The Dr. took out all of the old hardware and I have a steel spacer with donor bone tissue graft in that hip. I don't hurt when I walk and I don't wobble with loose parts. I spent 7 weeks in the Rehab Center in Wheaton, IL and that really helped getting physical therapy every day. It has built up the strength in my legs. 
