**Update 6/19:** Hello everyone! Phoenix is doing very well this past month or so. She is feeling pretty good. She is active and happy for the most part. She is entering into a short recovery period, which will give her a bit of a break from the intense chemo treatments. She will begin Direct Cranial Radiation sometime soon, and that will be a ten day process. We are hoping it will not be severely taxing on her. We are grateful for the progress she has made, and I was feeling blessed to share Fathers day with my baby! Thank you all for being concerned still and for being strong enough to continue your prayers during these long treatments. It is making a difference and so far the summer has been good to her! She has a long road, and it has ups and downs, but our destination is recovery and we will keep moving until we find ourselves there! John

<u>Update 7/2:</u> Phoenix was able to get started on her oral (at home) chemo on Friday, which means her body has finally recovered from the last round of infused chemo, so yay for that. We are going to visit University Hospital tomorrow morning for a consultation and exam with her radiation doctor and team. After the holiday she will undergo 2 weeks of cranial radiation, to attack any cancer that may have entered her brain during her initial bleeds back in October. She is still feeling great and enjoying summer! We have had the pleasure of visiting with many of you over the past month, and it has SO rejuvenated our spirits! We love you all.

**Update 7/10:** Our little girl begins her Direct Cranial Radiation this morning. She must undergo direct radiation to her brain and her yes for 12 days. Please, if you can spare them, send your prayers over the next couple weeks. Pray that the side effects are minimal, pray that she feels good throughout, and most of all pray that this does its job and kills every last cancer cell hiding in these areas. Thank you for your love and support, we are at another turning point in Phoenix's recovery and we need you now. God Bless.

**Update 7/25:** Another milestone: Phoenix finished her radiation treatments today! She has been feeling well...playing, swimming, and being a 6 year old. I cannot express how blessed we feel to have escaped the long list of possible side effects so far. We are so thrilled to be back at home! Her next set of chemotherapy begins August 6th.

**Update 8/13:** Short update: Phoenix had her 2nd doses of chemo today (in this phase) & her doc said she looks great, given where she is at. She is neutropenic, so she is tired & moody, & we will have to watch her closely for infections. She will continue to be at home as long as she stays fever/pain free. We have enjoyed our summer & are so thankful for our time outside of the hospital. Please continue to pray for her as we head into the tough weeks ahead. Many thanks & much love to you all.

**Update 8/27:** Today Phoenix is getting her last doses of chemo, for this particular round. Her docs said that she is looking good, & all of her blood work was great today. She is scheduled to start a new chemo set next week, as long as her blood counts meet the criteria. We will be at Riley to begin this new set, as

it contains an 8 hour infusion, spinal tap, & a second, shorter infusion over 3 days. We appreciate your continued prayers & support more than you can imagine! Tammy
