Sickness & Distress:

John Bridegroom's Daughter Phoenix, Arch 1 Officer Grand Council

Update 3/4: John Bridegroom wrote on Facebook 40 minutes ago: Phoenix has been struggling for a couple weeks now, and today her fever shot back up to 103.5 and she is in a lot of pain. Her heart rate was very high, in the 198 range. She does not seem to have any infections, and CT scans of her head and abdomen all seem to not show anything wrong. Her pancreas looks ok, her brain looks ok, her heart looks ok, her circulation is good... we just do not know what the problem is. As a result, Tammy and I decided to move her to Riley's today, and she is on her way in an ambulance now. I have arrived here early as it appears I drive faster than the ambulance (no surprise to anyone I am sure). Please take a moment, pause from your evenings activities, and say a prayer for her. She really needs a reprieve from all this pain. Though we have no signs of major issues, the symptoms are real, and the not knowing the cause scares us all. Thank you.

Update 3/5: Phoenix is doing better this morning! Her heart rate has come down to the 140s; she was alert and talking today. She seemed to be in much less pain and her breathing was back to normal. The docs here in Indy have confirmed that she has acute Pancreatitis, which you just wait to subside while not eating or drinking anything. They have placed a PIC line, so they can deliver some meds more effectively and a drain tube into her stomach, by way of her nose, to keep fluid from accumulating there. That will ease the nausea, and help the Pancreatitis heal quicker. We are very pleased with the difference from yesterday to today, very happy to be back at Riley's where they are better equipped to handle our situation, and so grateful for all your prayers, as you can see they are making a real difference! We are being moved out of ICU today (YAY!) and onto the oncology floor. All in all, so far, things are improving and that makes the sun shine a little brighter for us today. Thank you!

Update 3/8: Phoenix is finally feeling better! Her pancreatitis has mostly healed, she has not had a fever in 24 hours, & she has recovered from her chest tube placement yesterday. Her new chest tube is still draining a high volume of fluid, but she started some steroids last night that will help this along. Today she is eating crackers & drinking water & juice, which makes her happy. The docs have decided to continue to delay her chemo until the chest tube is out, or will reevaluate next week. She will start some therapy in her bed to help her muscles, since she hasn't been up & moving in 4 weeks. Thank you all for your thoughts and prayers! Tammy

Update 3/10: Phoenix continues to feel better each day. This morning she ate breakfast, did some therapy, and had a smile on her face! Oh her beautiful smile makes me happier than I can ever say. I

am re-energized with help from John and our parents this week. It looks like her chest tube may be able to come out within the next few days. So with this improvement, her next round of chemo is right around the corner, so please continue all that positive energy you love to give! Tammy

Update 3/13: Phoenix is doing well. She is still in Indy at Riley's, but as of right now she is not hooked up to anything but the drain tube in her chest! This is good, no antibiotics, medications or pain meds. She is feeling good, though she is bored. She has been up and walking the past two days, and having Physical Therapy as well as School during the day. She is eating pretty well though they have her on a low fat diet until they are sure the Pancreatitis is gone entirely. We are hopeful that the drain tube can be removed in the next few days, but that depends entirely on the fluid output. It still needs to slow down a bit. They will begin her next round of Chemo as soon as the tube is out and possibly before. She will be here at Riley's for a couple more weeks as a result I think. Thank you, everyone, for all of your support. These are long days and nights, especially for Tammy. In the last month and a half she has been home for approx. 4 days, and she sleeps in a recliner next to Phoenix's bed every night. I travel back and forth from home to Indy, staying when I can for a couple nights at a time, sometimes just staying for a few hours and then driving back. All of your support helps us in many ways. Thank you.

Update 3/19: Just realized I told my mom I would update yesterday! So, things are going well at the moment. Phoenix started chemo on Thursday, had a spinal injection this morning, & will finish up tomorrow. Her chest tube is still draining, & we will remain here until it stops. She is feeling tired & a little nauseous, but overall she's doing great. We will keep her busy doing physical therapy & school (Riley style) while we hope she doesn't get hit too hard with side effects from this round. Tammy

Update 3/19: Update from Riley: Phoenix had an NG feeding tube placed last week & is now on some custom formula for nutrition. The reason for this is to help her pleural fluid dry up. The pleural effusion is very complicated, but has slowed over the last couple days. She is having some discomfort associated with being on liquid feeds & she is neutropenic, so now is the time to worry about fevers...but we haven't seen it yet. Phoenix's spirit is still strong & she continues to fight this fight. We still do not know when we may be able to come home. Again, I thank you all for your kind words and support. Tammy

Update 3/29: Update from Riley: still here. Phoenix vomited out her NG a few days ago & I requested a new form of nutrition due to her nausea, so she is on TPN (IV feeds). She spiked a fever & her cultures showed that she has a strep bacterial infection, which is being treated with antibiotics. She has needed transfusions of blood, platelets, & antibodies. Today she will be having an echocardiogram to make sure the strep is not affecting her heart, which apparently it is known to do. She remains neutropenic, nauseous, & suffers from diarrhea & the fever. The good news is that her pleural effusion has slowed its output dramatically, & we may see the chest tube come out soon. Keep the positivity a flowin! Tammy

Update 3/29: Things are moving in a positive direction for Miss Phoenix. She has been put on a low fat diet today & if the food does not increase her chest fluid output, the tube will be removed this week! Her nutrition & this chest tube are the only issues keeping us here. We start a new chapter of treatment this Thursday, with a spinal injection...& then we have to come to clinic every Thursday. As long as she stays healthy we will only be here once a week!! It feels so good to see a light peaking thru the clouds.

Update 4/05: Chest Tube is out! Now, if all goes well with her Spinal tomorrow, it is likely that Phoenix can come home! Its been a long hard two months, but here we are. Very excited, what a great Easter it will be!

The Grand Line was recently in Southern Indiana where we were presenting Area Conferences. This is a slide show put together by Wm. Dirk Rader of St. John's Lodge # 20. It shows our trip to Henryville Indiana where the Tornadoes came through last week. The young man with the sling is a state trooper, and a Brother, who was standing on the second step from the top of his basement stairs when the tornado literally wiped his house away. He ended up in the basement under the large Oak tree you see laying across what is left of the basement.

Local Lodges got together and very quickly donated a couple thousand dollars and the Grand Lodge and officers were there to help as well. Stay with it until about 8 minutes 30 seconds or so when you hear a second song. It is called the Masonic Ring by Howie Damron. It is one of my favorites. You will see what is left of Brother Wimp's house and his parents' house next door. You will also see an aerial shot of the school which the staff evacuated minutes before the storm hit it. Gutsy call to leave a building like that one but it was the right thing to do.

The same afternoon we were there, a Brother from way up North near South Bend showed up with a truck full of supplies donated by the Brothers in the NW corner of the state.

We all went to the Lodge building after the state police escorted us in to the city. The Grand Master opened a Lodge and we all gathered around the altar and thanked God that no more damage was done. Brethren,

Most of you have learned of the recent rash of tornados to hit southern Indiana. The Grand Lodge office has had several inquiries regarding ways to help with the recovery efforts. We have been in contact with two different Worshipful Masters regarding damages. The Worshipful Master of Grandview #161, WB Ira David Bevins reported that the front awning roof of their building was heavily damaged, and the building is unsafe to enter at this time. WM Bevins was not aware of any injuries, and no other serious damage in Grandview, Indiana. Their insurance company has been contacted and will help them deal with the damage.

The Worshipful Master of Henryville Lodge #651, WB Jerry Wayne Zollman, Jr. has informed us of their current situation. The lodge building escaped with minor damage, a few broken windows and some minor roof damage, which is also covered by insurance. The Masonry structure still has electricity, heat and water. WM Zollman has informed us that some members had some home damage, and one brother had serious injuries. WM Zollman has been in contact with the Red Cross and the local township authorities in his area, and has offered the use of the lodge hall as a possible shelter or distribution center. He was told that there are facilities close by to act as shelters for displaced residents as well as adequate food necessities flowing in. The lodge hall may likely become a distribution center in the coming days. WM Zollman will let us know if and what we all can do to help with their tragic situation in a couple of days as disaster relief plans are implemented. He cautions that physical help and supplies should not simply come to the community, since professional disaster relief people are on the scene and will likely turn such aid away. This office will send out further updates as information comes available. You can contact Worshipful Master Zollman at jjzollman@insight.com or by telephone at (812) 569-7814 if you wish to discuss assistance with him. Money donations will likely be the best help at this time. Monetary donations can be made through the Grand Lodge Web Site under the Contributions heading followed by Disaster Relief. 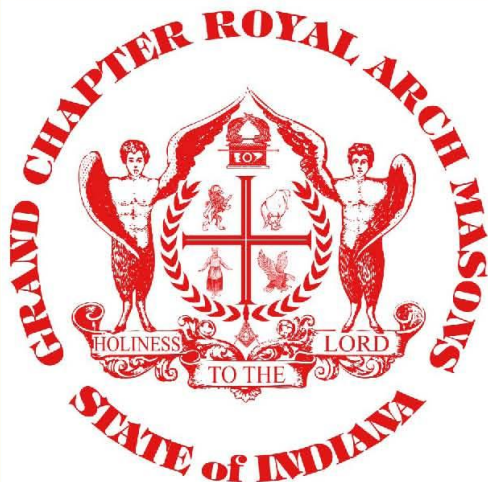

In the Grand Commandery of Ohio, he has served as the Grand Prelate (Chaplain) or the Associate Grand Prelate for many years since 1985 and was the Grand Chaplain for the Grand Council Royal and Select Masons in 1997. Duane began his association with Freemasonry in Carey Chapter, Order of DeMolay, served as a state officer with the Ohio State Council, and continues as an adult leader by serving as the Director of Education and Training for Ohio DeMolay and as an Active Member of the International Supreme Council.



No other artist in history has contributed more to creating new directions for music than Howie Damron. At the early age of 8 years old a passion for the guitar and singing started in the hills of Southern Ohio. His infatuation with music had him practicing as much as eight hours a day. His first standing ovation was in front of 500 people at the age of 10 at a political rally at his elementary school. He could never learn to read music or follow a music sheet because in the late 60's and early 70's little was recognized or known about Dyslexia. Howie says "I always knew something was wrong but I didn't know how to combat it so I found that music somehow helped me build my self esteem and I used it for my own self found therapy" By the time he was 16 he was being sneaked in the back door of a Huntington, West Virginia night club to sing on stage. They would lock the door because he was under age. His mother said "if I would have known it I would have wore him out". His music career was off and running. Performing everywhere there was a crowd including the W.Va. Ski Resorts. His dad saved up the money to take him to Nashville where he was able to meet some great people and started recording a couple of songs. He was heard by a World Class Talent Agency and on the road he went. His dad stepped in and took over as road manager and the fun and the real career started. Howie's dad was a long time Master Mason who sat Howie down and explained the importance of considering Freemasonry. He joined. They along with a 5 piece band traveled all over the country together making memories that would last for a lifetime. In most every town his Dad would find the local lodge and invite the brethren to the shows. Often he and his Dad would perform in their lodges and at Masonic Functions. Howie worked with over 200 Major Nashville artists in those years and ended up as one of the hottest acts in Las Vegas. It started taking a major toll on him from 5 shows per night and 7 days a week. After he'd go on for years he called his dad into his room and said "I'm through, I've become a puppet of the business and I've lost my creativity and that's why I started in the first place. I've completely forgot that I love my music". His dad said "Let's go home". Over those years he had become friends and worked for many years with the late great legend Johnny Paycheck. During his rest he wrote the song "The Masonic Ring" from a personal experience that soon became the Masonic Anthem. A whole new career and mission began. His awards are endless and his perseverance and personality is magnetic. He's a true role model for today's youth and a representative of why we should all love and respect the very gift of life.

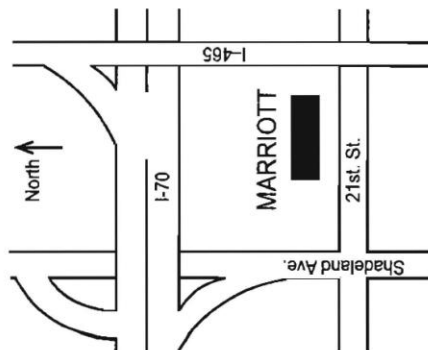
