

Tony had a very distinguished career in Masonry with his Lady Monica ever at his side. He was an amazing servant to the fraternity, always willing to use his skills and expertise when called upon. He has served as an aide to the Grand Commander or Deputy Grand Commander since 2010. He had the honor of becoming a Grand Prelate Emeritus in 2013. He received the honors of KTCH – Knight Templar Cross of Honor in 2017, and KCT – Knight Commander of the Temple in 2021. Tony served as Grand Sentinel for Grand Council in 2022 and Marshal for the Grand Chapter in 2018. Both Tony and Monica could be found running hospitality rooms, organizing bus trips, taking photos, providing sound equipment, and running banquets to serve the fraternity he loved. He leaves a huge hole in the fabric of the Masonic Brotherhood and his presence will most certainly be missed. We take solace in the knowledge that he will enter that celestial lodge in heaven, to that house not built with hands, eternal in the heavens where he will hear the words, we all seek, "Well done, thy good and faithful servant".

The celebration of life services were held on Thursday, May 25. The Templar Memorial service was given by John Freeland. The Masonic Memorial service was performed by Chris Steele, who is the same Mason that performed the service for Tony's father. Following those, the Grand Commander of the State of Indiana, Randy Ellington officiated a personal memorial. The family knows that while this is a sad circumstance, Tony's life was about finding joy, love, and laughter amid life's ups and downs, and that's how they'd like to honor him.
