Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.



SIR KNIGHT LAWRENCE EUGENE TUCKER, PGC, KCT, KGC Right Eminent Grand Recorder

Sir Knight Lawrence E. Tucker, newly elected Right Eminent Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the USA, was born April 2, 1956, on Ladd Air Force Base near Fairbanks, Territory of Alaska. His father, William Joseph Rye Tucker, was an active Mason, and his mother, Sue Ann Hensley Tucker, is a Majority Member of Bartlesville Assembly, Order of the Rainbow for Girls.



GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 2007

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments -the organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the this standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

Last year the finance committee spent considerable time reviewing our financial condition and developing a plan for long term stability. This plan is composed of several parts.

The budget categories were reorganized to make that document more easily understood and provide greater flexibility in the day to day operations.

A resolution on Revenues last year allowed the per capita fees to be adjusted annually so that large changes can hopefully be avoided.

Based on the needs for the year 2007 - 2008, we propose that the per capita to be paid to the Grand Commandery next year be consistent with last year. We recommend the dues be \$8.50 per dues paying member not including the Grand Encampment and Knights Templar Eye Foundation assessments.

While it appears we have an excess budget, it should be noted that in recent years we have depleted our cash reserve in the checking account and when those funds become more in line with the reserve we need for the day to day operations of the Grand Commandery, the budget may be adjusted by this Grand Commandery during our Annual Conclave.

We believe that the adjustments we have made in the past year and this year, will place the Grand Commandery in a good sustainable position for the next several years.

TRUSTEES REPORT

During the past year the investments of your Grand Commandery have been reviewed and as the market had changed we attempted to maintain a growth pattern. Changes in our investments will be made as we diversify our Mutual Fund Holdings to maintain a greater income of our resources. The balance in the Permanent Fund of the Indiana Grand Commandery on March 1, 2007 was \$294,151.60. This was an increase of \$3,792.94 over last years balance.

We believe that it is very important to maintain the Permanent Fund and add to it when possible. We should not be dependent on the Fund to support our regular operational budget. It is hoped the present dues increase will stop the continued drain on the Fund, so that working capital can be developed for the building of membership in our Grand Commandery and other projects to aid in improving growth.

At the present time (March 15, 2007) we have over \$15,300.00 credited to Indiana in the Voluntary Campaign. For those who aren't familiar with our past contributions that is an excellent amount for this time in the campaign. However I will point out that over \$4,000.00 came from the Order of the Eastern Star and \$3,000.00 from a contribution from an estate at Bloomington Commandery picking up 100 new life sponsors for that Commandery.

REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT LAWRENCE E. TUCKER, RIGHT EMINENT GRAND RECORDER OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE OF RICHARD B. BALDWIN, GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Thank you, Right Eminent Grand Commander, Most Worshipful Grand Master and Sir Knights. It is a pleasure to be here and to follow your Right Eminent Department Commander. He covers everything so I don't have to, but there are a few things I do want to cover.

First, it is great to represent our Grand Master at this great Commandery and happy to be back with you again. I was here to celebrate your 150th anniversary and it is great to be here today. As I said earlier, my wife really works as an administrator for a rather large law firm in Houston. I'm sorry she cannot be with us but I'm happy she is home making money.

Several things have happened since we last met in Houston. The Grand Treasurer of the Grand Encampment forfeited his job and I'll be glad to discuss the details with any of you that are interested,

but not to consume time during the session. If you see me during the breaks I will be glad to discuss that with you.

The Eye Foundation is doing very well and I congratulate you, but I would urge you to assist us by informing your wife that there is an on-line shopping mall. You can go to the Grand Encampment web site where you will find a link to that shopping mall. And then somewhere between 3-5% of your purchases will go directly to the Eye Foundation. It's painless, simple and it's a great source of income for the Eye Foundation.

There will be some changes to our Knight Templar Magazine. I saw John (Fleming) earlier but I haven't had a chance to visit with him. The magazine has been given to our Grand Captain General to oversee so you will be seeing some changes over the next several issues.

With respect to our web site, it is under the direction of our Public Relations Committee, headed by Sir Knight Terry Clemens of Tennessee. Dan Pushee is doing a great job on the web site and I hope you are happy with his efforts.

And finally, with respect to per-capita, I would like for all Past Grand Commanders and the Dais Officers to stand. Sir Knights, these are your representatives, your voice in Grand Encampment and I would like to call this to your attention before I make my remarks. Please be seated.

We discussed this for two years at our Department meetings, about the need for a per-capita increase. In 1982, per-capita was raised to \$2.85 and in 1985 it was raised to \$3.30. There have been no increases in over 20 years. We have survived with fund raising efforts such as labels, cards, etc. The Sir Knights around the Encampment voiced their displeasure at those fundraising efforts, very loudly, and your delegates listened to them and voted to cease all fund raising activities. The final fund raising activity will come out in September, which will be the calendar. The reason for that is that the calendar brings in \$40-60,000 to the Grand Encampment that would not be realized had we not gone through with that one final phase. So for \$40-60,000 we thought we could take a little abuse on the fund raising for 1 more time. As of December 31, there will be no more fundraising through the offices of the Grand Encampment. Your voting delegates voted to get rid of the fundraising.

At the Department Conferences, the overwhelming consensus was to take the per-capita to somewhere between \$6 and \$12. It settled to \$9. The other request was that we raise it so that we don't have to raise it again for 15 years. We believe that is the case and don't anticipate a raise at all. And finally, that it be done at one time, rather than phasing it in. Those were the wishes of the voting delegates at the Triennial Session. We took a vote by show of hands and then by paper ballot and it passed in both cases. The increase will take effect on October 1, 2007 following the close of your fiscal year. I'll be glad to discuss it further with you at the close of the session or a break or whenever.

Right Eminent Grand Commander, it's been a pleasure being here. I thank you for all the hospitality you have shown me on my previous visits and now. I'm looking forward to drill on Saturday and I thank you Sir Knights.

MEMBERSHIP AND PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights:

The membership statistics for 2006 illustrates that Indiana had a decrease in membership of 12 members. On January 1, 2006 there were 4,746 members with 4,734 on December 31, 2006.

Our Right Eminent Grand Commander Rodney A. Mann set a goal of 300 Knightings for the year ending April 30, 2007. Through March 31, 205 Sir Knights have received their Order of the Temple. There is a class being held in Greenfield on April 14th that promises to be in excess of 50 new members.

On September 16, 2006 in Anderson, Indiana we held a Crusader Training School which was created to assist us in meeting our goal of 300 Knightings. There were 14 Sir Knights in attendance that are now schooled and ready for work. Information on the availability of these Knights to speak about the York Rite has been sent to all Commanderies in the state.

There were plans to have two Blue Lodge dinners to discuss the York Rite. Only one dinner took place and it resulted in a positive ending. That dinner was held in Grant County. Grant County has nine Blue Lodges and they were hoping to get two Master Masons from each Lodge. Due to bad weather, there were only seven Master Masons plus several Sir Knights and their Ladies. Of the seven Master Masons, three petitioned that night plus two more to be petitioned at a later date. This dinner was successful not only because of the new members but because it also inspired the existing Sir Knights of Grant County.

Between May 1, 2006 and December 20, 2006 there have been 123 new Knightings, eight reinstated and 20 affiliated for a total of 151.

The Membership Committee has been in pursuit of tabletops. We now have two that are in the hands of our Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, Andrew R. Jackson. We believe this will help us look more professional and help our image in public.

The Crusader Jacket Program resulted in several Sir Knights wearing the new jackets. If you are a top line signer on 5 petitions and they are knighted in the 2006-2007 year, you will receive the Crusader jacket. As of now, there are 11 Sir Knights that qualify:

General Order No. 1 Mann

May 2, 2006

Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 (473) and 852 (474) of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exceptions:
 - The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
 - A fellow Grand Line Officer will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand
 Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other
 exceptions or substitutions.
- 3. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officers upon his arrival.
- 4. The records Inspection shall consist of:
 - A report on the membership efforts.
 - Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
 - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
 - Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 5. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 6. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer. All inspections must be complete by December 15, 2006.
- 7. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Full Form Opening. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.
- 8. An Inspection may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies participating together for an official inspection, when approved by the Battalion Commander. Points for the inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has nine (9) or more of its members present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander).
- 9. The participating Commanderies will open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form in accordance with the most recent official interpretation of the Ritual and official Indiana Asylum Tactics.
 - A Commandery of Knights Templar shall be opened in Full Form with Rehearsal of Duties. Any of the three Orders may be then conferred for the Inspection. If the Order of the Red Cross or the Order of Malta is conferred the Commandery must suspend business on the Commandery and open a Council or Priory

- for the reception of candidates. When the Order of the Red Cross or the Order of Malta is completed the Council or Priory must be closed and business resumed in the Commandery.
- Upon completion of each inspection and prior to closing, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first, and then the Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official Representative, shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him, as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present, he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander will be the final speaker.
- Violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a no score for your inspection and thus require an additional inspection scheduled by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.
- 10. The participating Commanderies will exemplify the Full Ceremonial of one of the following Orders: Illustrious Order of the Red Cross, Order of Malta or Order of the Temple. Commanderies may separately or jointly confer the Ceremonies in accordance with one of the following options at the time and place with the consent of the Battalion Commander. The inspection of the Order may occur anytime after May 1, 2006 and prior to December 15, 2006.
 - A single Commandery may perform the Order for points as graded by the Order score sheet by the Battalion Commander and staff, if the majority of parts are filled by the inspected Commandery or Commanderies.
 - Same as above with the exception that up to three (3) Commanderies in the Battalion may participate with the points divided among the Commanderies based upon the level and percentage of participation.
 - An Instructional meeting may be held instead of any, or all, ritualistic work when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General, deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.
- 11. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report of each Commandery to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. A full report of the Inspections will be discussed at the winter meeting and presented for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.
- 12. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 13. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

14. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD" was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977 at the 123rd Annual Conclave. It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- 2. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General will, acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 1st of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana," with the name of the recipient and date of the award engraved on the back. In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 7. The cost of the jewel, certificate and engraving shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. Each Commandery will be billed for the cost by the Grand Recorder.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS of the

GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS" was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on April 25, 1998. It is to be awarded to a Friend who has given service to the Grand Commandery, or a Constituent Commandery of Indiana, above that which can be expected of a non-member. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General will, acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be made on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 1st of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commander may appoint the Grand Recorder and the Special Activities Committee to assist him in the selection of the recipients.
- 2. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The award shall be limited to two (2) nominations from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1998.
- 4. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the nominating Commandery, such presentation to be at a Called Conclave. Such presentation shall be open to the public, visitors and friends and be performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar Uniforms.
- 5. The award shall consist of a jewel with suitable fastener on back to be worn by a Lady or a lapel pin for a Gentleman. In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested to by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested to by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 6. The cost of the jewel and certificate shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. The Grand Recorder will bill each Commandery for the cost.

Knights Templar Cross of Honor

To The Officers and Members of the Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237.5 of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA, a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight of each Grand Commandery once each year.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. The nomination form must be in the hands of the Grand Commander prior to February 1, 2005. Incomplete forms and those received after that date <u>will not</u> be considered. Your Commandery should reconsider those Sir Knights who have been nominated previously, but who have never received the award.

152nd CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 152nd Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel East, Indianapolis.

The Sir Knights of Columbus Commandery 14, the home Commandery of the Right Eminent Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave. The lines were formed by Deputy Battalion Commanders, under the direction of S. K. George D. Kivett.

Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S. K. Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., K.C.T., P.G.C. and Harrison E. Lackey, H.P.G.C. Inspecting officer was S. K. Steven J. Barton, Right Eminent Department of the East Central Department and Personal Representative of S.K. Kenneth B. Fischer, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States of America. Also in attendance were S. K. Willard R. Clutter, Jr., R. E. Past Department Commander for Subordinate Commanderies of the Grand Encampment, S. K. K. Edwin Applegate, K.C.T., R. E. Past Department Commander; S. K. Robert E. Price, K.G.C., Honorary Past Department Commander; and S. K. R. Frank Williams, K.C.T., Honorary Past Department Commander. S. K. Robert G. Elrod, 33° Deputy for Indiana for the Supreme Council, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction; and S. K. James Barkdull, Deputy Grand Master representing the Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Indiana.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 37 were present, 6 were absent, and 7 were excused.

The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 162 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 298 for the year 2005 with 167 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Holy Land pilgrimage Committee reported that the 2005 pilgrimage went well. The Educational Loan Foundation Committee reported that 1 loan of \$3,000.00 was made during the year and that outstanding loans totaled \$43,528.99 at years end. There were 2 loans paid off last year totaling \$8,000.00.

The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and Richmond Commandery #8 received the award for selling the most ads.

Forty-Five Sir Knights, Ladies and guests attended the Easter Sunrise Service in Washington, D.C., and the Indiana delegation, joined by a number of others, including the M.E. Grand Master, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate except for No.'s 44 and 50. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Bulletin No. 3 Houston, Texas Triennial: August 11-16, 2006 Hyatt Regency Hotel, Houston

The sixty-third Triennial Conclave actually began around the 10th of August with many committee meetings taking place. On Friday the 12th, the drill Judges and Captains had their meetings. Early on Saturday morning, the class "A", "B" and "C" class drills were held at the George R. Brown Convention Center while the "D" class drills were held at the host hotel. I am very happy to announce that Raper Commandery No. 1 of Indianapolis won first place in the National "C" drill competition. Sir Knight George D. Kivett, HPGC, KCT, KCTH, Captain of the Raper team also was recognized as the Outstanding Drill Captain and was presented with a special sword signifying that honor. The first place team members were each presented with beautiful Grand Encampment watches. Also winning third place in the "C" Drill competition was Greenfield Commandery, Captained by Larry E. Gray, GGHP. In the "D" team competition, Rodney A. Mann, Grand Commander and Captain of the Baldwin team took home first place. That evening, the participants in the drill activities were invited to the Houston Shrine Center for a Texas Style Barbeque. Country music, dancing, great food and great fellowship went into the evening. Congratulations to all and thank you for participating and representing Indiana so well!

Sunday morning began with a short (but hot) parade to the hotel for Divine Services. A beautiful service was performed by the Grand Prelate of the Grand Encampment. That evening, a reception was held for Kenneth Bernard Fisher, Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States. It had various reception lines for the dignitaries as well as all the trappings that would accompany such a distinguished meeting.

The sixty-third Conclave began with the presentation and introduction of honored guests followed by a beautiful memorial service commemorating the loss of over 100 members of the Grand Encampment over this past triennium. After lunch, Grand Master Kenneth Bernard Fisher officially convened the session. The Most Eminent Grand Master then delivered his allocution. Koon, II, GCT, Grand Generalissimo, was elected Deputy Grand Master, David Dixon Goodwin, GCT, Grand Captain General was elected Grand Generalissimo and Sid C. Dorris, III, KCT, Southeastern Department Commander and Grand Master of Tennessee, was

elected as Grand Captain General. Lawrence E. Tucker was elected as Grand Recorder and William Jackson Jones, PGM; GT was elected to another term as Grand Treasurer.

Monday evening was set aside for the Indiana delegation to attend a state dinner. Arrangements were made by our Grand Commander at an excellent Italian restaurant. A good time was had by all.

Tuesday was to finish up miscellaneous business followed by the Official Grand Master's Banquet. A wonderful steak and chicken dinner was enjoyed while an Alpine band played many familiar German songs along with the appropriate yodeling!!! The highlight of the evening for us Indiana members was the surprise presentation of the Knight Grand Cross to our own T. Jeffrey Conquest, PGC. He was recently appointed a Trustee to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. Wednesday morning was set aside for the installation of the new Grand Encampment Officers.

Bulletin #4 Grand Commander's "Christmas Message"

The Gospels of Matthew and Luke record the events surrounding the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. The Gospel of Mark begins with John the Baptist preparing the way for Christ. Grand Prelate's Easter Message-2007 Life Now and Unto Eternity Matthew 28: 1-10

Sir Knight and Reverend Robert J. Cave, Right Eminent Grand Prelate of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States of America, presents the message below at the 77th Annual Easter Sunrise Memorial Service at the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia, on April 8, 2007.

A general invitation was extended by Most Eminent Grand Master, Richard B. Baldwin, to the Sir Knights and their families and friends to join the grand officers and their Brother Christian Masons at the traditional Easter Service. For those who are unable to attend the Easter ceremony in Alexandria or who wish to read the message in addition to being there, here we share it with you.

Back in the late 1800's, the great pulpit master, Charles Hadley Spurgeon, entered the chancel on Easter Sunday morning where an empty bird cage sat on the pulpit of the great Metropolitan Tabernacle where he preached. "Let me tell you about this bird cage," Spurgeon began his sermon. He said that he had been walking the streets of London the day before, deep in thought when he saw a young boy carrying an old, bent bird cage. Inside the cage was a tiny field sparrow. Spurgeon stopped the boy and asked him what he was going to do with the bird. "Well" said the boy, "I will play with it for a while, and when I am tired of playing with it, I will kill it". Spurgeon, having compassion for the bird, asked him how much he wanted to sell it to him. The boy responded, "You don't want this bird, mister. It is only a bleeding field sparrow." But when the lad saw that Spurgeon was serious, he said he could have him for two pounds. Two pounds was a great deal of money in those days, well over one hundred dollars today. Spurgeon paid the price and then opened the door and let the bird fly free. After Spurgeon recalled the story about the boy, the bird, and the empty cage; he said to his congregation: "That is what Christ has done for us." He said evil had caged us up, but Christ sacrificed himself to set us free.

This is what Easter is all about. Evil had caged humanity, but Christ sacrificed himself to set us free. And because of what Christ has done in his life, death, and resurrection; we are free for a new and glorious me now and into eternity, and we see this played out in the Jives of the first Christians. Because of this we, and all Christendom, have gathered the world around to celebrate Easter this morning.

After the Crucifixion we are told that Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea laid Jesus' body in the grave. It was a courageous act for, even though they had Pilate's permission. The religious leaders made it a risky thing to do. Nonetheless, they removed Jesus body from the cross, wrapped it in linens, and placed it in the tomb.

The women had been watching this and so, noting the location, they knew where to go to see the body on that first Easter morning. It was early in the morning, just after daybreak, that they went on their sad, sorrowful, agonizing journey. Going to the grave would just prolong their grief.

There are many modern parallels to this existential grief. Some years ago when Margaret Thatcher was Prime Minister of Britain a terrorist planted a bomb in a conference room where government meetings were held. The bomb exploded, and even though Margaret Thatcher survived the explosion, some cabinet members were killed.

Margaret Thatcher regularly attended Sunday morning worship, and so she went to church the following Sunday. However, that Sunday was different. As she sang the hymns, listened to the sermon, and looked at the stained glass windows; she began to weep. She wept because everything around her seemed to have changed because of the death of her friends. All that was family had now changed. She knew that not only would she miss her friends but also the good times they had

had together. And so Margaret wept.

If we are able to feel Margaret Thatcher's grief maybe we can understand and feel the grief of the women on that first Easter Sunday morning. It is a grief that many of us have felt at some point in our lives. Maybe you have stood beside the grave of a loved one; a mother, father, brother, sister, wife, or husband; and felt that your whole world has changed and that your life will never be the same. That is how the women felt as they journeyed to the tomb where Jesus had been buried. And so they trudged on in silence, thinking their own thoughts, mired in sadness and despair, to mourn their beloved Jesus on that Easter morning.

But they didn't remain that way long. Soon their trudging, heavy steps were turned into energized. running leaps. They came away with a sense of exaltation. Matthew's Gospel uses such words as joy and rejoicing. You see. the women had gone to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body with burial spices. but now earthshaking events came upon them with lightning swiftness. The stone covering the entrance to the tomb had been rolled away, an angel appeared, the body was gone, and then came the announcement that Jesus had risen. As a result, Matthew tells us, the women ran from the tomb with great joy. Then Jesus, the Risen Lord. met them and told them to rejoice.

In an instant" with Jesus' Resurrection, we see the victory of heaven over hell, love over hate, hope over despair, forgiveness over sin. and life over death. The women were the first to experience Easter joy, and now we with them can share the joy of the Easter promise, which is ultimate victory over all that negates life.

You see in an instant they were set free just as Spurgeon's sparrow was from the vicissitudes of life and even from the last enemy death. They were set free for new and exciting possibilities in this world and the next. Ultimately the disciples and we become participants with Christ in the Resurrection, and this carries with it hope. The Easter Resurrection Day celebration is a rock solid hope to which hurried and harried people can turn.

A Risen Christ means that our time, our life, is set within the parameters of eternity. No longer do we have to anguish about life's difficulty alone, suffer alone, worry alone, or be discouraged alone for we have the assurance that Christ walks with us daily just as God walked with Enoch daily. And because he walks with us, we have the certainty of victory, and with this certainty there is no end to the possibilities that await us in life.

Perhaps, the most poignant illustration of this is Saint Peter. Jesus gave Peter the name "Rock," but this was not a description of his character for he was volatile, impulsive, and likely to fail on occasion. We see this especially on the occasion of Jesus' trial. Peter had promised to follow Jesus always. But after Jesus' arrest Peter followed him only to the High Priest's house. It was there that he denied any acquaintance with Jesus when a young woman accused him of being a follower of the Lord. Peter denied this and then disappeared, perhaps slinking into the crowd, fearful for his life, leaving Jesus all alone except for a few women who watched the crucifixion from afar.

The turning point in Peter's life came when he became a witness to the Resurrection. He was then ready to do whatever Jesus instructed him to do. He became a leader in the early Church. He feared not the authorities but acted boldly and bravely and, as legend has it, suffered martyrdom, perhaps in Rome. All this happened because of the Resurrection of Jesus. He had a new hope that resulted in new possibilities, and he lived with the certainty of victory in this life. We can live such a hopeful and victorious life as well.

Even death is no barrier to that hope. While we cannot deny the reality of death for ourselves and our loved ones and the resultant grief that comes with it, we know that life does not end in the grave, and that is a hope that we can cling to even in the darkest of times. We have that promise from Christ who said, "Because I live, you shall live also."

When George H. Bush was Vice President, he represented the United States at the funeral of Leonid Brezhnev of the former Soviet Union. Since the U.S.S.R. was officially an atheistic country the funeral was cold and militaristic. There were no hymns, prayers, nor any mention of God. Vice

President Bush was close to the casket, and he saw what Mrs. Brezhnev did when she walked up to take one last look at her husband in the casket. She reached over and traced the design of the cross on her husband's chest. Even in the midst of an atheistic state, cold and militaristic, and the grief of losing her husband; hope came to Mrs. Brezhnev because she believed in the Resurrection of Christ and the promise of eternal life for all who believe in Him.

There is no silence on the other side of the grave. There is the assurance of encountering the living Christ and this is what Easter is all about.

And so we celebrate Easter this morning. Easter is about life and death and victory over death. It is about going from trudging through life with head hung low to running and jumping joyously and being alive with new possibilities. It is about glorious hope in life because of Christ and having the assurance that there is life beyond the grave.

Because of this we can echo the words of the great hymn: we can "Sing with all the saints in glory, sing the resurrection song. Death and sorrow, earth's dark story, to the former days belong." Easter means that we have a future, a bright future here and now and after death because of Christ. Take this faith to your heart now, this morning, and live triumphantly.

Everyone, I guess, fights against time.


When we think about it, however, the Creator of time designed it to go forward. Life is made to go forward, not backwards. Hopes are for the future, not for the past.



ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Jeffersonville No. 27 - Chartered April 26, 1876. Charter surrendered October 13, 2008, and merged with New Albany No. 5.

Washington No. 33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes No. 20.

Tipton No. 52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo No. 36.

Winchester No. 53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No. 18.

Sullivan No. 54 Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20, 1979.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941,

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62. At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Echerty Lodge No. 719, Echerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006)

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
