disk jockey and sports "play-by-play" announcer at radio station WAOV in Vincennes. Following graduation from I.U. he pursued a career in broadcasting that covered a 21-year span first in radio and later as general manager of WVUT (TV), Vincennes University's public television station. In 1978, he became the director of the Lewis Historical Collections Library at VU and served in that capacity until his retirement in 2000. For years Gus was the "Voice of the VU Trailblazers" first on radio and then on television. Beginning in 1965 he volunteered as the university's Sports Information Director. Four of his VU Basketball Press Guides were accorded first-place honors as the "Best Basketball Brochure of the Year" by the National Junior College Athletic Association. He is likely the only Vincennes. Resident to have been physically present at each of the Trailblazers' four National Championship wins – 1965, 1970, 1972, and 2019. He was recently inducted into the 2017. class of the NJCAA Men's Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Long active in Masonic circles, Gus was a Past Master and an over 60-year member of Vincennes Lodge No. 1. In 1983-84, he served as the Grand Master of Masons in Indiana. He was awarded an honorary 33rd Degree of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite and the DeMolay Legion of Honor by the Order of DeMolay for his service to the organization and to the community at large. He was a past president of the Southern Indiana Chapter of the National Sojourners, a member of the board of directors of the Heritage Foundation in Madison, Indiana and served many years on the Board of Directors of the Indiana Masonic Home in

and served many years on the Board of Directors of the Indiana Masonic Home in Franklin, Indiana where he was chairman of the board.

He was chairman of the board of the Old Northwest Corporation, a member and past officer of the Vincennes Historical and Antiquarian Society, the Old Northwest Genealogy Society, the Vincennes Kiwanis Club, Fort Knox II Committee, the Indiana Military Museum, and a past president of the Vincennes University Alumni Association. In addition, he served as a member and chairman of the board of the Kemper Military School and College and was a member of American Legion Post No. 73 since 1952.

In 1984, Indiana Governor Robert Orr made him a Sagamore of the Wabash, and in 1996 he was awarded the Caleb B. Smith Medal of Honor, the highest award given by the Grand Lodge of Masons in Indiana. In 1997, Gus was named a Distinguished Graduate of Vincennes Lincoln High School and in 1998 was named a "Patriot of Vincennes" by the city. In 2000, he received the Long Knife Award, presented by the Spirit of Vincennes Rendezvous, Inc., for contributions to historical development of the Vincennes area. He is also a past recipient of the Walter A. Davis Citation from Vincennes University. During his long career, he wrote and published.

Upon his retirement from Vincennes University, he served as the volunteer curator at Grouseland, the home of William Henry Harrison, and continued service as the Vice President of the Board of the Indiana Masonic Home and Medical Center.

numerous articles for historical journals, magazines, and newspapers.

He was devoted to his church, formerly First Presbyterian and now Upper Indiana Presbyterian, as an elder and a member of the Session.

He loved music and was self-taught on the piano. He enjoyed playing American Popular Standards by composers such as George Gershwin, Jerome Kern, and Irving Berlin, as well as Indiana's own Cole Porter and Hoagy Carmichael. He also loved the music of the Big Band era.

When asked about the origin of his nickname, Gus would tell the story of himself as a kid, five or six years old, coming into his home on Old Wheatland Road with tattered clothes and a dirty face. Upon seeing him, his Uncle Bob Reller remarked, "Kid, you look like a member of the Gashouse Gang. From now on I'm going to call you

"Gashouse Gus". The reference was to the famous 1930's St. Louis Cardinals baseball team known as the "Gashouse Gang" and the name stuck. Today, there are probably people in Vincennes who don't even know his name was Robert.

Preserving the history of Vincennes was certainly Gus' passion. While happy to discuss the life and times of Francis Vigo, Red Skelton, or countless others who contributed to Vincennes' rich history, few things brought him more joy than showing dignitaries, visitors, and his grandchildren the local historic sights. The George Rogers Clark Memorial, the Harrison House, the Gimbel Corner, the cemeteries, Kimmel and Gregg parks, the French House and the military museum were all standard stops on his tours. His extensive genealogical collection is available for research at the local McGrady-Brockman regional history/genealogy center. The legacy of Gus' broad knowledge of Vincennes and the state of Indiana will forever be his gift to succeeding generations.

Above all things, Gus Stevens loved his family and he loved Vincennes. He would only want to be remembered as a wonderful storyteller, a true gentleman, and a lifelong Hoosier. He is survived by his wife, JoAnn (Combs) of Vincennes; sons Robert R. Stevens II and his wife, Debbie, of Evansville, James A. Stevens and his wife, Alicia, of Bethesda, MD, Richard L. Stevens and his wife, Terri, of Burke, VA, and David G. Stevens of Vincennes; nine loving grand-children – Mandy, Josh, Erica, Matt, Jake, Indy, Keller, Mitch, and Aly; five loving great grandchildren – Taylor, Luke, Liam, Micah, and James; cousins Sara VanStone of Indianapolis,

Karen Slade of Wildwood, FL, and David Bruce of Daggett, CA. He is also survived by stepchildren Randy Combs and his wife, Lisa, of Milan IN, Elizabeth Lee and her husband, Mark, of San Antonio, TX, Steve Combs and his wife, Erica, of Vincennes and 9 step-grandchildren.

Therefore, we propose the following addition to Section 820 of the Bylaws of the Indiana Grand Commandery through this Resolution that for the purpose of conducting a Business meeting only, there must be no less than five Sir Knight present to constitute a quorum for the business meeting.



SECTION 920 (d) (RESOLUTION No. 10) WEARING OF JEWELS A person may not simultaneously wear more jewels than can be fit in a single line in the appropriate place on the standard Templar Uniform. For many Sir Knights this entails choosing which jewels to wear or omit. Any jewels that are worn should be in the following sequence from the wearer's right to left. The wearer's right is the edge closest to the center of the uniform front. Centered above the jewels, a Sir Knight may wear approved service bars. Only three bars may be worn in a row, but multiple rows are permitted. Service bars should be worn in the order listed from the top rows down and from the wearer's right to left. Thus, if multiple rows are worn, the highest ranked bars are in the top row.

Proposal #4 Changes for the Ritual Award Program With Drawn By Maker GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE RITUALIST AWARD PROGRAM

Whereas the purpose of the Ritualist Award Program is to foster participation in performing ritual in the Orders of the Commandery, and to strengthen the quality of ritual work in the state of Indiana.

And whereas the Ritualist Award Program can assist in improving areas which may be currently lacking regarding ritual parts in the Orders of the Commandery. Further, it should give emphasis on parts not based solely on their length, but also on their importance to the degree and the essential nature of each part, including taking into account their role regarding tactics.

And whereas the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana may reward Sir Knights for their efforts in performing ritual in a way that provides the very best experience to the Candidate, as well as inspiring the new Sir Knights to likewise take part in ritual work.

I therefore propose the following amendment to the Ritual Award Program, which outlines some modifications to the points awarded in some areas, and adjusts the totals required to achieve the various levels, in an effort to increase participation in the program and to make their accessibility more appropriate.

Point Totals to Achieve Levels:

Level 1: 150 points (Previously 255)

Level 2: 400 Points (Previously 600)

Level 3: 800 Points (Previously 1050)

Level 4: 1200 Points (Previously 1455)

ILLUSTRIOUS ORDER OF THE RED CROSS:

Increase the Prince Master of the Palace, Prince Chancellor and Master of Calvary to 30 points. Each is essential to the degree.

Increase each of the Jewish Council to 15 points each.

Increase the Banner of the Order to 20 points.

Add Red Cross short form: Sovereign Master - 75 points, Master of Infantry - 10 points

Note: You can only claim Sovereign Master & Master of Infantry in long form or short form – not both.

ORDER OF MALTA:

Increase the 5 Banners in Malta to 30 points each. Yes, Death is longer, but all are essential.

Add Order of Malta short form: Prior - 75 points, Chaplain - 10 points

ORDER OF THE TEMPLE:

Increase the Hermit, Guard and Escort to 15 points each.



THE CHALLENGE



Membership Committee Report

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Line, Distinguished Guests, Sir Knights all,

It is a pleasure to serve the Grand Commandery and all the Sir Knights in the State as Membership Committee Chairman for 2020/2021. As each of us knows, the Covid-19 Pandemic made 2020 an extremely challenging year. With Commanderies unable to meet and personal lives of Sir Knights and their families turned upside down, our plans for increasing membership were not fully enacted.

Sadly, we were only able to confer Knighthood on seven of our Masonic Brothers. In planning for the eventual re-opening of Commanderies around the state, I had the opportunity to reach out to each Eminent Commander and Recorder to remind them of the importance of having a local Membership Committee with a Chair that has a strong desire to increase our ranks.

During our downtime, I was also able to work closely with Right Eminent Grand Commander Fodrea to put together a program that may help us to increase the number of Sir Knights that are likely to actively participate in the Conclaves of the 34 Commanderies across Indiana.

Proposed Mentor Program

The purpose of the Mentor Program is to increase membership in the York Rite - not just in quantity but in quality. We often find ourselves signing petition after petition and steering the candidates to the Tri-State Festival to quickly and easily get them Knighted. Oftentimes that is where it ends. Without a solid mentor, the new Sir Knight struggles to find his way in the York Rite and does not fully participate in our order.

This program is designed to increase membership by challenging every Sir Knight in Indiana to find just one Master Mason to introduce to the York Rite and to Mentor him through the process. There is legislation to be presented which will authorize a new jewel/bar that may be worn on your uniform for successfully completing this program. If approved this program will begin in April after the 2021/2022 Grand Conclave.

To qualify for the Mentor Jewel, you must Top Line Sign a Candidate's Petition and carry it to your local York Rite. After a successful vote you must then assist the Candidate in receiving the degrees and orders in Chapter, Council, and Commandery. This can be accomplished by travelling with your Protegee to attend degrees presented singularly or to attend events like the Tri-State Festival to receive degrees in a group.

After your Protegee is Knighted, you will then have several milestones to achieve with the new Sir Knight. The complete list of criteria are still being developed but will include activities in Chapter, Council, and Commandery to be completed with each protegee for the Sir Knight Mentor to earn the Mentor Jewel.

Potential Criteria for Earning the Mentor Jewel (Note, this is only a partial list):

- Explain all the signs, words, and penalties for each Degree/Order and have the Sir Knight Protegee commit all to memory for Chapter, Council, and Commandery.
- Attend with your Protegee at least three meetings for Chapter, Council, and Commandery.
- Visit another York Rite for a Stated Meeting or Degree work.
- Attend at least one Grand Event.
- Attend inspection for two of the three bodies.
- Commit to memory the 11 offices of the Commandery and plot them on a chart. Match the Jewel to the Office. (same for Chapter and Council)

- Learn proper sword use Learn the Sword Manual
- Learn how to decipher the lost word.
- More criteria to come as the program is further developed.

If the Mentor Program is adopted and well publicized, and we have good participation, we have the potential to significantly increase the number of Sir Knights in the Great State of Indiana.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA PROPOSAL ON ADDITION TO PERMANENT FUND

Whereas through careful management, hard work, generosity of certain individuals and a certain amount of luck, the 2018 Grand Encampment Triennial conducted by the 67th Triennial Corporation generated a surplus.

And whereas the Triennial being completed, it is the general plan of the Corporation to liquidate its assets in the near future and its desire is to promote the welfare of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

And whereas the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana maintains a permanent fund. It is the general plan of the fund that the principle and a certain portion of accumulated earnings be maintained as perpetually undependable. Only earnings in excess of that portion being spendable.

I therefore propose the following amendment to section 612 of our laws. The change being the addition shown as underlined below.

SECTION 612: The Purpose of the Permanent Investment Fund of this Grand Commandery is to partially finance the operations of this Grand Commandery.

The permanent and un-expendable portion of the fund shall be \$279,096.00 as of December 31, 2005 plus all per capita fees and contributions contributed to the fund after that date.

Each year, beginning with the 2007-2008 Grand Commandery year, the permanent fund shall transfer as necessary to the general fund, for operations, up to five percent (5%) of the fund effective December 31st of each year. Except that such transfer shall be limited to total return on investment earned (net income) and shall not include any of the un-expendable portions of the fund as described

above, the previous calendar year end value of the permanent fund except that such transfer shall be limited as follows. The maximum annual transfer shall be no more than the amount that would reduce the permanent fund as of the previous calendar year end to the permanent, un-expendable balance of the fund. (May 2016)

Further, effective with the year ended December 31, 2020 the permanent and unexpendable portion of the fund shall be increased 2% per year to compensate for inflation. This commitment is made in exchange for a significant permanent and unexpendable contribution from the 67th Triennial Corporation to the fund.

Proposal No. 7 GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA RESOLUTION ON MEMBERSHIP FUND

Whereas a special fund was created in 1980 from funds raised to support the 1979 Triennial Conclave in Indianapolis with Indiana Sir Knight Willard Meredith Avery presiding. And

Whereas that permanent fund is in the amount of \$10,000 which if separately invested has limited investment options due to its small size and could be invested more profitably in conjunction with the permanent fund. And

Whereas the purpose of the fund is to support membership development although the direct or indirect average annual expenditures for membership development routinely exceed the earnings on this special fund.

Therefore, to promote more effective management of the Grand Commandery I move that section 660 of the laws of the Grand Commandery of Indiana which currently reads:

MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FUND

SECTION 660: Whereas voluntary contributions to the W.M.A. Club (Willard M. Avery Club) were received from individuals to help finance the 54th Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America convened at Indianapolis, Indiana, August 11-16, 1979:

Whereas the voluntary contributions were not needed to meet the expenses of the conclave as sufficient revenue was received from other sources:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that \$13,321.68 of the W.M.A Voluntary contributions, plus any accrued interest thereon, be transferred for the use of the Membership Committee, and \$10,000.00 thereof be invested in a permanent fund to be known as the "W.M.A. Membership Development Reserve Fund" and the interest income derived there from be used only for membership development. (*Adopted 1980*)

Be repealed.

And that the \$10,000 permanent portion of the Membership development fund be transferred to the Grand Commandery Permanent Fund and included as part of that permanent unexpendable fund. And that any expendable funds in the Membership fund (the amount in excess of \$10,000) be transferred to the general funds of the Grand Commandery.

Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 and 852 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

- 1. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within his Battalion with the following exceptions:
- 2. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, and Inspecting Officer's time of the teleconference and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officer via email.
- 3. The records Inspection shall consist of:
- A report on the membership efforts.
- Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
- Records shall be emailed to the Inspecting Officer
- Examination of the Activity sheet.
- The records to be inspected shall be from the date of last inspection up and including date of current inspection.
- More detailed instruction to follow
- 4. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date(s) and time(s) mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer.
- 5. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each Battalion on the "Activity Score Sheet" will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 6. This order will remain in effect until the expiration of General Order 12

GENERAL ORDER NO. 12

PROHIBITION OF IN-PERSON CONCLAVES OF GRAND, SUBORDINATE, AND CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

May 4, 2020

To all Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies within the Jurisdiction of, and holding Allegiance to, the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.

GREETINGS:

The number of persons infected with the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, continues to increase in the United States and throughout the world, and the danger to vulnerable populations is unabated, especially among the elderly and those with underlying medical conditions, many of whom are our Fratres. In the face of the crisis, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention urged persons to "avoid all nonessential travel" and take other appropriate measures to prevent community transmission of the virus, including avoiding large public gatherings, the wearing of facemasks in public, and working from home. While rates of infection appear to be leveling or declining in places and tentative steps have been taken by some governmental authorities to relax or rescind business and school closures and stay-at-home orders, the numbers of COVID-19 infections are expected to experience a resurgence in the fall and winter months

Accordingly, I, the Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of the United States of America, by the authority in me vested by Section 23 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment, do hereby waive the requirement of Section 36 (a) of the Constitution. It is ordered that all in-person Conclaves of Grand, Constituent, or Subordinate Commanderies be prohibited until further notice. Any such Conclave currently scheduled is hereby cancelled. This prohibition has no exceptions.

I authorize the Grand Commander or his designee to convene the Stated Conclave of his Grand Commandery by means of teleconference or webcast, provided that the necessary facilities are widely available to the members of the Grand Commandery and the Stated Conclave be conducted in full compliance with the requirements of Sections 37 through 39 of the Constitution.

In addition, I do hereby waive the requirement of Section 65 (a) of the Constitution, and authorize the Commander of a Constituent Commandery within each Grand Commandery to convene a Stated Conclave by means of teleconference or webcast, provided that the necessary facilities are widely available to the members of the Constituent Commandery and the Stated Conclave be conducted in full compliance with the requirements of Sections 65 and 66 of the Constitution. Commanders of Subordinate Commanderies enjoy the same discretion.

No ritual shall be performed and no Orders be conferred during any such telephonic or webcast Conclave. The safety and well-being of our Sir Knights and their families being paramount, the provisions of Sections 48 (d), 59, 176, and 195 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment shall be inoperative while this General Order is in force.

This supersedes General Order No 11 of the tenth day of March, last, in its entirety.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.
- The Commander be responsible to provide a "New Member Packet" to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

Proceedings Indiana Grand Commandery ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Lafayette No. 3 – Organized on September 19, 1853, Charter Date April 7, 1868; On June 5, 2017 surrendered their Charter and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded, and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868 and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

South Bend No. 13 Charted April 8, 1868 merged with LaPorte No. 12 on March 1, 2019

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006. Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Merged with Baldwin No. 2 on July 24, 2017.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

St. John No. 24 Chartered April 2, 1873. Charter surrendered January 2, 2012 and merged with Frankfort Commandery No. 29.

Jeffersonville No. 27 - Chartered April 26, 1876. Charter surrendered October 13, 2008 and merged with New Albany No. 5.

Michigan City No. 30 - Chartered April 30, 1884 Charter surrendered January 1, 2017 and merged with LaPorte No. 12.

Washington No. 33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985 and merged with Vincennes No. 20.

Cyrene No. 34 - Chartered May 2, 1891. Name changed to Columbia City No. 34 on May 9, 1947.

Columbia City No. 34 - Successor to Cyrene No. 34; Charter surrendered September 4, 1968.

Wabash No. 37 – Chartered April 20, 1893. Chartered arrested April 10, 2008, and merged into St. Anselm, U.D.

Bluffton No. 38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994 and merged with Fort Wayne No. 4.

Delphi No. 40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972 and merged with Lafayette No. 3.

Hammond No. 41 – Chartered April 21, 1898. Charter surrendered April 30, 2015 and merged with Valparaiso No. 28.

Lebanon No. 43 – Chartered April 20, 1899. Charter surrendered August 15, 2000 and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

New Castle No. 44 Chartered April 19, 1900, Charter surrendered January 1, 2006 and merged with Knightstown No. 9.

Princeton No. 46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995 and merged with LaValette No. 15.

Brazil No. 47 – Chartered May 12, 1904, Charter surrendered April 21, 2006 and merged with Greencastle No. 11.

Clinton Commandery No. 48 – Chartered May 12, 1904. Charter surrendered on June 4, 2009 and members merged into Terre Haute Commandery No. 16

Rushville No. 49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997 and merged with Connersville No. 6.

Goshen Commandery No. 50 – Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered May 16, 2006, and merged with Elkhart No. 31.

Mishawaka No. 51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Tipton No. 52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo No. 36.

Winchester No. 53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No. 18.

Sullivan No. 54 Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20, 1979.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932

Seymour No. 56 – Chartered May 11, 1911 Charter surrendered August 15, 2014 and merged with Columbus No. 14 (Approved May 1, 2015)

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941.

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of

the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010).

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the Commandery will be voting to permanently move the Charter to Dubois Lodge, subject to approval at Grand Conclave 2010. (Approved April 24, 2010)

H. W. Matthewson Commandery No. 66 Chartered April 30, 1993. Charter surrendered December 12, 2012 and merged with Lafayette Commandery No. 3 in Lafayette, Indiana. (Approved April 25, 2014)

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, too open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003
