Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Sir Knight Thornley was born December 21, 1924, in Meyersdale, Pennsylvania. He attended Carnegie Institute of Technology before the War, and went to Colorado in1946 to attend the Colorado School of Mines. He has three children: Elizabeth (Mrs. William H. Koon, II), William III and Robert. His wife, Shirley Jane, died in September, 1991.

A Registered Professional Engineer, Sir Knight Thornley is a consulting Materials Engineer. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers, a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, American Institute of Mining Engineers, Society of American Military Engineers, U.S. Committee for Large Dams, International Committee for Soil Mechanics and Foundation Engineering and the American Society for Testing Materials.

A veteran of World War II, he served with the 90th Infantry Division in Europe, where he was wounded and decorated for gallantry in action four times. He holds four campaign stars and an arrowhead for the invasion of Normandy. He is a member of Christ Church, Episcopal.





Having the opportunity to further his education, the family moved to West Lafayette in 1972 where he obtained a Master's Degree. Over the next ten-year period, the family alternately lived in Columbus and West Lafayette while Ron continued to work for Arvin. During that period he served on the Purdue School of Science Alumni Association advisory board. Gail joined the Rainbow for Girls and was installed as Worthy Advisor. In order to attend the ceremony, Ron was Raised a Master Mason in Octagon Lodge No. 511 in December 1984. While in Tippecanoe County he served as Worshipful Master, High Priest, Illustrious Master of Lafayette York Rite Bodies and Governor of Sagamore Valley York Rite College receiving the Order of the Purple Cross at Houston, TX. In 1986, he received the Degrees of the Scottish Rite and served as the 1st Vice President of the Bell-Jenner Class. Many times he was installed as Worthy Patron of West Lafayette Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star and was a Grand Usher for the Grand Chapter. For his service, West Lafayette Lodge No. 724 made him an honorary member. During that time period, he also received the Grand Cross of Color from the Rainbow for Girls.

After transferring back to Columbus, he served as Eminent Commander of Columbus Commandery No. 14. During his Masonic career he has become a member of the AMD (receiving the Red Branch of En), High Twelve, Yeoman of York, Order of the Eastern Star (Clifford Chapter No. 587), KYCH, Camon Lodge No. 343 (dual member) and HRAKTP. He progressed through the officer line of Bartholomew Council No. 295 and became the Sovereign Master in 1966.

He was appointed as Grand Warder of the Grand Commandery in 1998 and has successively served as Grand Sword Bearer, Grand Standard Bearer, Grand Captain General, Grand Generalissimo and Deputy Grand Commander. He was instrumental in designing, building and maintaining the Nativity at the Indiana Masonic Home during the Christmas season. Two years ago, he was appointed as the Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Washington near Indiana. Within the past year, he has been made an honorary member of the Grand Commanderies of Illinois, Kentucky, Ohio, Michigan and West Virginia. He has also been honored to recently receive the DeMolay Legion of Honor, Knight of the York Grand Cross of Honor, and the Knight Commander of the Temple.

As my term draws to a close, it is my pleasure to share some of the experiences of this Grand Commandery for the past year.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES

To The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

The market value of the Permanent Fund of the Grand Commandery as of the latest available report is \$290,795.99 as compared with a value of \$256,695.40 one year ago. This value reflects some improvement in market conditions that have affected almost all equity investments in the recent past as well as some additional contributions to the fund. There has been a strengthening of the market that we hope will be sustainable in the months ahead.

It would appear that some withdrawal of income from the Permanent Fund may be necessary fur the year 2004-05 in order to fund the purchase and upgrade of the computer equipment in the Grand Recorder's office. It is the opinion of the Trustees that an adequate amount of accumulated income is available and we do approve this withdrawal as proposed by the Finance Committee.

The Life Membership Fund continues to be invested in Certificates of Deposit and since we have been investing in laddered maturities, the average rates of return are still higher than current rates. Some improvement in CD rates may be seen in the coming months depending upon the strength of the economy. The Trustees will continue to monitor and assess the situation in the coming months.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 2004

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments -the organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the this standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

The legislation is as follows:

The appointed Officers of the West shall wear, the highest ranking uniform he has earned as a Sir Knight. This is to include the shoulder boards and jewel provided by the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana.

In most cases this will be a Past Commanders uniform, with the provided shoulder boards and jewel of each appointed station of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana. Please let me remind this Grand Commandery that this legislation has passed, it is law, not a suggestion.

Whereas Section 241 of the Grand Encampment Statuses states that the emblem to be used or worn on the uniform of the Officers and Members of the Grand Encampment, Grand Commanderies, Subordinate and Constituent Commanderies to denote the rank of such person in the Order shall be as follows:

- (c) For Past Grand Commanders and the Officers of Grand Commanderies, the Templar Cross, which is the Cross Patee' with straight line.
- (d) For Past Commanders, Commanders, Generalissimos, and Captain Generals of Subordinate and Constituent Commanderies, the shoulder straps hereinafter described and specified.
- (e) For members of Subordinate and Constituent Commanderies, the red Passion Cross.

Therefore be it resolved that for all Officers of the Grand Commandery of Indiana to be in compliance with Grand Encampment Regulations, this Grand Commandery will furnish and equip the appointed officers in the West with the proper Rosette, Collar, Sleeve Crosses, Jewel of office and Shoulder Boards

required.

All such items, as property of this Grand Commandery, will be returned to the Grand Commandery upon completion of the appointed officer's assignment by the Sir Knight or his estate.

REPORT OF THE SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana.

As early as 1847, Masons in southeast Indiana discussed the establishment of a Grand Encampment (later known as a Grand Commandery) for the Hoosier State. Over several years, many men worked diligently until it was finally authorized in 1854. In 2004, we thank the many Masonic pioneers, who had the foresight and wisdom to establish this Christian Order of Masonry in Indiana.

On August 12, 2000, a committee of Sir Knights Paul Friend, Robert Price, John Stevens, Jeff Conquest, and Duane Vaught met in Nashville Tennessee, to make initial plans for the sesquicentennial observation, then four years away. Committee members Duane Stucker and Pete Zivanovich were unable to attend. The following report is a result of plans made in the subsequent four years.

A historical book of the Grand Commandery of Indiana has been developed and edited by Sir Knight Bill Bissey with the guidance of the committee. It contains a historical summary of the Grand Commandery from its' inception, and includes a summary of the Past Grand Officers, Constituent Commandery growth, and other significant activities. The book is available at this Grand Conclave for the price of \$15.00.

A Grand Commandery Coat of Arms that was utilized by the Grand Commandery in its' early existence, has been reproduced into a badge. Duane Vaught was responsible to have the badge reproduced. Two kinds of badges were made including: 1) Numbered badges from 1 to 150; and 2) unnumbered badges. Constituent Commanderies had a first choice to order the number of their current Commandery and Past Grand Commanders and current Grand line officers had first choice to order the number of their sequence in serving as Grand Commander. Preordered badges will be distributed at this Grand Conclave. Additional badges can be purchased or ordered at this Grand Conclave, for the price of \$35.00 for numbered or \$25.00 for unnumbered, as long as the supply lasts.

Right Eminent Grand Commander George Ingles worked with Trinity Commandery #62 and Raper Commandery #1 to collect and exhibit items of historical interest for the 2004 Grand Conclave. Mike Moxley has assisted in assembling personal collections and/or Commandery artifacts. All attendees are urged to visit the displays.

As Chairman of the Committee, I want to thank the current committee for their commitment and resolve to plan and carry out the celebration of 150 years of the existence of Knights Templar in Indiana. I would hope that the Grand Commandery of Indiana will continue to flourish in Indiana, and that a similar event can be carried out in the year 2154.

End of 2003 (Amended Report-May 2004)

To: Officers and Members of Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana

This report on the lanyard cords includes all Knightings reported to the Grand Recorder by the Constituent Commanderies through December 31, 2003. We have 13 Knightings listed as unclaimed for 2003 that we do not have top line signers reported. These will remain unclaimed until we get notification for the recorders for their top line signers; therefore no cords could be issued pertaining to these sir knights. These sir knights are from the one day classes and have not been reported to the Grand Recorder. Battalion Commanders need to continue encouraging the Recorders of the Commanderies to provide TLS name and Knighting dates. All lanyard cords for year 2003 have been presented to the Battalion Commanders for distribution. There were 142 Knightings during 2003. In the 2003-2004 Templar year, the Long Range Planning Committee has taken on the project of developing a DVD that would be suitable for recruiting new members in the future. - 12. Reroute the inactive membership problem to the membership committee
- 13. Produce a video explaining Templary to prospective candidates
- 14. We need to get the under 40 crowd interested and keep them interested in Masonry.

Public Awareness and Membership committee reports in the Advanced Proceedings 2003 have ideas that pertain to these topics.

- 15. Work on projects at the local level
- 16. Shortened meetings-public?
- 17. Mentor new members- a project of Masonic Ed. Committee

General Order No. 1 Ingles

April 28, 2003

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. Each Commandery shall be inspected by its respective Battalion Commander, with the following exceptions. The designated primary Commandery of each Elected Grand Officer excluding the Grand Treasurer, and Grand Recorder, will be inspected by the Grand Inspector General. Other exceptions or substitutions may be made as authorized by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The Inspection shall consist of a report on the Commanderies' membership efforts, examination of the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery. No inspection shall be considered complete until the Commandery shall have participated in a Reception as described in paragraphs eight and nine below.
- 4. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander.
- 5. Each Inspecting Officer will send a Notice of Inspection courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder in advance of the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival, and request certain reports to be completed. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival. In addition, the Recorder will gather all Tactics and Rituals from the Officers and make them available for review by the Inspecting Officer.
- 6. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so may cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.
- 7. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Deputy Grand Commander, the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the Commandery inspected. A Full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given at the Annual Conclave.
- 8. Receptions: Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive the Commander, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Lines, Personal Inspection, form the Triangle and perform the Flag Ceremony. Those will have the addition of 50 points for a closed and 100 for a public reception to the activities score sheet for that Commandery. For Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the 50 or 100 points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work.
- 9. A Full Form Opening with subsequent Order shall be voluntary, and may be with other Commanderies as agreed to by the Battalion Commander. Those will have the addition of up to 200 points to the activities score sheet for that Commandery. For Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work.

- 10. The full form Opening and the conferring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent official interpretations thereof. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used.
- 11. To assist in the prophecy of the work, eight different instructional meetings throughout the State will be scheduled and conducted by the Battalion Commanders. Commanderies in attendance will receive additional points on the activity sheet on per officer and member attending bases. The Battalion Commander will schedule (2) two Battalion meetings for information and ritual instruction during the year.
- 12. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the visit. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to supply or provide any assistance that another Commandery may need. If an actual candidate is present the quality of the impression made upon such candidate shall be of prime importance.
- 13. Upon completion of each Reception, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first and then the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times if the Grand Commander is not present, then the Inspection Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Commander is present, he will be the final speaker unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance in which case the Grand Master will be the final speaker.
- 14. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion with the highest activity score. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 15. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

In 1977, The Grand Commandery of Indiana established an award known as the "Distinguished Service Award." This award may be presented by the Right Eminent Grand Commander upon the recommendation of the Commander and dais officers of a Constituent Commandery to a Sir Knight who has given outstanding, loyal, and devoted service to his Commandery. A Lady or non-member may also receive this award as a "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS."

Each Indiana Commandery may nominate two (2) Sir Knights and/or two (2) "Friends" per year upon the recommendation of its three dais officers. Nominations are made using the enclosed forms, and must be submitted to the Grand Commander no later than February 1, 2004. The cost of the jewel (about \$56.00 for Knights and \$25.00 for Friends) is billed to the Commandery presenting it. A certificate is furnished by the Grand Commandery. As an alternative to the jewel, a service bar may be secured at a cost of around \$10.00. Full details of the award can be found in Permanent Resolution No.3, page 30 of the Indiana Grand Laws. Further questions may be addressed to the Grand Commander or Grand Recorder.

Each Commandery is urged to take advantage of this opportunity to recognize outstanding service to Templary on a local basis. We have many Sir Knights who attend meetings, give a helping hand, do the little things in conferring the Orders, or support the activities of the officers year after year. Any Sir Knight is eligible and there are no restrictions other than that he is in good standing.

This General Order shall be read at the first Stated Conclave of each Constituent Commandery following its receipt and the fact so noted in the minutes.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD" was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977 at the 123rd Annual Conclave. It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- 2. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General will, acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 15 of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder and the Special Activities Committee to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery. Such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana," with the name of the recipient and date of the award engraved on the back. In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 7. The cost of the jewel, certificate and engraving shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. Each Commandery will be billed for the cost by the Grand Recorder.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS of the GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS" was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on April 25, 1998. It is to be awarded to a Friend who has given service to the Grand Commandery, or a Constituent Commandery of Indiana, above that which can be expected of a non-member. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General will, acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be made on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 15th of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commander may appoint the Grand Recorder and the Special Activities Committee to assist him in the selection of the recipients.
 - Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander to the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery each year. The names of the nominees to receive the Award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The award shall be limited to two (2) nominations from each Commandery in Indiana each year.
- 4. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the nominating Commandery. Such presentation to be at a Called Conclave and shall be open to the public, visitors and friends and be performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar Uniforms.
- 5. The award shall consist of a jewel with suitable fastener on back to be worn by a Lady or a lapel pin for a Gentleman. In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested to by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested to by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 6. The cost of the jewel and certificate shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. The Grand Recorder will bill each Commandery for the cost.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. The nomination form must be in the hands of the Grand Commander prior to February 1, 2003. Incomplete forms and those mailed after that date will not be considered. Your Commandery should consider those submitted previously but who did not receive the award at that time.

Grand Commander's "Christmas Message"

The Christmas season is a wonderful time of the year for Christians throughout the world, especially for the Knights Templar to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Christmas music often starts with the Thanksgiving celebration. Songs of Santa and his elves plus the reindeer make the young children and us older children grin from ear to ear. But there is another Christmas song that brings the real meaning of Christmas home to all of us. Silent Night is my favorite and this is the story of its birth.

It was Christmas Eve of 1818, in the old Austrian village of Oberndorf. Throughout the village, people were readying themselves for the much-anticipated Christmas Eve service at St. Nicholas Church and the beautiful music of the season. The children's choir had come to the church for rehearsal, but found the old organ had played its last note. Franz Gruber, the organist, and Father Joseph Mohr, the young priest was very upset, as there would be no beautiful organ music this Christmas Eve. The children returned to their homes very disappointed.

Father Mohr had always loved music. He earned his way through school by playing the guitar. As his small room in the house of the church sexton was stuffy, he opened his window for a breath of fresh air. The snow-covered valley lay silent under the stars. These were the same stars that had shone the night Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Father Mohr closed his window and sat down at his desk. He would try to write a little song that every child and adult would understand. He would tell how the shepherds watched over their flocks by night, the glorious light, and the angel who announced the birth of the Son of God. If he could write the song and have Franz Gruber compose a melody, it would save the Christmas Eve service. Father Mohr wrote six verses.

When he finished, he headed for the Gruber home. After being welcomed, downing some gingerbread and cider, Father Mohr read his words to Franz. After hearing the words, Franz smiled and said; "I will try".

The priest and the organist were waiting in St. Nicholas when the young singers arrived. He told them of the new song and gave them some instructions. "Herr Gruber and I will sing in harmony and you will join in on the last two lines:

'Schlafe in himmlischer Ruh. Schlafe in himmlischer Ruh.' Now listen."

Father Mohr played a few chords on his guitar. Then they began to sing: "Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht...." It was the first time *Silent Night* had ever been heard. The tenor voice of the priest carried the melody, and the organist's deep voice sang in harmony.

Soon it was time for the service to begin. The church filled with families from the village. They seemed puzzled. The candles were glowing, but no organ music. Before starting the service, Father Mohr explained what had happened. Then he announced that he had a surprise for them. Many people raised their eyebrows when they saw the guitar. After all, a guitar in church was unheard of.

However, Father Mohr's guitar had never sounded better and the melody of the new carol opened the hearts of young and old alike. At the end of the service, everyone said to Father Mohr and Herr Gruber to be sure to include their new carol next year, and that they all wanted to sing it.

And so my word of mouth, the new carol passed from village to village and soon from country to country. The authors were soon forgotten, but the song lived on and on.

Joseph Mohr and Franz Gruber gave the world one of its very best Christmas songs. Every Christmas in a special little chapel in Oberndorf, people of all races gather to hear *Silent Night* sung as it was for the first time so many years ago, by two voices accompanied by a simple guitar. This is their way to say thank you.

And so let us all keep Silent Night in our hearts as we attend church and sing praises to our Lord.

149th CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 149th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel East, Indianapolis. The Sir Knights of Elbert H. Gary Commandery No. 67, the home Commandery of the Right Eminent Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave.

The lines were formed by the Yeoman of York of Preceptories No. 1, 2 & 3 and under the direction of S.K. Robert Hobbs, Aide to the Grand Commander. Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S.K. Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., K.C.T., P.G.C. Inspecting officer was S.K. William Henry Thornley, Jr., Most Eminent Past Grand Master and personal representative of the Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America, William Jackson Jones. Also present was Grand Master Jones and Right Eminent Department Commander of the East Central Department of the Grand Encampment, S.K. Donald Estes and S.K. Willard R. Clutter, Jr., R.E. Department Commander for Subordinate Commanderies of the Grand Encampment. In addition, S.K. James S. DeMond, K.G.C., R.E. Past Department Commander; S.K. Robert E. Price, K.G.C., Honorary Past Department Commander; and S.K. R. Frank Williams, K.C.T., Honorary Past Department Commander were in attendance. S.K. Edgar McGonigal, Potentate of Murat Shrine; S.K. Robert G. Elrod, 33rd, Deputy for Indiana for the Supreme Council, 33rd, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction; and S.K. Roger Scott VanGorden, Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Indiana, were present and took an active part in all of the proceedings.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 39 were present, 7 absent, 3 excused and one position vacant. The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 186 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. Sir Knight Irvin L. Bitting, K.C.T., P.G.C. gave a eulogy for Ray G. Glick. K.C.T., G.P.E., who passed away one week before the Annual Conclave. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 239 for the year 2002 with 133 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Eye Foundation Committee reported a total of almost \$10,000 in contributions to the Voluntary Campaign has been received to date, which did not include a check from the Easter Star of Indiana for over \$4,300.00, presented at the Conclave. The Holy Land pilgrimage Committee report again showed that due to the unrest in the Middle East, the Grand Encampment canceled the 2003 pilgrimage. If all goes well this year, the hopes are that they will be able to again make the trip in 2004. The Educational Loan Foundation committee reported that 2 loan aggregating \$7,000.00 were made during the year and that total loans outstanding totaled \$77,259.39 at years end. There were 5 loans paid off last year totaling \$15,500.00.

The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was more successful that last year and a check for \$1,000.00 was given to the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee. Thirty-seven Sir Knights, Ladies and guests attended the Easter Sunrise Service in Washington, D.C., and the Indiana delegation, joined by a number of others, including the M.E. Grand Master, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least on delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

- 5. On or before OCTOBER 1, 2003 send the completed form to: S.K. R. Frank Williams, P.G.C.,F.G.P.,H.D.C. Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana. A letter supporting the Nomination may be submitted.
- 6. The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee of the Grand Commandery consisting of the Grand Prelate and Former Grand Prelates will receive, shortly after November 15, a copy of the Nomination forms along with a ballot. After prayerful consideration, having marked their ballot as to their selection, the ballots are tabulated and the decision rendered and announced.
- 7. Should a Minister nominated by your Commandery be selected, you will be notified. Grand Prelate's Easter Message

Ginny and I enjoy watching *Ancient Mysteries of the Bible* as well as other cable TV programs about the political and socio-economic conditions during the time of Jesus' ministry. To understand the man and his teachings, it is important to understand the world around him which makes his message even more striking.

Ancient history was not a peaceful time, perhaps not unlike our challenges of today. Kings and rulers either got their power and position through conquering others or held their position of power through oppression. When their power diminished, they lost their positions often through death at the hands of someone more powerful. The same fate met their faithful followers as well as many innocent people who just happened to be in the way when the conquering armies surged forward. In the minds of many, the "messiah" would be a warring king like David who would save them from the oppression of Rome, the country in charge at the time of Jesus.

Jesus' message was not one of war but of love. His message would work under any political system. It recognized the power of each individual to make humane choices on how to treat their neighbors regardless of their age, sex, religion, or national origin. The Bible's historians tell us many stories about the diversity of people with whom Jesus preached, ate, slept, and lived. This way of life was pretty radical and threatening to those in power. As his message began to gain acceptance, it also foretold his demise. We all know how the story ends as we approach Easter.

Few of us are called upon to give such a measure of devotion to our fellow man that results in such a stark ending. Yet how many of us are willing to stand up for what we believe within the challenges that face us in today's political and socio-economic conditions? One of Ginny's and my favorite pastimes is visiting bookstores. On a recent expedition we discovered a little book by Kent M. Keith called *Do It Anyway*. Kent's "Paradoxical Commandments" might well reflect a current message to strengthen the Christian commitment found within our Knight Templar work.

- 1. People are illogical, unreasonable, and self-centered. Love them anyway.
- 2. If you do good, people will accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives. *Do good anyway*.
- 3. If you are successful, you will win false friends and true enemies. Succeed anyway.
- 4. The good you do today will be forgotten tomorrow. *Do good anyway*.
- 5. Honesty and frankness make you vulnerable. *Be honest and frank anyway*.
- 6. The biggest men and women with the biggest ideas can be shot down by the smallest men and women with the smallest minds. *Think big anyway*.
- 7. People favor underdogs but follow only top dogs. Fight for a few underdogs anyway.
- 8. What you spend years building may be destroyed overnight. Build anyway.
- 9. People really need help but may attack you if you do help them. Help people anyway.
- 10. Give the world the best you have and you'll get kicked in the teeth. *Give the world the best you have anyway*.

Edict No. 1

Uniform

The Officers of the Grand Commandery of Indiana elected and appointed are the following: Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo, Grand Captain General, Grand Senior Warden, Grand Junior Warden, Grand Prelate, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Standard Bearer, Grand Sword Bearer, Grand Warder and Grand Sentinel. All other appointed officers are considered administrative officers of this Grand Commandery.

The Insignia of Rank and Shoulder Straps for the Officers of this Grand Commandery during their year of service will be the Templar Cross, which is the Cross Pateé with straight lines.

The Templar Dress Coat shall have on the point of the collar, one-half inch above the lapel seam and one-half inch from the outside edge of the collar, a one inch cross of appropriate rank. The sleeves to be finished with three buttons of cross and crown design on each cuff and with a cross 1 ½ to 2 inches in size appropriate to rank in the center of the sleeve measured from side to side.

The Chapeau shall have a rosette on the left side appropriate to rank.

Officers who are appointed to office for one year may elect to wear the uniform of his former rank, and as such may wear Passion Crosses placed, as listed above. In no instance shall he be authorized to mix the rank of a Grand Commandery Officer and a Subordinate Commandery Officer on the same uniform.

The voting sign of the Order shall be: when the Commander calls for the question, he shall call for the vote by requesting, all those in favor, EXTEND the Sword Arm. Those Sir Knights in favor will extend their Right Arm in front of their body parallel to the floor. The Commander will then command: Withdraw. Those Opposed, EXTEND the Bridal Arm. Those Sir Knights not in favor will extend their Left Arm in front of their body parallel to the floor. The Commander will then command: Withdraw. The Commander will then announce his decision based on his count.

The command is NOT RAISE the sword or bridle arm. The Hand is not elevated above the shoulder.

Where the Commander cannot see the count, he will call for a standing count of those voting.







ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg #2 - Charter date September 1853, one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from #2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin #2.

Cambridge City #6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery #6 was changed to Cambridge City #6. On April 30, 1884. this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford #7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker #9 - Organized April 4, 1866. Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown #9 on April 28, 1874,

Warsaw #10 - Chartered April 7, 1868. Merged with Goshen #50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch #14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus #14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling #16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute #16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora #17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929 Revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Marion #21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County #21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp #22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison #22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin #23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County #23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth #26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend #13.

Washington #33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes #20.

Cyrene #34 - Chartered May 2, 1891. Name changed to Columbia City #34 on May 9, 1947.

Columbia City #34 - Successor to Cyrene #34. Charter surrendered September 4, 1968.

Bluffton #38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne #4

Delphi #40 - Chartered February 4, 1897., Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette #3.

Princeton #46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette #15.

Rushville #49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville #6.

Mishawaka #51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend #13.

Winchester #53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie #18.

Sullivan #54 Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20,1979.

Martinsville #55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered December 1, 1932.

Gary #57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary #57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

Peru #60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash #37.

DeMolay #62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental #62 on May 12, 1941, Oriental #62 - Successor to DeMolay #62. At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental #62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity #62 but No record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity #62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge #717

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued May 9, 2000 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003

Lawrence Commandery #67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery #67 on April 23, 2003
