Janet Kaminsky: Janet underwent a double epidural shot in the lower back to relieve her back pain. It seemed to help for about a week but she is now having more pain. They are going to give her one more shot this week in hopes that will help. If not, then she either has to live with the pain or have back surgery.

Update 6/23: Janet is trying a TENS unit to help relieve her pain. No luck.

Update 7/12: Janet fell out of bed this morning and was delirious. My daughters and I took her to the hospital where the primary diagnosis was dehydration and a bowel infection and she was admitted. She spent a week being filled with antibiotics and after many tests they concluded it was a virus in her intestines and that they were swollen. She was transferred to St. Mary's in Hobart for rehabilitation. She spent a week there and is now home. She can hardly walk and faces 6 weeks of out-patient physical therapy. She currently needs 24-hour care. My daughters have been a blessing helping with the cleaning, clothes washing and grocery shopping. Larry V

Update: 8/9: Brothers, Companions and Sir Knights, Greetings again. Well I am finally recovering from my fall and sort of able to use my arm, so though that I would give a status. On Sunday evening July 20th my son Brian was helping me locate a wire above my ceiling on my back porch to install a couple of outdoor fans. He was in the attic above the porch and I was on a 10 foot step ladder about half the way up it. My head and chest was above the ceiling and as I twisted to see the wire which he had located - the ladder went sideways and I went down about 10 feet and hit the concrete floor. My arms were below the ceiling and thus, I could not grab on to anything. Down I went. No give, no bounce. I was knocked out and my head bled a lot. Wanda and Brian called 911. I did not come to until the EMTs pulled into the hospital. I took 12 stitches on the back of my scalp and 2 in my arm. I fractured my right scapular or shoulder. No surgery was done. Found out later that I had broken the number seven rib on my back lower right side. Again no surgery was done. I spent 3 days in the Floyd Memorial hospital. Then went to rehab at Autumn Woods in New Albany. Finally I asked to be released to recover and do therapy at home. I went home on Saturday August 2nd. I still cannot lay on my right or left side. Have trouble getting out of bed, ---the twisting motion. But that is now getting better. I'm going to try to make Church tomorrow, and hopefully Council meeting Monday evening. Can't drive yet, but Doctor sat I can whenever I feel that I can. Hope to go in our pool this coming week, temps to be in the 90's. I got the stitches removed Thursday and things seem to be healing pretty well. Go to see the Doctor again in 4 weeks. Still moving slowly, not moving my right arm too much. Could not draw sword or salute at this time, but it is getting better. Thanks for all your prayers, cards, calls and thoughts. Hope all else is well, also, I hear that Terry Smith is recovering and doing well after his by past surgery this last week. Thanks to Jim Adamson, who sent out the report on him. Update 8/29: Don is home resting.

Update 8/30: Don went back into the hospital with severe hip pain.

Update 9/1: Don was released and is now home.

Update 9/11: Here is where we are now. Saw Dr. Paprosky from Rush yesterday. He confirms hip has moved; will have to be replaced. Not sure why? Will do blood work in 10 days to see if there is infection. If not he is recommending another Doctor to do surgery. He can't do it till Dec. 3rd or Jan. 27th. TOO LONG. We see Dr. Levine on the 30th; surgery tentatively Oct. 9th at Rush in Chicago. If there is infection, it's a whole new ball game! We won't go into that till we know. By the way the fused ankle is doing well. **Update 9/30:** Don update: Surgery Oct.16th to take out this hip and put in a spacer. Then 8 weeks with the spacer; 6weeks on anti-biotic, 2 off. If everything looks good, new hip goes in then; which would be 2 weeks before Christmas. Got to get lots of protein in him! Mickey.

<u>Peter Zivanovich, KCT, PGC</u>: I received a call from Pete telling me that he had a heart attack and was in a rehabilitation center in Boynton Beach. He is doing better and expects to go home on Labor Day. Please keep Pete in your prayers.

Terry Smith, PMIGM: I met with my surgeon today and he cut me loose to go back to work. I can't lift over 40 lbs. but all is clear now and he says I'm doing really well. Thank you all for the prayers and cards. They really made my day. Terry

Jim Crawford: I have been released to home therapy now that my femur has knitted back together. It has been a LONG seven weeks. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the brothers who visited or contacted me thru this period. Your thoughts and actions have been greatly appreciated by me! I am heading home to Alabama tomorrow, but looking forward to Lodge on October the 28th.

Keith Stiner: 9/8: , I have been having migraine headaches for years where 1/2 my body goes numb and sometimes can't see - all black, sometimes I just see part of what I'm looking at, then after numbness goes away a very bad headache. I put a call in to my doctor. I'm fairly certain that I'm having Mini Strokes (TIAs). Waiting for the nurse to check with him and call back.

Update 9/15: Well, kind of good news, my MRI came back normal! No sign of strokes. I still don't know what's going on but at least I know what it isn't.

Kris Kimmel: Well, my wounds are as healed as they are going to get. I've been released to experiment with different pressure offloading tactics, provided that I'm only putting pressure on the wounded area for a maximum of three hours before totally offloading the weight for one hour. Tomorrow, we are going to try three hours up, a recline for an hour to offload the weight, then back up for a few hours before going back to bed. It's all about capillary refill. I'm never going to be able to sit up as long as I once did, so we are going to try to experiment and find out what my body can handle so we can find the "new normal" and get on with life. Thanks for all the prayers and well wishes.

III. Brother Bill Gloye: Brothers all: Bill has given me his permission to pass along the following information regarding his health, and it saddens me to report the following: For the past month or so, Bill has experienced light headedness. He saw doctor who treated him for vertigo. That didn't work, and in the interim, he lacked energy, and has lost some weight. At our September luncheon, he helped me at the registration table, wasn't feeling well, and left before lunch. He went to a doctor yesterday, and after a brief conversation, the doctor sent him to Community North. Last evening they ran some tests (MRI / Cat scans, blood work-up, etc). His son phoned me while I was at Chorus on Monday evening to say that Bill had brain cancer. Today, doctors confirmed that he has cancer (stage 4) in his brain, kidneys, liver, lymph nodes and colon.
