Sickness & Distress:

Phoenix Bridegroom: Battles PreB ALL, original diagnosis 10-24-11 and relapse 10-21-14. To be clear: Phoenix has relapsed, meaning, her cancer is back.

Update 3/1: Phoenix woke up feeling good today and has been playing with her new dolls. We were so happy that Grandma spent a couple nights with us and we miss her already. With all the smiles you get to see from Miss Phoenix, it is hard to believe that she is hooked up to so many medicines each day...enough to require a double IV pole, which has to go everywhere she



goes...even to the bathroom. It makes moving around quite complicated. Today she is receiving vancomycin, cefepime, morphine, naproxen, cyclosporine, methotrexate (last dose ever), formula for her feeding tube, and potassium chloride and dextrose as fluids. She has additional oral meds (for realz). My prayer requests for today are for Phoenix to continue to feel good, to not need to throw up, to begin to eat, and for those new cells to engraft without complications. Thank you all for continuing to follow our journey!

Update 3/2: This photo shows you how "school" happens in the hospital. One of the teachers, Heather, reads with Phoenix from her class's textbook, in our room. It makes my heart so happy to hear her read. After school and physical therapy, Phoenix needed an IVIG infusion today, which is another immune system boost. Her doctors talked to her about trying to eat again, & she said she would start thinking about it. They told her they were SO proud of how hard she works at doing everything they ask of her.

Update 3/3: Phoenix is still chugging along, trying to make some neutrophils (new white blood cells), mostly without any excitement, which we prefer! Last night she spiked a fever. When a child with no ANC (absolute neutrophil count) gets a fever, blood cultures must be drawn from the central line and directly from a vein. Because she is asymptomatic and already on 2 antibiotics, we believe it was just a reaction to the IVIG infusion. Of course the blood cultures were done to be on the safe side. Phoenix's mouth sores have completely healed and the pain from her surgery has subsided, so she is being weaned from her morphine drip over the next few days. This is definitely progress. Today her NG feeds were turned off for a few hours with the hope that she may begin to feel hungry...and want to eat. She did try a few bites of pudding today, to make me happy (to make me shut up) but really wasn't feeling it. So we will try again tomorrow! We thank you all for continuing to carry us through this with your prayers.

Update 3/3: It has been 2 weeks since Phoenix's bone marrow transplant, and today Dr. Delgado and physician assistant, Nicole, came into our room with giant smiles, to tell us that Phoenix has some white blood cells! They are monocytes (baby neutrophils) and only about 20 could be seen (we need over 1,000) but this is how engraftment begins. We will continue to be patient, as these cells take time, but we know this is very good news. We know this is answered prayer...so keep them coming! One of the fantastic programs that Riley Hospital has to offer is music therapy, which Phoenix requested as soon as we were admitted. The therapist was able to visit this week and brought Phoenix a bunch of instruments, including this keyboard that she gets to keep in her room as long as she is here. As you can see in this photo, she thinks it is pretty cool.



Update 3/5: Phoenix's day in a nut shell: some puking, school time, modge podge, music therapy, physical therapy, (bites of) mashed potatoes, (bites of) ice cream sundae with sprinkles, playroom time, and The Sound of Music. ANC (absolute neutrophil count) is up to 75, so yay! We are so thankful for all of your support on this page...it really helps us feel MUCH less isolated from the world. You guys rock!

Update 3/7: Happy Friday friends and family! Today, Phoenix's white blood cell count is 400, and absolute neutrophil count is 150! Her body is working hard and we are just thrilled with the continued improvement.

Update 3/8: White Blood Cell Count: 1,100; Absolute Neutrophil Count: 540; In the photo: Crafts keep us busy... & Katie, one of the best nurses in the world, is solely responsible for Phoenix's obsession with "The Sound of Music", which we've literally watched 187 times. (Not really.)

Update 3/9: Today Phoenix got rid of her feeding tube and has been free of her IV pole all day! Her white blood cell count has reached 2,200 & her ANC is up to 836. The test for donor vs. patient cells has been sent out. Due to the fabulous blood counts, the doctors have declared "engraftment" a success. We cannot begin to express the happiness/relief/hope/thankfulness that we are feeling! God has truly blessed us. In the photos below, you can see how happy Phoenix is to be free of all the lines. Her doctor

dubbed her mood as "heroic" for making such amazing progress. And when I returned to the floor after getting food, I found Miss Phoenix working at the nurse's station!

Update 3/10: Phoenix is still doing great. We had a meeting today to learn about our discharge goals! Phoenix needs to be able to eat & drink more... most importantly to keep her kidneys in good health. So for now we will work on her intake & keep her on IV fluids at night. We are getting close, so keep the prayers a comin'!

Update 3/11: Today there is a great contrast between outside the hospital and inside our room. Phoenix has a fever today that began around 1am. It is getting as high as 103 and not going below 101 with Tylenol. Of course blood cultures have been taken to look for any infection...and we will be testing her stool to see if a certain antibiotic could have caused CDiff, or an intestinal bacterial issue. The good news for today is that Phoenix's labs are showing that her bone marrow is now making white cells, neutrophils, red cells, and platelets on its own...another positive milestone in her recovery. Please keep her in your thoughts and prayers so that she may kick this fever and get back to feeling good. Your love is very much appreciated!

Update 3/12: Phoenix's fever has gone down this afternoon (hallelujah). We received word from the lab at 4am that she tested positive for CDIFF. Although this is not a pleasant diagnosis, we are happy to know the cause of the fever/vomiting/diarrhea. She has started an oral antibiotic to treat it. She had some very low blood pressures overnight, which required extra fluid boluses, and now her electrolytes are depleted from the fluids. So, today has been all about IV infusions of magnesium, potassium, and sodium bicarbonate. Although she is exhausted, she was able to do music therapy and physical therapy.

Update 3/13: Friday the 13th update: Phoenix still has a fever, but not as bad as yesterday. The doc has switched most of her meds back to IV, as she is not absorbing much through her gut. She's in pull-ups and using the restroom frequently and puke-y. She describes it as feeling "blechhh". She is receiving a blood transfusion now, as her hemoglobin has been 7.1 for a few days... And with a headache & no energy, the doc thought it may help. Even with all of this, the docs still consider Phoenix "on her way out" of the hospital. The big picture is the transplant, and her bone marrow is still performing perfectly. Dr. Goebel just said once the new antibiotic has had a couple days to work (on the CDIFF), she'll be back to fantastic.

Update 3/16: Phoenix is still working very hard at getting out of this hospital. Physical therapy brought a stationary bike as a fun way to get some extra exercise while she is confined to her room. She still spends most of the day in bed, but making new cells and fighting c-diff is tough work. She is back to oral meds vs. IV, and her IV fluids will be weaned over the next couple days AGAIN in hopes of stirring up an appetite or thirst. One day at a time, always moving forward. I would like to thank you all for the amazing cards, gifts, and financial support that continue to roll in. There are not enough words to express our gratitude. It is overwhelming to see how much the world loves Phoenix! God Bless.

Update 3/17: Happy St. Patrick's Day! Start celebrating now because we just received the best news ever... Phoenix's donor test just came back, & she is 99% donor cells, which is the best possible outcome! Hallelujah! Prayers answered. Miracle granted. Thank you all for being a part of this. We have a long road ahead, but these BIG victories will make it all bearable. Phoenix is celebrating by playing some beach volleyball in her room

Update 3/18: Phoenix is working hard on eating & drinking so she can break free soon... stay tuned for more details... Lol. Prayers shall continue for overall health, wellness, & happiness.

Update 3/20: Phoenix is feeling good today & has not needed anymore oxygen! She had her therapists cracking up today and I overheard "Phoenix, it makes my day when you feel like yourself!" (Referring to her super Phoenix-y sarcasm & humor of course.) I totally agree. She can be free of her IV pole during the day, while she eats macaroni & rocks out with her iTunes... And has her TPN (IV nutrition)



helping out at night. You all are doing a fantastic job carrying us through each hiccup with your prayers & support... so today and through the weekend I request that you pray for continued health and our release to Ronald McDonald House on Monday!

Update 3/23: After 39 days inpatient, Phoenix walked out of the hospital this afternoon and into our apartment at the Ronald McDonald House of Indiana. She said, "This is the best day of my life!" and I totally agree. Tears of relief and thankfulness and happiness and exhaustion are flowing today. This is a real big deal. Thank you, God for answering our prayers. Thank you, friends and family, for including us in your prayers and thoughts, and helping us reach this tremendous milestone.



Update 3/23: I would like to take a moment and Thank the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, for their INCREDIBLY GENEROUS donation to our daughter Phoenix. Their Almoners Fund, which was used for this donation, has helped countless families in need, and we are very blessed that we are one such family. Thank you all, I can never repay the kindness this Fraternity has shown my family, but I promise I will try. John

Update 3/27: Phoenix has had 3 visits to the Riley Outpatient Clinic this week while we focused on getting her cyclosporine (transplant med) level just right. This kind of close monitoring is exactly why we need to stay nearby, at the RM House apartment. She is doing fantastic and her food & drink intake is improving. We have settled in to our new place and are so

thankful for the peace that personal space brings. We have a kitchen of our own which allows me to fix up all the things that Phoenix wants to eat. Thank you for keeping our family in your prayers as we get closer to coming home for good!

Jim Dove, KCT, PGC: Just got home from family Doctor and he put me back on Steroids again for Lung problems, just what I need to keep putting on weight. Not bad enough I get Nuclear X-rays yesterday on heart, I get Lungs x-rayed today! Soon IU will glow at night? At least Bonnie can turn off night lights.

Update 4/1: Went to the VA Clinic this morning-spent 2 hours there-sent to ER in ambulance-5 hours there and they wanted to keep me overnight - only let me go if agreed to be wired up for a month. VA Doctor was excellent and concerned about my health and would not let me drive. Bad thing was, I was at the ER and my car was at the Clinic! How the heck do I get there to get to my car?

John Schwegman: had by-pass surgery and a heart valve replaced last Thursday. (John is a member of the Scottish Rite Chorus and also serves as our Tour Committee Chairman). He came through the surgery ok, and is presently in rehabilitation at: The Altenheim Health & Living, 3525 E. Hanna Ave, Indianapolis, IN 46237. I would guess that his stay there will be perhaps a week or two? John's home address is: John C. Schwegman, 223 Andrews Blvd E Dr, Plainfield, IN 46168. He will appreciate your prayers and cards to let him know he is in our thoughts. John D.

Marvin Bridgewater: I would like to let everyone know that Brother Marvin Bridgewater is currently in Floyd Memorial Hospital room 266. I just spoke with him he was having issues breathing and a tightness in his chest so he went to the hospital last night about 11:00 p.m. He said he is doing fine and was eating when I spoke with him. They have him on some meds now but the tests have not come back yet for them to confirm the cause yet. Let us keep Brother Marvin in our prayers.

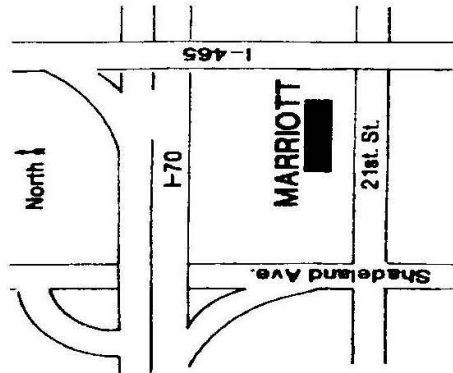

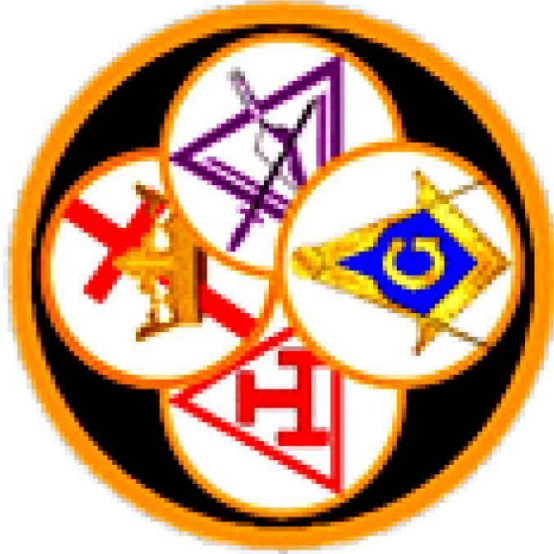
