Boston College Biologist Awarded \$65,000 Grant Knights Templar Eye Foundation to Study Parasite



From the
That Causes Blindness

Researchers seek to pinpoint mechanics of parasite division in Toxoplasma gondii


Chestnut Hill, Mass. (5/30/2019) – <u>Boston College</u> biologist Klemens Engelberg has been awarded a \$65,000 grant by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation to study Toxoplasma gondii, a parasite that infects nearly a third of the world's population and can complicate pregnancies and lead to eye disease and blindness.

The funding will support Engelberg's research into how the parasite, which inhabits human cells, divides to proliferate throughout its host, a process that damages and destroys cells and tissue, particularly in individuals

with compromised immune systems. Current treatments offer limited results in preventing mother to fetus transmission and can have unwanted side effects.

"We have identified a parasite-specific kinase, a protein switch that can either turn on or off certain processes in the parasite," said Engelberg. "Our work shows that this kinase is critically involved in cell division, a key aspect of Toxoplasma gondii virulence. Under this proposal we will dissect the processes that are controlled by this switch using CRISPR/Cas9 technology."

Engelberg said the goal is to pinpoint the role of the kinase in parasite division and to further identify the components the molecule regulates.



Sponsored by the Grand Encampment of the Knights Templar, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation works "to improve vision through research, education, and supporting access to care."

During a ceremony in May, Engelberg was presented with a check by Northeast Department Commander of the Knights Templar Stuart Drost, Grand Commander for Massachusetts/Rhode Island Mark Kay, and past Grand Commander Richard Van Doren, as well as his wife Nancy Van Doren, of the Knights' auxiliary organization, the Social Order of the Beauceant.

"During the year we raise funds throughout our organization to support research, so coming to BC offers us a chance to meet the people who are doing this work we support," said Drost. "This is a great opportunity for us, personally, and we're proud to represent the Knights Templar and the Knights Templar Eye Foundation." Engelberg is a researcher in the lab of Professor of Biology Marc-Jan Gubbels, who said the funding award not only supports research, but is an important step for a young researcher like Engelberg, who received his PhD from the University of Hamburg in his native Germany.

"This funding from the Knights Templar Eye Foundation gives a researcher like Klemens at this stage in his career a track record of obtaining independent funding. That is important for him. It also helps us do our research, which is the most important thing," Gubbels said.



This Month in History...

- 1307 William Tell shot an apple off his son's head with an arrow.
- 1731 In Philadelphia, Benjamin Franklin (with members of his Junto Club) opened the first US library. Plans had begun in earnest in July, and Ben retired as the Librarian in 1734.
- 1863 US President Lincoln delivered his Gettysburg address beginning "Four score & seven years ago..."

I am pleased to announce the first Indiana Grand Commandery Ritual Competition to be held at the Grand Conclave in Muncie, Indiana on Saturday, April 25th, 2020.

The competition is based on your command of the ritual for accuracy and delivery.

Three addresses in the Commandery Ritual have been chosen for this initial competition. 2019-2020 Grand Commandery Ritual Competition

Eligibility: Any member of any Constituent Commandery of Indiana is eligible (any card-carrying member). Any Sir Knight can participate in one or all of the categories chosen this year. You do not have to hold that or any office in your Commandery.

Judging: Judging will consist of 3 judges. There will be 2 judges for the accuracy and 1 for the delivery.

The ritual judges will follow the ritual and score for accuracy (wording MUST be exactly as in the ritual, word for word).

Deductions as follows:

1 point off for each missed/added word.

10 points off for each time a prompt is requested by the competitor. Prompts will ONLY be given by request from the competitor.

The delivery judge will score the competitor on the manner in which the Sir Knight exemplifies the work, makes eye contact with the "candidate", remains calm and makes proper use of the props, etc. The final score cards will be totaled by the Audit Committee. The Audit Committee's ruling will be final.

Each competitor will be allowed to give the lecture to a "candidate", but this is not required. If used, the "candidate" MUST be a Sir Knight. Any help or signage from this Sir Knight will result in a 50-point deduction.

The Junior Warden MUST be in Full Templar uniform and have any needed props.

The Prelate MUST be in Full Regalia OR Full Templar uniform together with all props (i.e., Bible, Cross, etc.)

The Ode to the Skull must be in Full Templar uniform or appropriate ceremonial costume.

Scoring is similar to Drill Competition. A base of 1000 points is the starting point for the competition. In case of a tie the following method will be used to break it:

Ritual Work – 1st tie breaker

Delivery Work - 2nd tie breaker

Competitors will be placed in 15-minute blocks. Each competitor will be notified of his time slot via mail or e-mail by April 21, 2020 If a competitor is participating in the Drill Competition this will be considered in placing his time slot for the Ritual Competition.
