Grand Commander called for the minute to be read by the Grand Recorder; Sir Knight Barton moved that the minutes be approved as distributed and placed on the web site. The Indiana Knights Templar Web Site. The motion was 2nd and passed.

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What a year this has been! COVID, the virus, has changed everything we usually do during a templar year. March 13th 2020 will be a day I will never forget. I was setting at the registration table at the East Central Department Conference when Mike Robbins then Right Eminent Grand Commander called me over to the side of the room to tell me that he had some bad news. First, the typical conclave held in April would be CANCELED. We rescheduled it for June, then CANCELED. All the while, we were learning about this new way "safe" way to meet called Zoom. So we prepared to conduct the conclave in a new "virtual" way. I would like to thank the tech team of Chris Gamblin, John Bridegroom and Scott Sacek who worked tirelessly for us. With their help, we were able to pull off one of the first virtual conclaves in the East Central Conference. 

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through Aug. 10, 2022 the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
- The Organization expense advertising expenses as incurred. Advertising expense for the year was \$ 148.

TEMPLAR APRON Whereas, many Sir Knights have expressed enthusiasm for resuming use of a Templar Apron. Therefore, be it resolved that the Grand Encampment Statutes be amended by a new Chapter, consisting of two new Sections, as follows: CHAPTER XXII APRONS Section 260. It is permissible for Grand Encampment Officers and members of Grand, Constituent, and Subordinate Commanderies to wear an apron with Templar Uniforms as described in Sections 247, 248, 250, 250a, 251, and 259 as follows:

A. Traditional Apron. A Traditional Templar Apron shall conform substantially in design to the images below. It shall be trimmed in gold for Sir Knights of the rank of Commander or Past Commander and above, and in silver for Sir Knights below the rank of Commander. A

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Traditional Templar Apron may only be worn in an Asylum or other private setting where only Knights Templar are present.



B. Contemporary Apron. A Contemporary Templar Apron shall conform substantially in design to the image below. It shall be trimmed in gold for Sir Knights of the rank of Commander or Past Commander and above, and in silver for Sir Knights below the rank of Commander. A Contemporary Templar Apron may be worn in both private and public settings. It is permissible to manufacture an apron so that it is reversable with the Traditional Apron on one side and the Contemporary Apron on the other.



C. If a Sir Knight appears in uniform in a tiled, Masonic Lodge, he shall wear such apron as is in accord with local Masonic custom or approved by the presiding officer.

Section 261. A Grand Commandery may provide for the wearing of a Templar Apron in its Uniform Regulations similar to those in Sections 260 A, B and C. A Grand Commandery may specify with which of its authorized uniforms a Templar Apron may be worn." Each subordinate commandery must hold a vote at a stated conclave for or against the adoption of this resolution for the entire commandery. **2021/22** Respectfully submitted,

The committee would like to submit the following upgrades to the Knight Templar uniform: The Class A uniform, the left side above the pocket welt would consists of a total of 3-rows of bars/ribbons. Each row may have a bar holder that would hold 2-3 bars each depending on what you were qualified to wear. Such as there are a total of 8 bars you are allowed to wear and if you qualified to wear all 8 then you would have a top row of 2-bars followed below by two rows of 3 bars all sliding into a new bar holder designed to keep all these ribbons/bars in a neat straight line. The Bars/ Ribbons that you are eligible to wear are as follows in order of precedence.

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- 1. Military
- 2. MSA
- 3. DSA
- 4. Past Commander Assoc.
- 5. Ritual
- 6. Mentor
- 7. Holy land
- 8. ITA

If you only have one bars you would center that above the pocket welt. Two bars also one row centered above the pocket welt. Three bars all centered above the pocket welt, four bars one on top centered three below the one centered above the pocket welt.

On the pocket welt you are allowed to wear 3-jewels, they must be centered on the welt, three jewels and three only. If you have a bar/ribbon that corresponds with a jewel you cannot wear both you must decide which one you want to wear either as a bar or jewel. The jewels you are allowed to wear are as follows:

- 1. Malta
- 2. Officer Jewel
- 3. Past Commander
- 4. DSA
- 5. KTCH
- 6. Mentor
- 7. Holy Land
- 8. Past Commander Assoc.

The committee would also like to amend section 920 on the Past Commanders Assoc. Jewel, to state that the accepted members jewel or bar of that organization is authorized to be worn on the standard dress uniform.

The purpose of this program is to increase membership in the York Rite. Not just in quantity but in quality. We often find ourselves signing petition after petition and steering the candidates to the Tri-State Festival to quickly and easily get them Knighted. Oftentimes that is where it ends. Without a solid mentor, the new Sir Knight struggles to find his way in the York Rite and does not fully participate in our order.

This program is designed to increase membership by challenging every Sir Knight in Indiana to find just one Master Mason to introduce to the York Rite and to Mentor him through the process. There will be a new jewel/bar created that may be worn on your uniform for successfully completing this program. If approved this program will begin in April after the 2022 Grand Conclave.

In order to qualify for the Mentor Jewel, you must Top Line Sign a Candidate's Petition and carry it to your local York Rite. After a successful vote you must then assist the Candidate in receiving the degrees in Chapter, Council, and Commandery. This can be accomplished by traveling with your Protegee to attend degrees presented singularly or to attend Classes to receive degrees in a group.

After your Protegee is Knighted, you will then have several milestones to achieve with the new Sir Knight.



SECTION 920 (d) (RESOLUTION No. 10) WEARING OF JEWELS A person may not simultaneously wear more jewels than can be fit in a single line in the appropriate place on the standard Templar Uniform. For many Sir Knights this entails choosing which jewels to wear or omit. Any jewels that are worn should be in the following sequence from the wearer's right to left. The wearer's right is the edge closest to the center of the uniform front. Centered above the jewels, a Sir Knight may wear approved service bars. Only three bars may be worn in a row, but multiple rows are permitted. Service bars should be worn in the order listed from the top rows down and from the wearer's right to left. Thus, if multiple rows are worn, the highest ranked bars are in the top row.

SECTION 950: Grand Commandery Officer Shoulder Boards: shall be of red silk velvet, one and three-quarter to two inches wide by four inches long, bordered with one row or two rows of embroidery of gold bullion or mylar 1/4 to 3/8 inch wide with a one-inch square Malta cross (with or without a jewel) embroidered in gold bullion or mylar that shall be in the center. SECTION 654: Each Grand Officer who is an official delegate or his proxy and each Past Grand Commander who shall be present in attendance at, and representing this Grand Commandery, in the Grand Encampment of the United States, shall be entitled to receive from the funds in the hands of the Grand Treasurer of this Grand Commandery Five Dollars for each day spent in officially attending the Conclaves of the Grand Encampment, also the further sum of Five cents per mile for each mile necessarily traveled by the most direct route from a place in Indiana going to and returning from such Conclaves PROVIDED, that a past officer of the Grand Commandery, who is already a member of the Grand Encampment, acting as a proxy for an officer of the Grand Commandery to the Grand Encampment shall not receive dual payment for per diem and mileage for attending the Conclaves of the Grand Encampment as such proxy, all others, either as proxies or members of the Grand Encampment shall receive payment as herein provided.

SECTION 725: At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, next succeeding the Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment, the incoming Grand Commander shall appoint a Triennial Committee, composed of three members. Said Committee shall be charged with the duties of making all necessary arrangements for quarters for the Grand Commander and the delegates thereof to the Conclave of the Grand Encampment, and shall prepare and have in charge the receptions and entertainment given by the Grand Commandery during such Conclaves, and shall arrange for the necessary train service in going to and returning from said Conclaves, and shall, upon request from any Commandery, assist in securing quarters in and transportation to the Triennial City for the purpose of attending any Triennial Conclave Said committee shall appoint one of its members as Treasurer thereof who shall be covered by the blanket bond of the Grand Commandery. At the Annual Conclave next succeeding a Triennial Conclave, said committee shall make a report of its actions and file therewith an itemized statement of the moneys expended by it. The members of the Committee shall receive like mileage and per diem for attending the Triennial Conclave as is received by the representatives of the Grand Commandery, but no one shall receive both mileage and per diem as a member of the Committee and as a representative.

2021/22 Proceedings Indiana Grand Commandery Changed to read as follows:

TRIENNIAL COMMITTEE

Said committee shall appoint one of its members as Treasurer thereof who shall be covered by the blanket bond of the Grand Commandery. At the Annual Conclave next succeeding a Triennial Conclave, said committee shall make a report of its actions and file therewith an itemized statement of the moneys expended by it. The members of the Committee shall receive like mileage and per diem for attending the Triennial Conclave as is received by the representatives of the Grand Commandery, but no one shall receive both mileage and per diem as a member of the Committee and as a representative.

ADD: The voting delegates attending the Triennial shall receive mileage allowance (shortest distance from their home at the rate allowed by the IRS) or a per diem of \$45.00 per day for attending the Triennial Conclave as is received by the representatives of the Grand Commandery, but no one shall receive both mileage and per diem as a member of the Committee and as a representative.

Membership Committee Report

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Line, Distinguished Guests, Sir Knights all,

It is a pleasure to serve the Grand Commandery and all the Sir Knights in the State as Membership Committee Chairman for 2020/2021. As each of us knows, the Covid-19 Pandemic made 2020 an extremely challenging year. With Commanderies unable to meet and personal lives of Sir Knights and their families turned upside down, our plans for increasing membership were not fully enacted.

Sadly, we were only able to confer Knighthood on seven of our Masonic Brothers. In planning for the eventual re-opening of Commanderies around the state, I had the opportunity to reach out to each Eminent Commander and Recorder to remind them of the importance of having a local Membership Committee with a Chair that has a strong desire to increase our ranks.

During our downtime, I was also able to work closely with Right Eminent Grand Commander Fodrea to put together a program that may help us to increase the number of Sir Knights that are likely to actively participate in the Conclaves of the 34 Commanderies across Indiana.

Proposed Mentor Program

The purpose of the Mentor Program is to increase membership in the York Rite - not just in quantity but in quality. We often find ourselves signing petition after petition and steering the candidates to the Tri-State Festival to quickly and easily get them Knighted. Oftentimes that is where it ends. Without a solid mentor, the new Sir Knight struggles to find his way in the York Rite and does not fully participate in our order.

This program is designed to increase membership by challenging every Sir Knight in Indiana to find just one Master Mason to introduce to the York Rite and to Mentor him through the process.

Fodrea

There is legislation to be presented which will authorize a new jewel/bar that may be worn on your uniform for successfully completing this program. If approved this program will begin in April after the 2021/2022 Grand Conclave.

To qualify for the Mentor Jewel, you must Top Line Sign a Candidate's Petition and carry it to your local York Rite. After a successful vote you must then assist the Candidate in receiving the degrees and orders in Chapter, Council, and Commandery. This can be accomplished by travelling with your Protegee to attend degrees presented singularly or to attend events like the Tri-State Festival to receive degrees in a group.

After your Protegee is Knighted, you will then have several milestones to achieve with the new Sir Knight. The complete list of criteria are still being developed but will include activities in Chapter, Council, and Commandery to be completed with each protegee for the Sir Knight Mentor to earn the Mentor Jewel.

Potential Criteria for Earning the Mentor Jewel (Note, this is only a partial list):

- Explain all the signs, words, and penalties for each Degree/Order and have the Sir Knight Protegee commit all to memory for Chapter, Council, and Commandery.
- Attend with your Protegee at least three meetings for Chapter, Council, and Commandery.
- Visit another York Rite for a Stated Meeting or Degree work.
- Attend at least one Grand Event.
- Attend inspection for two of the three bodies.
- Commit to memory the 11 offices of the Commandery and plot them on a chart. Match the Jewel to the Office. (same for Chapter and Council)
- Learn proper sword use Learn the Sword Manual
- Learn how to decipher the lost word.
- More criteria to come as the program is further developed.

If the Mentor Program is adopted and well publicized, and we have good participation, we have the potential to significantly increase the number of Sir Knights in the Great State of Indiana.

OPTIONAL FULL CEREMONIAL FOR CONFERRING THE MEDITERRANEAN PASS

[The Candidate, who must be a Companion of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross, is prepared by being dressed in dark clothing, over which shall be a mantle similar in shape to the Malta mantle, except of white material with the red cross of the Order on the Left breast in red material initialed in green; mantle to be fastened with white cord and tassel. Candidate does not wear a headdress and is girded with sword and belt. He is accompanied by the Marshal to the door of the Guard room, where he makes an alarm of at the door. The Captain of the Outposts, inside, responds in the same manner, opens the door, and passes out.]

C. of O: What do you....

Marshal: A. B., a Companion of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross....

C. of O: Give me the sign....

[The sign, grip, and word of a Companion of the Bed Cross are given.]

C. of O: You will wait

[Closes door and reports.]

Eminent Prior: A. B., a Companion of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross....

Prior: Captain of the Outposts, far be it....

C. of O: I can, Eminent Prior.

Prior: Is it your pleasure....

[Knights give assent by holding up the right hand.]

Prior: I declare A. B., a Companion....

C. of O: [At door.] You have permission to enter.

[The Candidate, accompanied by the Marshal, enters and a stands west of the Altar.]

Prior: Brother A. B., we have....

Candidate: I am.

Prior: My Brother, do you....

Candidate: I solemnly promise.

Prior: The incidents upon....

[Cast rises with the Chaplain and un-covers.]

Chaplain: Here beginneth the first verse of the twenty-eighth chapter of the Acts of the Apostles (verses 1-6). Here endeth the first lesson.

[Cast re-covers and is seated.]

Prior: I will now invest....

[Cast rises with the Chaplain and un-covers.]

Chaplain: Here beginneth the twenty-second verse of the twenty-seventh chapter of the Acts of the Apostles (verses 22-25). Here endeth the second lesson.

[Cast re-covers and is seated.]

Prior: The Password of this degree is....

[A salver is here presented by the Chaplain, upon it a cup of water and two or three small pieces of bread.]

[The Prior then takes the sword from the Altar, placing on its point a piece of bread, and presents it to the Candidate, who receives and eats it. The Prior then takes the cup in his left hand, supporting the bottom of it with the blade of the sword, presents it to the Candidate, who takes it in his right hand and thinks from it. The cup is then replaced on the salver.]

At the conclusion of the Mediterranean Pass after the Marshal has retired with the Candidate, the Chapel is restored to the setting used in the Opening. Banners are replaced, candles are relighted, and the tables are put in order with the swords in proper position. The Altar with the New Testament open at 19th Chapter of John, and with Cross, sword, crucifix and kneeling cushion is placed, as shown in figure 1.

When all is in readiness, the officers seated at the tables, the Banner Guards and Banner Bearers seated in their stations, the cue is given for the Marshal and the Candidate, costumed as in the preceding degree, to make an alarm at the door.

[The Prior, with the officers, seat themselves at the tables in the East and West, the Banner Guards and Banner Bearers take stations. The Marshal, with the Candidate costumed as in the preceding degree, makes an alarm of at the door.]

C. of O.: Eminent Prior, there is an alarm....

Prior: Captain of the Outposts, ascertain the....

[C. of 0. goes to the door, responds to the alarm, gives knocks *** *** opens the door and passes out.]

C. of O.: Who....

Marshal: A worthy Knight of the Mediterranean Pass....

C. of O.: Has he the necessary....

Marshal: He has.

C. of O.: Give me the Sign, [Done] Let him wait until his [C. of 0. returns to Priory]

C. of O.: Eminent Prior, the alarm was caused....

Prior: Has he answered....

C. of O.: He has and has given me....

Prior: Admit him.

When the Prior says, "Admit him" the five Ceremonial Banner Guards rise, take one step forward, draw swords, all watching the No. 5 or Yellow Banner for their cues so all can work in unison. When challenging the Candidate, each Banner Guard should use the position of "On Guard". After "You have permission to pass", Guards come to "Carry Swords". When Candidate passes the fifth Guard, all return swords, step back one step, and are seated. All watch the fifth or Yellow Banner for all cues. [C. of 0. opens the door]

[They approach the third (black) banner]

Guard: Halt! Who comes there?

Marshal: A friend.

Guard: Advance and....

Marshal: [In a low tone.] "Death."

At the conclusion of the music the Marshal and Candidate rise.]

Prior: Brother Marshal, what strange

[Candidate, prompted by the Marshal, bows and points to the Cross on his mantle]

[Prior takes up the sword and with it gently strikes the Candidate three blows on the right shoulder]

Prior: Let this teach you....

[Lays the sword on the Altar and with the palm of his open hand strikes Candidate slightly on the left cheek]

Prior: Awake! Be not asleep....

Prior: By virtue of the power.... *[Taking him by the right hand]* We admit you....

[Music appropriate, instrumental, with grand flourish when Candidate is raised by new name.]

Prior: Take up your sword [Done] As you have....

During the Investitures, the Chaplin approaches the Prior, first with the taper. He waits, while the Prior gives "The burning taper....". The Chaplain returns to the table and brings forward the Knight of Malta mantle. As the Chaplain returns to the table, the Candidate Is divested of the Red Cross Mantle.

Prior: This burning taper....

[The taper is taken away and the Candidate divested of his Red Cross mantle. The Chaplain brings forward the Knight of Malta mantle or cloak and hands it to the Prior. The Prior, pointing to the cross on the mantle]

Prior: My Brother, do you....

Candidate: I do.

[Music: The "Credo," "I believe in God the Father," etc.—should be sung]

Prior: The Cross is also....

[The Prior places mantle on Candidate, tying the mantle about his neck with the white cord, and says]

Prior: By this cord I....

[The Chaplain presents the Cross of the Order, borne upon a black velvet cushion, to the Prior, who places it upon the breast of the Candidate, saying]

Chaplain: I now invest you with....

[Music: "Sanctus," "Holy, Holy, etc.]

The Chaplain in returning approaches the lectern to be ready to read the first lesson. He returns to his station at the table in the east immediately after reading the last lesson. In other words, he should be seated at his station at the table in the east when the Marshal gives the historical lecture at the table and refers to the first five officers of the Priory.

Prior: Reverend Chaplain, you will....

When the scripture lessons are read, all knights will arise with the Chaplain. The banner guards and banner bearers will draw and present swords and remain so during the reading. Those whose swords are on the tables will cross their arms on their breasts, right arm uppermost. At the conclusion of the reading, swords will be brought to "Carry" and then "Return", and arms will be dropped. All will be seated in unison. Cues are to be taken from the Bearer of The Maltese banner.

[Cast returns swords and is seated]

[Reads the twenty-fourth to the twenty-ninth verses, in-elusive]

[Music: The "Agnus Del"—" Lamb of God, who taketh away the sins of the world," may be sung]

Prior: You will now give your attention....

Prior: Knight Marshal, you will instruct the newly made Knight of Malta.

HISTORICAL AND EXPLANATORY LECTURE

Marshal: My Brother, I will now direct....

The historical and explanatory lecture is begun by the Marshal as the candidate stands at the Altar. When reference is made to the ceremonial banners and the Marshal starts west with the Candidate, the Ceremonial Banner Guards rise, take one step forward, draw swords, and remain at "Carry Swords" until Candidates have passed all five Banners. Then upon cue from the No. 5 Banner, they return swords, step back and are seated. [They proceed and halt at the first banner, "Birth."]

Banner Guard: This Order was....

[They pass to the second banner, "Life."]

Banner Guard: After a troubled....

[They pass to the third banner, "Death."]

Banner Guard: On the fifth of August....

[They pass to the fourth banner, "Resurrection."]

Banner Guard: During the period from....

[They pass to the fifth banner, "Ascension."]

Banner Guard: On the 24th of.... of the Order.

Lecturer: The number 5 also symbolically reminds us of the passion of our Blessed Savior, and of his five wounds upon the Cross.

At conclusion of the Maltese Banner lecture the Marshal conducts the candidate to west of the Altar and the two banner bearers, return swords, step back and are seated. [Music: Finale, "Gloria in Excelsis," after Rex Regain et Dominus Dominorum. If the Prior prefers, the "Gloria" may precede the lecture, though properly it should follow it.]

Prior: And now, my Brother,....

The Prior delivers the welcome address and final lecture to the Candidate and then directs him to be seated. The Marshal conducts the Candidate to a seat on the south side and removes the

Malta Mantle and leaves him in charge of a Knight designated for the purpose. The Marshal then approaches his station at the Table in the East, faces West, and is seated.

Prior: Brother Marshal, what strange brother....

The Prior remains seated at the table in the east until the obligation, when he approaches the Altar. During the obligation, all in costume will arise without command and cross their arms on their breasts, right arm uppermost. Watch Maltese banner guard for cue. The arms will be dropped to the sides at the completion of the Obligation, but all should remain standing. When the Prior concludes "Arise, Knight of Malta", all are seated without command.

Prior: Take up your sword....

During the investitures, the Chaplain approaches the Prior, first with the taper. He waits, while the Prior gives page 76, lines 4 to 9.

Prior: This burning taper....

The Chaplain returns to the table and brings forward the Knight of Malta mantle. As the Chaplain returns to the table, the Candidate is divested of the Red Cross Mantle.

Prior: The Cross is also the sign....

Prior: I now invest you with....

Prior continues ritual to page 77 line 9. Chaplain comes forward again with Maltese Cross on black velvet cushion and presents it to the Prior who places it on the breast of the Candidate.

Prior: Reverend Chaplain, you will read....

The Chaplain in returning approaches the lectern to be ready to read the first lesson. He returns to his station at the table in the east immediately after reading the last lesson on page 79. In other words, he should be seated at his station at the table in the east when the Marshall gives the historical lecture at the table and makes a reference to the first five Officers of the Priory.

51.9 When the scripture lessons are read, all Knights will arise with the Chaplain. The Banner Guards and Banner Bearers will draw and present swords and remain so during the reading. Those whose swords are on the tables will cross their arms on their breast, right arm uppermost. After passing the fifth banner, the Marshal conducts the candidate to the west of the Altar where he gives page 82, line 31 to page 84, line 21.

Marshal: ... upon the cross on the table in the west.

The Marshal again conducts the candidate to the west and as they approach the Table in the West, the No. 1 Knight rises and steps aside as he gives his lecture. All other Knights remain seated.

Marshal: I will now direct your attention to the Grand Banners....

Leaving the Table in the West, the Marshal and the Candidate proceed along the north side to the Banners of St. John and Malta. As they start toward the east, the two Banner Bearers rise simultaneously, take one step forward, draw swords. And remain standing at "Carry".

At the conclusion of the Maltese Banner lecture, the Marshal conducts the Candidate to west of the Altar, and the two Banner Bearers return swords, steps back, and are seated.

Prior: And now, my Brother, in behalf of....

The Prior delivers the welcome address and final lecture to the Candidate and then directs him to be seated. The Marshal conducts the Candidate to a seat on the south side and removes the Malta Mantle and leaves him in charge of a Knight designated for the purpose. The Marshal then approaches his station at the Table in the East, faces west, and is seated.

Prior: Brother Knights, Attention!

When the Prior commands "Brother Knights, Attention!", all rise, draw swords and come to "Carry". The Knights at the Tables simultaneously take their swords from the tables and also come to "Carry".

Prior: ... Let us again lay our swords at the foot....

Continue ritual to page 89, line 15 where the Prior says, "Let us again lay our swords..." all deposit their sword as in the opening and stand in their places with arms crossed on their breasts, right arm uppermost.

Prior: Brothers, resume your arms....

At the conclusion of the prayer, Prior says, "Brothers, resume your arms..." all recover their swords and returns them to their scabbards simultaneously, taking the cue from the Knight Bearer of the Maltese Banner.

Prior and four Officers: You came in peace?

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Fodrea
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Prior and four Officers at the Table in the East give the first part of the Grand Hailing Sign and after the Knights give the second part in unison, they conclude with the response.

Prior: To the glory of our Blessed Savior....

Prior closes Priory and Captain General informs the Captain of the Outpost to "dismiss the Guard; this Priory of Knights of Malta is closed".

Cap. Gen.: Captain of the Outpost, you will dismiss....

Without command, the Captain General draws his sword and immediately begins to form the Recessional. See figure 3. All Officers and Knights in the West draw swords. Leaving his station, the Captain General is followed by the Banners of St. John and Malta, and the Marshal. They march west to the east side of the Altar, thence north and west, where the Knights at the Table in the West who have faced outward, fall in behind the Marshal. The Captain of the Outpost falls in behind the Captain General as the Column passes his station headed north. The five Ceremonial Banner Guards also fall in as the Procession passes them. When the Column is all assembled in file in the east facing south, it is halted by the Captain General so all can "close up" and cover in file accurately. The Processional two step march then begins and all step off with the hesitation step. The Chaplain, carrying the Bible on the cushion, the Lieutenant Commander, and the Prior fall in line as the Processional passes them, and they too pick up the hesitation step.

The Procession marches once around the Chapel and then out the door.

When the Procession has cleared the door, it is shut, and this is the cue for the Acolyte to begin putting out the candles. He starts with the four on the Table in the West and concludes with the two at the Altar. The ceiling lights should be on a dimmer and are lowered as the candles are put out.

When the Acolyte leaves the Chapel, the lights are brought up immediately. A cordial welcome to the Candidate and remarks by the Commander concludes the work. No speeches!

The entire Order of Malta as prescribed in these Tactics can be exemplified in an hour and a half -90 minutes.

Membership Committee Report

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Line, Distinguished Guests, Sir Knights all,

It is a pleasure to serve the Grand Commandery and all the Sir Knights in the State as Membership Committee Chairman for 2020/2021. As each of us knows, the Covid-19 Pandemic made 2020 an extremely challenging year. With Commanderies unable to meet and personal lives of Sir Knights and their families turned upside down, our plans for increasing membership were not fully enacted.

Sadly, we were only able to confer Knighthood on seven of our Masonic Brothers. In planning for the eventual re-opening of Commanderies around the state, I had the opportunity to reach out to each Eminent Commander and Recorder to remind them of the importance of having a local Membership Committee with a Chair that has a strong desire to increase our ranks.

During our downtime, I was also able to work closely with Right Eminent Grand Commander Fodrea to put together a program that may help us to increase the number of Sir Knights that are likely to actively participate in the Conclaves of the 34 Commanderies across Indiana.

Proposed Mentor Program

The purpose of the Mentor Program is to increase membership in the York Rite - not just in quantity but in quality. We often find ourselves signing petition after petition and steering the candidates to the Tri-State Festival to quickly and easily get them Knighted. Oftentimes that is where it ends. Without a solid mentor, the new Sir Knight struggles to find his way in the York Rite and does not fully participate in our order.

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This program is designed to increase membership by challenging every Sir Knight in Indiana to find just one Master Mason to introduce to the York Rite and to Mentor him through the process. There is legislation to be presented which will authorize a new jewel/bar that may be worn on your uniform for successfully completing this program. If approved this program will begin in April after the 2021/2022 Grand Conclave.

To qualify for the Mentor Jewel, you must Top Line Sign a Candidate's Petition and carry it to your local York Rite. After a successful vote you must then assist the Candidate in receiving the degrees and orders in Chapter, Council, and Commandery. This can be accomplished by travelling with your Protegee to attend degrees presented singularly or to attend events like the Tri-State Festival to receive degrees in a group.

After your Protegee is Knighted, you will then have several milestones to achieve with the new Sir Knight. The complete list of criteria are still being developed but will include activities in Chapter, Council, and Commandery to be completed with each protegee for the Sir Knight Mentor to earn the Mentor Jewel.

Potential Criteria for Earning the Mentor Jewel (Note, this is only a partial list):

- Explain all the signs, words, and penalties for each Degree/Order and have the Sir Knight Protegee commit all to memory for Chapter, Council, and Commandery.
- Attend with your Protegee at least three meetings for Chapter, Council, and Commandery.
- Visit another York Rite for a Stated Meeting or Degree work.
- Attend at least one Grand Event.
- Attend inspection for two of the three bodies.
- Commit to memory the 11 offices of the Commandery and plot them on a chart. Match the Jewel to the Office. (same for Chapter and Council)
- Learn proper sword use Learn the Sword Manual
- Learn how to decipher the lost word.
- More criteria to come as the program is further developed.

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If the Mentor Program is adopted and well publicized, and we have good participation, we have the potential to significantly increase the number of Sir Knights in the Great State of Indiana.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Proposal #1: Resolution to establish quorum for Business meetings Section 820(1)

In accordance with Section 66 of the Bylaws of Grand Encampment which allows a Grand Commandery to reduce the number of Sir Knights necessary to constitute a quorum for conducting the business of the Commandery to a number less than nine but not less than five. A Grand Commandery may only implement this provision legislatively. Nine Sir Knights constitute a Commandery and are required to establish a Commandery or confer the Orders of Knighthood.

Therefore, we propose the following addition to Section 820 of the Bylaws of the Indiana Grand Commandery through this Resolution that for the purpose of conducting a Business meeting only, there must be no less than five Sir Knight present to constitute a quorum for the business meeting.

Holy Land Pilgrimage Jewel 920 (c1)

In order to promote certain advantages for the welfare of the Grand Commandery in general, the Constituent Commanderies and Sir Knights in particular, there is hereby submitted to this Grand Commandery Conclave a proposal to establish a "HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE JEWEL" for the Grand Commandery of Indiana. (A) The Jewel should be presented only in consideration of loyal and financial support to the Holy Land Pilgrimage program. There is three level of support 1) \$250.00 2) \$500.00 3) \$1000.00. For a donation of two hundred and fifty dollars the donor shall receive a jewel with a back ribbon. For a donation of five hundred dollars the donor shall receive a jewel with a red ribbon. The donation will be accumulative totals. In lieu of jewel the donor may wear the bar. See below



SECTION 920 (d) (RESOLUTION No. 10) WEARING OF JEWELS A person may not simultaneously wear more jewels than can be fit in a single line in the appropriate place on the standard Templar Uniform. For many Sir Knights this entails choosing which jewels to wear or omit. Any jewels that are worn should be in the following sequence from the wearer's right to

left. The wearer's right is the edge closest to the center of the uniform front. Centered above the jewels, a Sir Knight may wear approved service bars. Only three bars may be worn in a row, but multiple rows are permitted. Service bars should be worn in the order listed from the top rows down and from the wearer's right to left. Thus, if multiple rows are worn, the highest ranked bars are in the top row.

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "**DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD**" (for Sir Knights) was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977 at the 123rd Annual Conclave. It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- 2. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General, will acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

Knights Templar Cross of Honor

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 (b) of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA, a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight (or Knights, depending on Grand Commandery membership counts) of each Grand Commandery once each year.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. It is to be noted that this award is to be made only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or Member. No elected Grand Commandery or Grand Encampment officer, past or present, is eligible to receive the award. This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider has been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric labors.

Should your Commandery desire to make a nomination for this award, you will use the following procedure.

- 1. Pass a resolution in your Commandery, naming the Sir Knight to be nominated.
- 2. Write to the Grand Recorder for a nomination form.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

(1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 (b) of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR**, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.

(2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored, and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.

(3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.

(4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:

- a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
- b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a nomination form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, and Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon.
- c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
- d. Such Grand Commander shall consider nominations made Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in anyone year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
- e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by to the Grand Master.

(5) The **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR** medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof. The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

(6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.

(7) It shall the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand

Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

Synopsis of Triennial

The 68th Triennial was opened by Most Eminent Grand Master Jeffery Norman Nelson on Monday August 16th. After a morning of Introductions, the first tiled session began at 1:00 pm. After the Grand Master Allocution was given the floor was opened for Proposed Amendments to the Constitution. Most of these amendments did not affect the local Commanderies. I will touch on those that affect Indiana Commanderies and the Grand Commandery of Indiana

- PUBLIC APPERANCES IN UNIFORM
 - Sections 214 & 215 Repealed in their entirety.
- SUMMER UNIFORMS
 - Section 259. Each Grand Commandery may, in its discretion, adopt the uniform herein described in, making use of the optional sections as it chooses. Further this uniform may only be used for the period beginning with Memorial Day and continuing through Labor Day. The Grand Commander of each jurisdiction may set the dates for the wearing of Summer Uniforms in his jurisdiction. The Grand Encampment Officers may wear the Summer Uniform on appropriate occasions. The Summer Uniform in no event be worn when conferring the Orders.
 - Added words and punctuation are underlined. Deleted words and punctuation are struct through.

• SHORT FORM OPENING RITUAL

- The following is added to Section 66 Quorum
 - If a Commandery is permitted to be opened with less than nine members and there are not nine or more Sir Knights present, the Short Form Opening in the 2019 Ritual shall be used.

• OFFICES IN MULTIIPLE COMMANDERIES

- Section 190(a) was amended to read as follows
 - A Knight Templar may be admitted to membership in any Commandery regardless of his residence but cannot and may be a dais an elected officer in more than one Commandery at the same time, provided he may not be Commander of more than one Commandery at the same time.
- Added words and punctuation are underlined. Deleted words and punctuation are struct through.

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• TEMPLAR APRON

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Proposed Amendment 2021-20

Proposed by S.K. Jack M. Harper, II, P.G.C. (Texas) And Sir Knight Jeremy C. Vaughn, P.G.C. (Idaho)

TEMPLAR APRON

Whereas, many Sir Knights have expressed enthusiasm for resuming use of a Templar Apron.

Therefore, be it resolved that the Grand Encampment *Statutes* **be amended** by a new Chapter, consisting of two new Sections, as follows:

CHAPTER XXII APRONS

Section 260. It is permissible for Grand Encampment Officers and members of Grand, Constituent, and Subordinate Commanderies to wear an apron with Templar Uniforms as described in Sections 247, 248, 250, 250a, 251, and 259 as follows:

A. Traditional Apron. A Traditional Templar Apron shall conform substantially in design to the images below. It shall be trimmed in gold for Sir Knights of the rank of Commander or Past Commander and above, and in silver for Sir Knights below the rank of Commander. A Traditional Templar Apron may only be worn in an Asylum or other private setting where only Knights Templar are present.



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B. Contemporary Apron. A Contemporary Templar Apron shall conform substantially in design to the image below. It shall be trimmed in gold for Sir Knights of the rank of Commander or Past Commander and above, and in silver for Sir Knights below the rank of Commander. A Contemporary Templar Apron may be worn in both private and public settings. It is permissible to manufacture an apron so that it is reversable with the Traditional Apron on one side and the Contemporary Apron on the other.



- C. Grand Encampment Officers may wear such aprons and others, as deemed appropriate, from time to time, by the Grand Master and in accordance with his directions. and
- D. If a Sir Knight appears in uniform in a tyled, Masonic Lodge, he shall wear such apron as is in accord with local Masonic custom or approved by the presiding officer.

Section 261. A Grand Commandery may provide for the wearing of a Templar Apron in its Uniform Regulations similar to those in Sections 260 A, B and C. A Grand Commandery may specify with which of its authorized uniforms a Templar Apron may be worn."





General Orders

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General Order No. 1 Fodrea



April 25, 2021

Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 and 852 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

- 1. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within his Battalion with the following exceptions:
 - The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
 - A fellow Grand Line Officer will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- 2. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commanderand Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, and Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival.
- 3. The records Inspection shall consist of:
 - A report on the membership efforts.
 - Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
 - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
 - Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 4. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.

*The Battalion Commander will leave the Inspection or Reception with ALL paperwork pertaining to the Inspection or Reception.

- 5. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date(s) and time(s) mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer.
- 6. The Inspection will be for the conferral of the Order of the Temple or the Order of Red Cross or the Order of Malta. All Inspections must be complete by the first Saturday in December 2021.
 All Commanderies should do their best to have a candidate for the Inspection.
- 7. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Reception and Order conferral. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.

8.Inspections may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies participating together for an official Inspection. Points for the Inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has six (6) or more of its member's present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander). The Inspection will consist of the following:

Open Reception Order of Red Cross Order of Malta or Order of the Temple Flag presentation Closing

If, in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer and the Battalion Commander, a Sir Knight is giving the Prelates Address, Ode to the Skull, or the Junior Wardens address (Chamber of Reflection) for the first time at the Inspection, they can give up to an additional 100 points to this Sir Knight's Commandery on the score sheet.

If a commandery choices to do the Order of Red Cross in full form the commandery will be award 300 bonus points on the score sheet

If a commandery choices the Order of Malta, in full form, the commandery will be awarded 600 bonus points on the score sheet.

Upon completion of each Inspection and prior to Closing, the Eminent Commander shall give his remarks first, followed by the Inspecting Officer. The Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official representative, shall be accorded all the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present, he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander is the final speaker.

Violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a no score for your Inspection and thus require an additional Inspection scheduled by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.

The Reception will consist of the following, and points awarded on the Activity Sheet for each portion completed. The 10 Man Open Reception will receive 20 points (possible 100 points) for each portion completed, and the 12 Man Open Reception will receive 50 points (possible 250 points) for each portion completed. Any portion of the Reception not completed will be reflected on the Activity Sheet minus the corresponding points.

9. Scores will be separated among the Commanderies in the Battalion by the number of officers participating in the Order. The inspection of the Order of the Temple may occur any time after June 1, 2021 and prior to the first Sunday in December 2021.

Inspection scores will be separated by officer ranking only. A non-member of the Battalion, assisting that Battalion, will receive an officer score of 0. All members or officers of the participating Battalion Commanderies will receive an officer score of 1-20.

An Instructional may be held in lieu of an Inspection on the Order of the Temple when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General, deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.

Commanderies using an exemplar in place of an actual candidate will confer the Order of the Temple as if they had an actual candidate and scored as such by the Inspecting Officer.

10. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report (Tally Sheet Landscape) of each Commandery to the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Inspector General, the Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Recorder, as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. All other required paperwork will be kept by the Battalion Commander and made immediately available upon request. A full report of the Inspections will be discussed at the winter meeting and present for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.

- 11. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the combined score of the Open Reception, Uniform Inspection Order of the Temple or the Order of Red Cross of the Order of Malta, Flag Presentation and Closing. All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 12. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each Battalion on the "Activity Score Sheet" will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

• Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.

• The Commander be responsible to provide a "New Member Packet" to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.

• Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.

• The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Lafayette No. 3 – Organized on September 19, 1853, Charter Date April 7, 1868; On June 5, 2017 surrendered their Charter and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded, and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868 and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

South Bend No. 13 Charted April 8, 1868 merged with LaPorte No. 12 on March 1, 2019

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Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006. Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990. Merged with Baldwin No. 2 on July 24, 2017.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

St. John No. 24 Chartered April 2, 1873. Charter surrendered January 2, 2012 and merged with Frankfort Commandery No. 29.

Jeffersonville No. 27 - Chartered April 26, 1876. Charter surrendered October 13, 2008 and merged with New Albany No. 5.

Michigan City No. 30 - Chartered April 30, 1884 Charter surrendered January 1, 2017 and merged with LaPorte No. 12.

Washington No. 33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985 and merged with Vincennes No. 20.

Cyrene No. 34 - Chartered May 2, 1891. Name changed to Columbia City No. 34 on May 9, 1947.

Columbia City No. 34 - Successor to Cyrene No. 34; Charter surrendered September 4, 1968.

Wabash No. 37 – Chartered April 20, 1893. Chartered arrested April 10, 2008, and merged into St. Anselm, U.D.

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Bluffton No. 38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994 and merged with Fort Wayne No. 4.

Delphi No. 40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972 and merged with Lafayette No. 3.

Hammond No. 41 – Chartered April 21, 1898. Charter surrendered April 30, 2015 and merged with Valparaiso No. 28.

Lebanon No. 43 – Chartered April 20, 1899. Charter surrendered August 15, 2000 and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

New Castle No. 44 Chartered April 19, 1900, Charter surrendered January 1, 2006 and merged with Knightstown No. 9.

Princeton No. 46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995 and merged with LaValette No. 15.

Brazil No. 47 – Chartered May 12, 1904, Charter surrendered April 21, 2006 and merged with Greencastle No. 11.

Clinton Commandery No. 48 – Chartered May 12, 1904. Charter surrendered on June 4, 2009 and members merged into Terre Haute Commandery No. 16

Rushville No. 49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997 and merged with Connersville No. 6.

Goshen Commandery No. 50 – Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered May 16, 2006, and merged with Elkhart No. 31.

Mishawaka No. 51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Tipton No. 52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo No. 36.

Winchester No. 53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No. 18.

Sullivan No. 54 Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20, 1979.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932

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Seymour No. 56 – Chartered May 11, 1911 Charter surrendered August 15, 2014 and merged with Columbus No. 14 (Approved May 1, 2015)

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941.

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to

document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010).

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the

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Commandery will be voting to permanently move the Charter to Dubois Lodge, subject to approval at Grand Conclave 2010. (Approved April 24, 2010)

H. W. Matthewson Commandery No. 66 Chartered April 30, 1993. Charter surrendered December 12, 2012 and merged with Lafayette Commandery No. 3 in Lafayette, Indiana. (Approved April 25, 2014)

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, too open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003
