The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

SIR KNIGHT DUANE L. VAUGHT, GCT, PGC Right Eminent Grand Captain General Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Indiana

Duane L. Vaught, the 157th Grand Master of Indiana, was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana, the first of three sons of Lloyd E Vaught and Loretta Maxine Vaught. He graduated from North Montgomery High School and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. During college he was in Air Force ROTC becoming Cadet Major. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In December 2000 married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode. M.W. Brother Vaught has two brothers, Dale and Glen, both residing in Indiana. Georgia has a sister, Gloria, living in Atlanta Georgia.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm in its Indianapolis office, during which time he passed the CPA exam and was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. He subsequently moved to a large local accounting firm in Bloomington Indiana. He advanced in that firm to the level of partner. Since 1995 He has been vice-president of Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P. C., which has grown to be one of the largest accounting firms in Bloomington, Indiana. Although he works with individuals and many kinds of businesses, not-for-profit entities are one of his primary specialties. He served as president of his chapter of Kiwanis, is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants, in which last organization he served several years as Vice-president for Professional Education.

Duane Vaught began his Masonic career on April 30, 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Brother Vaught was initiated an Entered Apprentice in Crawfordsville on March 21, 1977, and raised to the degree of Master Mason 49 days later after previously receiving the degree of Fellowcraft. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1993 during which year the lodge received the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He has also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry on October 22, 1977 in a festival, held in Muncie, in honor of then presiding Most Eminent Grand Master, Willard M. Avery. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon near Indiana.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service, Knight Commander of the Temple, and Knight Grand Cross of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD. He holds honorary memberships in several other Grand Commanderies. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights

Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught is also serving on the finance committee of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Brother Vaught is a Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256, as well Past Commander Noah and Past Supreme Ruler of the Secret Monitor. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and currently serves as Secretary of his council.


Brother Vaught is currently serving as an officer of St Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests He is a member IX degree, Knight Grand Cross of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSCRIF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Knights of Pythias, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, Indiana Past Commanders Association, Goose and Tater, and Royal Order of Zanzibar. In 2005 he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33o. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

Most Worshipful Grand Master Roger S. VanGorden appointed Duane as Junior Grand Deacon of the Grand Lodge in May of 2002. Brother Vaught was later appointed as the Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of Oregon near Indiana. In 2003 he was appointed Senior Grand Deacon by Most Worshipful Grand Master James L. Chesney of Ellettsville. In 2004, 2005 and 2006 he was elected to each successive office and on Wednesday, May 16, 2007 was invested with the purple of the fraternity as the 157th Grand Master of the Grand Lodge Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Indiana.

Sir Knight Vaught was appointed Right Eminent Grand Captain General, Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA on August 29, 2007 by Sir Knight William Koon II, Grand Master and was elected to remain in the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment at the 64th Triennial Conclave, August 2009, in Roanoke Virginia.

He was Exalted in Gilead Chapter No. 59, RAM, Mt. Gilead, Ohio, on May 27, 1968, High Priest in 1971; receiving the Order of High Priesthood in 1971. He served as their Secretary from 1971 thru 1982. He was a member of Warren Chapter No.6, Newark, Ohio, served as High Priest in 1984, and Secretary from 1985 thru 1986. He served as District Deputy Grand High Priest of the 14th Capitular District from 1986 thru 1989. He is presently a member of Clinton Chapter No. 26, Mt. Vernon, Ohio serving as High Priest in 1998. He was appointed Grand Representative to the Grand Chapter RAM of Ireland near the Grand Chapter RAM of Ohio. He is a member of the Chapter of Research of the Grand Chapter RAM of Ohio.

Invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple in 2000, Grand Master William Jackson Jones appointed him to the Committee on Competitive Drill for the 2003 Triennium. He was elected a member of Ohio Priory No. 18, Knights of the York Cross of Honor in November 1979.

Frank is a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Columbus, where he has been an active participant in the Licking County Scottish Rite Club. Over the years they have conferred the 9th, 10th, and 11th degrees, of which Frank has taken major parts. Frank was elected to receive the Thirty-Third and Last Degree of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry at St. Louis in September 2003. He is a member of Aladdin Temple Shrine of Columbus, as well as Baldwin and Newark Shrine Clubs and a member of Teheran Grotto, Newark, Ohio.

On April 18, 1998 he was inducted into the Grand Council of Knight Masons, Indiana No. 15 and is currently serving an Officer. On April 24, 1999 he received the General Grand Council Cryptic Masons Meritorious Service Award. Also that year, he was awarded the General Grand Chapter, International Bronze Award. Andy was also a 1996 recipient of the Indiana Grand Chapter RAM's High Priest of the Year Award. He has also served as a President of the Group 7E State York Rite Association. He also has served as a Grand Council Group/Arch officer for many years.

He holds and serves as a Life member, since April 11, 1997, in the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of Indianapolis, where he served for many years in the degree work. He now is serving as Chairman of the Wardrobe Committee and Chairman of the Historical Committee. In October of 2005 he was honored with the Valley's Meritorious Service Award. He has served as Recorder of the Yeomen of York, Indianapolis #4 and was elected Honoree Director General on November 4, 2006.

Grand Commander Jackson thanked the Grand Representatives for their work in keeping the Grand Commanderies of other jurisdictions informed of our doings and them of ours, and dismissed them.

COMMENTS BY S.K. ROBERT G. ELROD, 33°, DEPUTY FOR INDIANA FOR THE SUPREME COUNCIL, 33°, ANCIENT ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE, NORTHERN MASONIC JURISDICTION

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Most Worshipful Grand Master, distinguished members of the dais and Sir Knights all: I am pleased to be here as a representative of the Scottish Rite. The Grand Master said he has made seven speeches in the past three days. I do not get to make that many, but this is about my fourteenth appearance at this annual conclave. I bring you greetings from the Scottish Rite Masons of Indiana. It is always a pleasure to attend the meetings of the Grand Commandery and the other York Rite groups. As Deputy, I look out and see that many of you are members of the Scottish Rite. I'm always pleased to address other Masonic groups where I have the distinct honor of being a Deputy in a state where we all pretty much get along. As I travel around and talk to fellow Deputies, I find this is not always the case.

The Grand Master observed last evening that Masonry is now on a growth pattern, at least with the ones we are currently bringing in. We still have a slight problem with the ones dropping out, but we are bringing in more than we have dropping out, which reflects the cooperation of all the Masonic Bodies in the state. For several years, with some reforms that have been going on a now reflect new ways of doing things or bringing new men into Masonry. And it appears to me, that presents new challenges that we should awaken ourselves as leaders of Masonry sooner rather than later. The new men I see coming into my lodge are mainly younger members. I think is some ways, we are attracting a better class of members. I think that presents a challenge to the leadership of all our bodies, and that is that we must get these people involved in doing what we do. I think there are challenges to recognize what will appeal to these people and engage them in the fraternity. As I look back over the history of the Fraternity for the last 25-30 years, I look at the number of members who have dropped out. It appears to me that we have not done a good job of engaging our membership in what we do. And I think that it is a particular challenge in this day and age when we are doing more recruiting of members and we convince them to come in because they will benefit by being members. And we better well make sure that those benefits

are there when we get them in the door. Otherwise, in three or four years they are going to say I'm not doing anything in this, why bother to keep paying dues when dues keep going up as costs continue to rise. The challenge I think is that we must find among these new members people that will be leaders of their peers. As I look around these groups when the leadership of Masonry gets together, the number of people under the age of fifty is not very good. We've got to get people who understand the new members and their lifestyles and how they do things and find those that are qualified to lead and do what we can to encourage them to become leaders. Most of the men sitting in this room have had a friend come over and say I have a job for you and that is probably where most of us got our start to become leaders. We have to be attentive to the people we have coming in and look for those that have the ability to lead, get them involved and they will get their friends involved. They will do things that are important and interesting to them. Unless we do things that people are interested in and want to be a part of, we are not going to keep them around very long. I've got four sons between the ages of thirty and thirty-six and I'm not sure I always understand what they want, but hopefully we will give them an opportunity to tell us what they want and lead us in the direction that will benefit the fraternity in times to come. Right Eminent Grand Commander, I appreciate this opportunity to address this group and bring some remarks. Have a good session. We have been friends for a long time and I'm sure that friendship will continue. Thank you.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS:

Nineteen Distinguished Service Awards were nominated and approved by the Grand Commander to be presented with proper recognition to the honorees by the Officers of the constituent Commanderies.

PROBATION:

On April 27, 2007 Wabash Commandery No. 37 was placed under probation until the next Annual Conclave for several reasons.

- 1. The Annual Report, due January 15, was not received by the Grand Recorder. Per Capita payment has not been received as of April 1, 2008.
- 2. The Commandery cannot open or close without the use of an open Ritual even if they have enough Knights to open.
- 3. No Officer was present at the 2007 Annual Conclave.

LEVANT PRECEPTORY:

On October 13, 2007 Levant Preceptory presented a Templar period dress program on the 700 year anniversary of the suppression of the Knights Templar at Baldwin Commandery No 2 in Shelbyville, IN. They also visited a state conferral of the DeMolay membership class earlier that day. Afterwards the DeMolay group attended the program in Shelbyville, IN. Over one hundred people enjoyed this program including the public.

WINTER MEETING AND NEWBY-AVERY BANQUET:

The winter meeting of the Grand Commandery was held on January 5, 2008, at the Marriott Inn, Indianapolis, IN. The Grand Officers and Past Grand Commanders had stimulating discussions of the pre-printed committee reports. The purpose of the winter meeting was to discuss the progress made on the committee projects that were presented at the summer meeting. Our Templar Goals were being accomplished and continued plans were assigned to the Officers. Sir Knight and Aid to the Grand Commander Greg and his Lady Judy Aitken presented the Grand Commandery with two short swords for the Grand Commanderies Conclave bible.

There were 95 reservations for the Newby-Avery Banquet that evening; however, the personal challenges prevented some from attending. Those guests that were able to attend enjoyed George Ingles, PGC, present a lecture about the life of our SK Willard M. Avery, PGM and the history of the Newby/Avery Banquet. SK William H. Koon, II, MEGM, David D. Goodwin, RE Dep.GM, Duane L. Vaught, REG Captain General and our Grand Master of Masons on Indiana, and Franklin C. Boner, REDC, East Central attended. Following the meal, SK Lawrence Kaminsky, PGC was Master of Ceremonies for the introductions and program in fine style. A Knight Commander of the Temple was

presented to Sir Knight George D. Kivett, HPGC from SK William H. Koon, II, MEGM who also formally presented the honor of Knight Grand Cross of the Temple to Duane L. Vaught. David Newman, son of Herbert Newman, PGC, and his singing group "Aore Male" entertained us with 7 or 8 wonderful uplifting songs.

NECROLOGY:

A TEMPLAR FESTIVAL:

A Templar Festival was held on April 12, 2008 at our Indiana Masonic Home. The three Orders were conferred in fullest form with many beautiful costumes. The Order of Red Cross was conferred by Lackey Commandery No. 67. The Order of Malta was conferred by Ft. Wayne Commandery No. 4, who rented a bus to accomplish the conferral. The Order of the Temple was conferred in period dress by Levant Preceptory. The Social Order of the Beauceant was invited and enjoyed a ladies program. Lunch was served and we enjoyed the interaction with our IMH residents. The evening feast was in medieval style. The hog was roasted; the ribs and Cornish hens were grilled. The soup was cooked over an open fire. A group of Old English musicians played for the entertainment. The CEO and Chaplin of the Indiana Masonic Home were candidates for the Orders.

INDIANA SUPPLEMENT TO THE KNIGHTS TEMPLAR MAGAZINE:

Each month this year we relied on our editor, SK. Edward L. Sebring, of the supplement to publish interesting articles, pictures and information about Indiana Templary. He was able to provide timely and very readable editorials that did much more than "fill the space." For the future, the editor needs your news and pictures before the 10th of each month to be published the following month.

PUBLIC APPEARANCES:

The Officers of the Grand Commandery made many appearances to raise public awareness. One of the first was the parade at the Indiana Masonic Home during the Festival on August 19, 2007. The officers in uniform led the parade around the oval carrying the US flag and the Beauceant. This event landed our Templar color guard on the front page of our Indiana Freemason. On the 28th of July 2007 the Officers participated in the patriotic parade at Batesville Indiana. Along the 2 mile route many children and adults asked, "Are those (swords) real?" Finally, the Grand Commandery received the invitation to parade, present the colors and form the Commandery lines, with Arch of Steel, for the distinguished guests at the 100 year Rededication of the Bloomington, Indiana courthouse. Our Grand Master of Masons in Indiana and also Past Grand Commander Duane L. Vaught was very proud of our participation in the event. I had the honor to install Michael Smith as E. Commander of Trinity Commandery on December 15,

2007 and on December 29, 2007 form the Templar lines for Austin C. Gray's installation as W. Master of Martinsville lodge. On October 26, 2007 we formed the Templar lines for the Mid-west Conference of

the Grotto at the Marriott Hotel in Indianapolis. We continued to support the Veteran's Day program at our Indiana Masonic Home and also at other locations around the state. The Grand Commandery of Indiana met for the Grand Encampment Department meeting on March 8, 2008 with 19 Knights attending.

MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT:

- A personal letter from the Grand Commander was sent to 1330 Indiana Sir Knights thanking them for their membership.
- 500 wooden crosses were given at the local and state class Knightings by the Grand Prelate, Battalion Commanders or the Grand Commander.
- The crusader membership jacket program was continued with good success.
- 2500 additional York Rite Pamphlets and new 1500 DVD's with a new label were created to boost membership around Indiana.
- We had many York Rite membership classes conferred around Indiana. One was in honor of Larry E. Gray, General Grand High Priest.
- We created over 50 new membership Crusaders at two Templar Crusader Colleges. One College was held at Rensselaer and the second at Shelbyville, IN.
- We sent two Grand Knights to Illinois for General Grand Chapter and General Grand Council conference on March 8, 2008. They were to offer some of our membership development directions for the other states.
- We continued updating our Website with the new events from around the state.
- On September 1 and 2, 2007 we participated in conjunction with all other Masonic groups at Connor Prairie for a Labor Day concert. We passed out Masonic information to over 14000 Indiana citizens.
- On February 23 and March 1, 2008 we participated in the Tri-State York Rite Class in Byron, OH and Angola, IN. The Grand Commandery of Michigan conferred the Order of the Temple. Because of this event the Grand Commandery of Indiana travelled to Battle Creek, MI on March 15, 2008 and conferred the Order of the Temple on 15 men.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. The success of any organization is clearly the responsibility of its leadership. The most important task that we have is developing new leaders. The future of the Grand Commandery of Indiana depends upon the Sir Knights that we nurture and encourage them to lead the constituent Commanderies. The leaders that we create will accomplish more than we can on our own. What they achieve will be our legacy. As I see it, teaching others is the most important duty of an officer. Leadership training should be ongoing whether formal, such as the Indiana Templar Academy and schools of instruction, or informal, one on one.

Mentoring falls into the last category. I recommend that every Commandery in the State form a two-part mentoring program-first, for the new Sir Knights and second, for the officers and even existing members. A mentor should be assigned to each new Sir Knight to answer any questions that he or his family may have and to provide information to the Sir Knight about the Commandery and Templary. And most assuredly, the mentor should invite the new Knight to all functions of the Commandery to maintain his interest and keep the new member abreast of the meeting dates and times.

In many Commanderies in Indiana it is the custom to advance officers very rapidly through the moving line because of the lack in numbers available. This practice is an injustice to the officer

and to the Commandery. A mentor should be assigned to each new officer to provide guidance, encouragement and instruction. Most likely the new officer is unaware of his current or future responsibilities and that he should be making program plans when he will become the Eminent Commander. An experienced mentor would be a great asset to him. Please remember the many generational gaps that need to be spanned for success.

Inactive participation is a key issue that future Grand Commandery officers must review and make a positive impact. For instance, many Commanderies have difficulty in having enough Sir Knights for a legal Opening. We must re-kindle interest in those Sir Knights who do not attend regularly or not at all. Each Commandery needs to plan activities, such as social, charitable or religious, that will be of interest to the majority. A local charity may be an excellent choice to encourage participation and to gain public exposure. The reason that inactive participation is so important is found in recruiting new members. The active members of a Commandery are the recruiters. The vast majority of the membership does not recruit at all. It makes sense to increase their participation so that they will help recruit new members. There are areas in the State that do not have an active Commandery. One may have been there at one time, but it ceases to exist. If we do not keep in contact with the Sir Knights in these areas, they may demit or be suspended due to a lack of interest. I believe that it will be much more difficult to re-establish Templary in those areas if we do not stay in touch. As before, activities may be the bridge between active and inactive areas. I recommend that active Commanderies contact and maintain a presence in these inactive areas. If we do not, these areas will surely grow. This year I attempted to appoint many new Deputy Battalion Commanders and Aids to the Grand Commander. This allowed the Grand Commander to have a direct effect upon those Commanderies that these officers attended through the year.

Encourage the Sir Knights of this Grand Commandery and the Constituent Commanderies to be visible in uniform in the public eye. Participate in parades and civic activities, present the US flag at lodges and attend religious services together.

- 2. I recommend that this Grand Commandery continue to support the Masonic youth organizations (Rainbow for Girls, Job's Daughters and DeMolay) monetarily and by our presence. They are our hope and future leaders. Also, our Grand Officers need to improve their attendance at the youth Grand Sessions.
- 3. I recommend that the Grand Commandery support a New York Rite Steering Committee of Indiana. This body, not the Grand Commandery, should plan and conduct the membership festivals in the State and coordinate joint York Rite recruiting activities. The Grand Commandery should also attend and support the activities and directions of the other two York Rite bodies and continue to produce the Red Book.
- 4. I recommend that the Grand Commandery of Indiana continue to support the publicity campaign of the Grand Lodge F&AM of Indiana. This includes the membership campaigns along with any and other forms of media and activities that we might be invited to participate such as the event at Connor Prairie in Indianapolis on Labor Day.
- 5. I recommend that the Grand Commandery of Indiana maintain a closer relationship with the Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star to benefit the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. The Eye Foundation committee and Campaign Chairman should be ready to make presentations to

raise funds within the Districts of the Order of the Easter Star on behalf of the Eye Foundation. Appearing in uniform would be an asset and a recruiting tool.

6. I recommend in the future that the Battalion Commanders and Deputy Battalion Commanders instruct the Commanderies in their Battalion on proper protocol prior to an Inspection or Reception. Proper protocol shows respect and improves uniformity between Commanderies. During the Inspections and Receptions this year, I observed that many Commanderies did not adhere to the protocol as outlined in the new Deputy Battalion Commander's Handbook. The Division Commander could have a large impact upon the appointed Officers.

IN APPRECIATION:

As my tenure as Grand Commander comes to a close, I feel that time has passed to quickly. It seems like only yesterday that I was installed and began this incredible journey. I am indebted to many. First, I wish to thank the Sir Knights of Indiana for the opportunity to serve and represent you as your Grand Commander. I thank the Sir Knights of Raper Commandery No. 1 and the ladies of the Columbus Assembly No. 90 SOOB for their support and guidance this year. Mary and my reception on September 14, 2007 by Raper Commandery and the Social Order of the Beauceant was an event to remember the rest of my life.

I appreciate the tireless effort of all of the Grand Officers as Division Commanders, Battalion Commanders, Deputy Battalion Commanders, Aids, committee members and inspectors. The Grand Commandery would not be successful without the dedication of your time and resources. I respect and admire the ladies of these officers for their support and understanding. I am sure that they spent many nights at home looking at the clock wondering when the front door was going to open. They are truly my adopted sisters. It was a joy to travel with the Aides this year over the State and in Sister Jurisdictions. The memories of the many miles that we traveled and talked along the way will stay with me the rest of my life. We met new friends, enjoyed the hospitality and broke bread with special people. I am truly blessed by your friendship.

As I look back over the years that I have been a Mason, Companion and Sir Knight, there are so many individuals that I am very grateful to for their influence-The Brothers, Companions, Sir Knights of Grand Lodge of Indiana, the Scottish Rite, The Grotto, the Shrine, Ladies and Youth organizations and of course our residents of our Indiana Masonic Home. Without you none of this would have happened. I also must include SK Irv Bitting and his wife Doris for the invitation to be a Grand Commander Officer. They have my deepest gratitude and respect for all their help. I value the advice and wisdom that I received from the Past Grand Commanders who were gracious enough to give me their opinion-especially, Bob and Nancy Price, HPDC; Steve Barton, PDC; George Kivett, HPGC and Willard Avery, PGM.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 2008

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments -the organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the this standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

GRAND TRUSTEES REPORT

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery and Sir Knights All of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

During the past year the investments of your Grand Commandery have been reviewed and as the market had changed we attempted to maintain a growth pattern. Changes in our investments will be made as we diversify our Mutual Fund Holdings to maintain a greater income of our resources. The balance in the Permanent Fund of the Indiana Grand Commandery on March 1, 2007 was \$293,432.19. This was a decrease of \$1,873.19 over last year's balance.

We believe that it is very important to maintain the Permanent Fund and add to it when possible. We should not be dependent on the Fund to support our regular operational budget. It is hoped the present dues increase will stop the continued drain on the Fund, so that working capital can be developed for the building of membership in our Grand Commandery and other projects to aid in improving growth.

MEMBERSHIP AND PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of The Grand Commandery and Sir Knights all.

During the Templar Year 2007/2008, your Committee feels a positive approach has been taken to renew old vows, increase awareness and increased effort on Membership recruitment, Membership retention and Public Awareness. The following steps have been taken to show the efforts involved and projected results:

- 1. **RECRUITMENT**: Two (2) Templar Crusader Academy's were held in the State with 40 Sir Knights attending the program. One was held on September 15, 2007, at the asylum of H.W. Matthewson #66 in Rensselear. There were in attendance 14 Sir Knights from Battalions 1, 2 and 3. The second school was held on October 6, 2007, at the Asylum of Baldwin #2 in Shelbyville in which 26 Sir Knights was in attendance from Battalions 3, 4, 5 and 6. Our many thanks go out to Sir Knight's James Daugherty, E.G. Principal Sojourner of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Indiana, Philip Herthel, E.G. Captain of the Host, Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Indiana, David Wood, Grand Master of the 3rd Veil, Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Indiana and S.K. Carson Smith Senior Warden Raper Commandery No. 1. Without the extended efforts of these Sir Knight's, this program would not have gotten off to the great start that it did and the results as expressed by many of the Trainee's was well received. Many Sir Knight's left the training with the salesmanship skills needed to expound on our cause, greet potential candidates with the knowledge of how to get to know them and be ambassadors to our Great Fraternity. It is our hope that these Crusaders will go forth throughout the State and apply the skills received at the Crusader Schools with enthusiasm and high expectations to greet potential candidates and promote Membership Petitions.
- 2. DVD'S and Pamphlets: Additional DVD's and pamphlets were burned and printed further distribute throughout the State. Many Asylums and Blue Lodges were calling for these as well as the York Rite Knight educational programs to be scheduled for their members. Many Lodges still do not have Knight Templar Posters posted in their Lodge and as I visited throughout the State, I have observed the same. All Battalion Commanders, their DBC's and Templar Crusaders are requested to visit all the Lodges in their respective Battalions and observe if Posters, DVD's and Pamphlets are present. They may contact me for further Posters, etc. needed. Without this information being supplied to the Lodges, we will not accomplish our goal of spreading the word of further light as exemplified in the York Rite of Freemasonry. Battalion Commanders should be aware of visitations and procure a list of Lodges in his Battalion to insure they are visited. A most valuable asset on Membership is the Period Templars who portray Knights of Old in full regalia; visitation from them is available to anyone wishing their program put on in their area.
- 3. <u>PUBLIC RELATIONS</u>: In the past, a Knight Templar was identified by the various emblems as known only to a Knight Templar. Your Committee on Membership has designed and had printed 1000 bumper/Window stickers that proudly proclaim we are a Knight Templar and a Christian Mason. These stickers have been well received by the Sir Knight's of Indiana and are moving along in sales. The cost of the Stickers was \$1,360.00 and the sales to date have been in excess of \$484 + \$286 = \$770. The general public needed a way to recognize a Knight Templar for their needs of access to our philanthropy and as a tool in aiding in membership petitions from Freemasons on who to contact by our Knight's proudly displaying the emblem on their automobile. Tabletops were held at various locations during 2007 with great results in petitions

and interest in Templary. Many local Commanderies have planned and executed forming lines for Knight's being installed as Worshipful Masters of their Lodges and for Funeral services for a deceased Sir Knight. Many of these were noted on Commandery Activity Reports for the year 2007. These Public appearances are essential to our visibility and public acknowledgement of our Order. Knight Templars have participated in parades throughout the State as also noted on the Activity Report. There were many Memorial Day, Easter, Flag Presentations, Christmas and Ascension Day Services planned and executed with great interest to the general public. One of the greatest tools we have in getting to the general public is the Holy Land Pilgrimage. Those ministers attending are thankful to the Knight Templars and proudly tell their congregations about us. Your Committee encourages all Commanderies to support the Holy Land Pilgrimage with monetary donations and sponsoring a Minister to be chosen to make the pilgrimage. Your Committee on Membership also purchased a Banner to be hung over Nativity Scene, which we proudly put up and take down each Christmas season at the Indiana Masonic Home for the residents to enjoy and they truly do, wishing them a Merry Christmas from the Knights Templar. The Grand Commandery along with many Sir Knights of the State helps maintain the building and props. We recommend that the Grand Commandery pursue a permit to install a concrete pad from the Home Board of Directors, get estimates for installation of pad for the assembly each year of the Nativity Scene. Each year we are installing it on unlevel ground. An additional bonus would be that during the rest of the year it can be used for resident picnic tables. We are looking at various ways to fund the installation of the pad.

- 4. <u>DIAL A KNIGHT PROGRAM</u>: Your Committee on Membership encourages all Commanderies to enter into a Dial-A Knight program. We request all Commanders to procure from their respective Recorders a list of all Knights of their Commanderies who do not regularly attend meetings. Divide this list into the current elected as well as appointed Officers, insure that each member assigned to each Officer is called prior to Stated Meetings, Called Meetings and Orders being conferred. Encourage them to attend by offering them a ride, help on refreshment committee or honor them for achievements. By this promotion we can hope to reduce the amount of Demits and Suspensions due to lack of interest. Insure that spouses are made aware of public functions. Potlucks and family programs being held in the asylum. Personally invite them to attend with the Sir Knight. Always insuring we visit our shut-ins and sick.
- **5. LEVANT PRECEPTORY:** The Membership Committee fraternally thanks the Knights of Levant Preceptory, working out of Raper Commandery No. 1 for their efforts and enthusiasm on presenting the programs around the State in Period Templar garb and for the Order of the Temple at the Indiana Masonic home in full Period Dress. This form of publicity generated many petitions for the Orders and has gained us attention we so proudly deserve.

EYE FOUNDATION REPORT

At the present time (March 3, 2007) we have over \$13,000.00 credited to Indiana in the Voluntary Campaign. For those who aren't familiar with our past contributions that is an excellent amount for this time in the campaign. After much discussion last year, the Educational Foundation Committee, decided to discontinue giving loans to students and began awarding scholarships. Initially one scholarship will be given. Eventually, we hope to award two, one will go to a student who is studying to be a minister of the Christian faith and the second would go to a teacher or teachers who are expanding their education in mathematics or science. The amount of each would be \$5000.00

Also, it was decided that we would enter into a three year agreement with Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) to supply a \$5000.00 scholarship for a student who is working on a master degree in divinity. CTS assumed the responsibility to research the needs of their best students and present to the committee a deserving student. Last year we presented the first scholarship and we are going to present the second scholarship at this Grand Conclave.

The second scholarship remains a little more difficult to present, because the committee felt that we did not have the ability to select the teacher or teachers for the second \$5000.00 award. We have discovered the Indiana Department of Education does not have a "clearinghouse" that can help us in selecting deserving teachers for this award in math and science. It is the wish of the committee that during the coming year we can decide on a method of solving this problem.

RESOLUTION JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

Whereas: SECTION 705 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Indiana JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE Reads:

JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

SECTION 705 (437). The Committee on Templar Jurisprudence shall be composed of all the Past Grand Commanders of Indiana. It shall meet at two o'clock p.m. of the day immediately preceding the first day of the Annual Conclave and on such other days as may be necessary.

Its members shall receive like per diem and mileage for attending such meetings in vacation as is allowed for attending the meetings of the Grand Commandery.

The Committee on Templar Jurisprudence shall examine all propositions to revise, alter or amend Templar Laws, By-Laws and General Regulations, as well as all questions of Templar Laws and usage; approve or reject the appointments made by the Grand Commander of Inspectors General and Deputy Inspectors General; assist the Grand Commander in fixing the time and place of holding the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery when necessary; consider all matters involved in the Grand Commander's address and report, and recommend the parts thereof that should be referred to special committees examine the Reports of the Reviewer and Inspector General and report its action to the Grand Commandery.

And whereas Section 48(b) Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment United States of America reads:

Section 48. The Grand Commander shall have the following specific powers and duties but the enumeration shall not be deemed a limitation thereof:

(b) To appoint all committees and all Officers not made elective and to fill all vacancies, such appointees to serve during his pleasure or until their successors have been elected and installed.

REPORT OF THE INACTIVITY PARTICIPATION COMMITTEE

Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights: Your committee for 'Inactive Participation' makes the following report.

To address the problem of 'Inactive Participation' one must first determine if there is a problem. Traditionally, some 7% to 10% of our constituent membership shoulders the burden of keeping a Charter active. Of the remaining 90 percent – we can determine who they are, where they live, age, health, means of transportation, years of membership, offices held, and any other factor you think might influence their decision to retire to the side-lines.

Perhaps of equal significance, if not – more so, take a good look at what your Commandery does throughout the Templar year. Do you basically meet because the By-Laws say you must? And, what do you do in such mandated meetings?

- a. Pay the bills?
- b. Read the 'minutes?'
- c. Talk about 'How it used to be?'
- d. Announce illness or deaths among the craft?
- e. Announce a proposed Templar Project say to do in a month or two? Something of such a magnitude requiring 8 to 12 months to plan and execute?

A question to verify: Does the 'Inactive Participant' think such repetitive meetings 'of the same old thing' really need his attendance? At this juncture do you begin to see the need to profile?

- a. What your Commandery could do to implement programs and 'outside the box' ideas.
- b. To find out what would sufficiently interest the 'Inactive Member' to become somewhat more active, including his family members and
- c. If the information garnered lends itself to events scheduled in your general area can the Commandery membership bring itself to organize outings (daytime when possible) and encourage 'Inactive Participants' to attend with some of the active members; be it 1 or 2 or several.

Events can be:

- a. Civic
- b. Religious
- c. Masonic (Preferably Outside the Lodge Hall)

Nearby colleges offer a variety of good quality programs at reasonable costs:

- a. Music
- b. Drama
- c. Lectures

Churches offer special services for:

- a. Easter
- b. Ascension Day
- c. St. John the Baptist
- d. Christmas
- e. St. John the Evangelist

Masonically – Templary also venerates those same religious observances; along with unusual degree conferrals – such as Raper Commandery Levant Preceptory's conferral of the Order of the Temple – and

there some variations in nearly all York Rite Degrees and Orders in the surrounding States. Our Masonic Youth Groups should be actively supported and attend their various events.

Some 20 years back our Grand Encampment and the Scottish Rite (NMJ) commissioned and underwrote a top professional market research effort among non-Masons. Among the factors that came to light were 2 critical facts as expressed by those non-Masons to the research personnel:

- a. They would associate with organizations that offered something for the entire family and
- b. They indicated they had some 5-1/2 hours of discretionary time per month for such participation.

Demographics indicate the greatest continuing numerical increase is found in the seniors group. This may speak well for diet and medical advances – but does not address our need for enrolling the age 30 to 40 groups for longevity and potential officer selection. Many 'Inactive' members stay away for various reasons:

- a. Can't drive.
- b. Won't drive at night.
- c. Won't leave a family member unattended.
- d. Other interests.

Schedule what you can in any new effort for daytime outings; provide transportation if needed; and any other amenities you can financially afford. Above all – get a reliable phone-calling committee as your first step 'out of the box'.

And finally – as a 'for what it is worth' comment: my personal opinion, in looking back over 50 years of active participation in our 'gentle Craft' – I suspect the problem resides more so in the Asylum than in a member's home.

Thank you, please be seated. In the interest of the hour I too shall be short. Some of you have heard me speak this will be for the sixth time this week. And in the interest of dinner I need to save some material. Let me begin briefly by recognizing my fellow Grand Lodge Officers who are with me today, Sir Knight John Logan the Grand Organist of the Grand Lodge Sir Knight Carl Culmann the Grand Marshal of the Grand Lodge and Sir Knight George Ingles the Junior Grand Deacon of the Grand Lodge. Greet them please. I of course bring greetings from William Howard Koon the second Grand Master Grand Encampment of the United States. He of course is still a member of Ohio and of course been over here many times. He is a good friend to us here in Indiana and we're sorry his more extensive duties prevent him from being with us more often. We note that he has spent the weekend here in Indian but that was for his wife Elisabeth's surgery, and everything we hear is good but sometimes it just take a few day to before you are ready to travel after it so. They I believe are resting in Indianapolis today and he is spending some time with his family this last week and God Bless him that he found the time to do that. Because that's where he should spend his time. But I am here and I am happy to be home in my home Grand Commandery. Some of the member of my Commandery were here today but in a larger sense I work with all of you so many years, I've been at this conclave so many times that I consider you all to be my guys. Guys that I have been working with over the decades and guys I can't imagine not being able to see monthly or as the case may be. I don't know how people who aren't in Freemasonry deal with not having the close relationships we are blessed with in this fraternity. Because when you are in the fraternity and have the opportunity to have friendships that are a close and as deep and as real as we are allowed to have, I am not sure what it would be like to have not have friend like that. We are all indeed truly, truly lucky.

Let me say something briefly about how things are going in the Grand Encampment, because I think it is good news. A lot of things have happened and it didn't start with William Howard Koon, they have been going on a while there are Grand Masters who have said there are things that need to happen for this order of Templar to remain relevant and to thrive .in the 21st Century. That continued with Past Most Eminent Grand Master Richard Baldwin who went into the office of Grand Master with definite ideas of what things needed to be done in this order to advance it. It is truly a shame that a man after that many years of hard work was unable to complete a full triennium as Grand Master because of his health. Those of us who had a chance to see him during his brief appearance at Easter Sunrise Service last month were pleased to see at least that day he was in pretty good shape. He was there with some family and quite frankly he seemed a lot more interested in spending time with his granddaughter, who was a quiet little kid, but he seemed to be interested enough but you know priorities are priorities.

If Grand Master Koon were here he might explain that his grandson was just about the same age and was here. She said Oh are they here, where are they? He said right over there. When he asked if she would like to go over and meet him. She being the true granddaughter of Richard Baldwin said, No but they can come over and meet me. Some things run in families. Richard Baldwin was career Military and he knew about setting objectives and that were obtainable and worth-while and putting his effort into that.

Now we have Grand Master Koon and he's trying to continue the triennium the way Richard Baldwin would have wanted to see it done and that means to try to make some progress in order to make in order to preserve our tradition. You should have received the January issue of the Knight Templar magazine. We'd like to think that a lot of you read it, notwithstanding the articles on deceased baseball players. January issue though if you haven't read it and you still have it around in the pile, of magazines go back and take a look at it. Just inside the cover is Grand Master Koon has listed the Grand Encampment midyear resolution. There are six of them. We resolve that a new stated of the art data on line processing system operational in 2008. It's time we had an up to date data processing network and database. If we were in business we would have pulled a lot on money into that and we would have had it day one, but being a fraternity in the Freemasonry mold we have drug our feet and tried to do things in small steps. While the advantages, the simplicity, and the time savings, not to Grand Encampment but to recorders everyone in this country is too great to drag our feet any longer. We need to have an up to date system in order to simplify the duties of Recorders and Grand Recorders so they can spend their time doing worthwhile things rather than simply necessary things. We resolve to improve the readability content and appearance of the Knight Templar magazine. We have a new editor picked out. The editor we've had for some time it's on target they would retire at the end of 2008. But we have been interviewing and the new editor has been selected. We did a cover, cover at Christmas we had a lot of comments that, that cover was a much better looking magazine. We resolve to make the Easter observance in Alexandria more user-friendly, at the Alexandria Mark Center and increase attendance by scheduling event with those concerned of those coming by bus, etc. I am glad this was written in January because in March we did have a record number in attendance. The Grand Commander's luncheon has never been more than 200, usually around 155 to 180. We knew that we expected that we'd have more people because we were now using a hotel were a bus could park and a delegation of the various states weren't out all around the district of Columbia. We could then all come to the same place. We knew that would increase attendance. How many would come? We got over 350 for the luncheon. So many in fact, that the dining room for the banquet couldn't seat everybody. Somebody decided we had to have somebody not come, so Grand Master Koon decided that Grand Encampment could go somewhere else except for himself, and he ate with the Grand Commanders and the Sir Knights that came to Washington D.C. So that's pretty good to have that record attendance for that service. We resolve to improve the Department conferences, so that they are worthwhile and you feel that your time is respected and is worthwhile by coming to the conference. We resolve to more fully use the web site as a vehicle for Templar information. My guess is that most of you don't look at the Knight Templar web site very often. You should check it out because it's pretty good looking site and there is a vast amount of useful information available. I have always when I get the magazine, first thing I do is open it up and see what Indiana supplement says. I thought sometime I should see what some of the other states are up to. But that's frankly a chore. Not on the web site. You can see the state supplement for any state you want for any issue you want. You know browse around see what other people are doing. We resolve to increase support of pediatric research by the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. With the new office comes the opportunity to be a trustee of the Eye Foundation and it was very educational to attend that first meeting and find out where we are on paying for surgery, or giving grants for research. You have all seen the brochures with the attractive child with cross eyes and the before and after photo and how much we've done for that person life. You know the cruelty children sometime unintentionally inflict on each other if you have an issue like cross eyes. Or simply the difficulties in learning if you have a disability like that. The brochure shows we can do something we can help that child. Well the truth is we do almost none of

that anymore, because for some time we've been funding research and some of the research decisions have panned out and there are now non surgical treatments for cross eyes in children. We are not paying for surgery and being corrected non-surgically through the research that we paid for. I think that's pretty impressive. In fact it needs to continue if we are going to more and more research and do less surgery. I read those not simply to tell you Grand Encampment is great. The Grand Master would like it know that he is serious about these things and we're about trying and usually succeeding to do these things to make this organization better. You should be holding us accountable at Roanoke in August of 2009. This is the Grand Encampment pledge to you in 2008 that we are going to make some progress on your behalf. Those things are not the reason our per-capita went up. Our per-capita went up because of all kind of things cost went up over the 21 year that we didn't increase it. Those things are about putting in some work and some dedication and saying what makes this organization better. As I said look those resolutions look at what's going on in Templary in Grand Encampment and in your Grand Commandery and you should demand progress.

I want to touch briefly on my Grand Commandery of which I am very proud to be a member of and this Grand Commandery is doing a lot of those good things for Templary in this state. General Order No. 1 Jackson

May 1, 2007

Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies

- 5. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 (473) and 852 (474) of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 6. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exceptions:
 - The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
 - A Division Commander will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- 7. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officers upon his arrival.
- 8. The records Inspection shall consist of:
 - A report on the membership efforts.
 - Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
 - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
 - Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 9. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 10. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer. All inspections must be complete by December 15, 2007.
- 11. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Full Form Opening. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.
- 12. An Inspection may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies participating together for an official inspection, when approved by the Battalion Commander. Points for the inspection will only

be awarded when a participating Commandery has <u>nine</u> (9) or more of its members present (subject to review by the Division Commander and the Grand Commander).

- 13. The participating Commanderies will open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form in accordance with the most recent official interpretation of the Ritual and official Indiana Asylum Tactics.
 - A Commandery of Knights Templar shall be opened in Full Form with Rehearsal of Duties. Any of the three Orders may be then conferred for the Inspection. If the Order of the Red Cross or the Order of Malta is conferred the Commandery must suspend business on the Commandery and open a Council or Priory for the reception of candidates. When the Order of the Red Cross or the Order of Malta is completed the Council or Priory must be closed and business resumed in the Commandery.
 - Upon completion of each inspection and prior to closing, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first, and then the Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official Representative, shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him, as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present, he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander will be the final speaker.
 - Violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a
 no score for your inspection and thus require an additional inspection scheduled by the Right
 Eminent Grand Commander.
- 14. The participating Commanderies will exemplify the Full Ceremonial of one of the following Orders: Illustrious Order of the Red Cross, Order of Malta or Order of the Temple. Commanderies may separately or jointly confer the Ceremonies in accordance with one of the following options at the time and place with the consent of the Battalion Commander. The inspection of the Order may occur anytime after May 1, 2007 and prior to December 15, 2007.
 - A single Commandery may perform the Order for points as graded by the Order score sheet by the Battalion Commander and staff, if the majority of parts are filled by the inspected Commandery or Commanderies.
 - Same as above with the exception that up to three (3) Commanderies in the Battalion may participate with the points divided among the Commanderies based upon the level and percentage of participation.
 - An Instructional meeting may be held instead of any, or all, ritualistic work when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General, deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.
- 15. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report of each Commandery to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. A full report of the Inspections will be discussed at the winter meeting and presented for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.
- 16. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.

- 17. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 18. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 1/2 of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, U.S.A., a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight of each Grand Commandery once each year.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. It is to be noted that this award is to be made only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or Member. No elected Grand Commandery or Grand Encampment Officer, past or present, is eligible to receive this award. This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider has been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric labors.

Should your Commandery desire to make a nomination for this award, you will use the following procedure:

- 1. Pass a resolution in your Commandery, naming the Sir Knight to be nominated.
- 2. Write to the Grand Recorder for a nomination form.
- 3. Read the instructions on the reverse side of the form, fill it out, and forward the form directly to the Grand Commander, Andrew R. Jackson, 4082 W. Morgantown Rd., Greenwood, IN 46142.

The nomination form must be in the hands of the Grand Commander prior to February 1, 2008. Incomplete forms and those mailed after that date will not be considered. Your Commandery should consider those submitted previously but who did not receive the award at that time.

This General Order shall be read at the first Stated Conclave of each Constituent Commandery following its receipt and the action so noted in the minutes.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237½ of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
 - (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
 - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider all nominations made by Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in any one year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
 - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by him to the Grand Master.
- (5) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof.

The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the Commandery uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate of Award shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall be the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof shall be sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

153rd CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 153rd Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel East, Indianapolis. The Sir Knights of Baldwin Commandery No. 2, the home Commandery of the Right Eminent Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave.

The lines were formed by Raper Commandery No. 1, under the direction of S. K. George D. Kivett, KCT, KCTH and HPGC. Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S. K. Irvin L. Bitting, KCT, PGC, George A. Ingles, Jr., KCT, PGC and Harrison E. Lackey, KCT, KTCH, HPGC. Inspecting officer was S. K. Lawrence E. Tucker, Right Eminent Grand Recorder and Personal Representative of S.K. Richard Bernard Baldwin, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States of America. Also present was Right Eminent Department Commander of the East Central Department of the Grand Encampment, S. K. Franklin C. Boner and S. K. Steven J. Barton., R. E. Past Department Commander for the East Central Department of the Grand Encampment, United States of America. In addition, S. K. Robert E. Price, K.G.C., Honorary Past Department Commander was in attendance. S. K. Robert G. Elrod, 33rd, Deputy for Indiana for the Supreme Council, 33rd, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction; S. K. William J. Fox, 33rd, Active for Indiana for the Supreme Council, 33rd, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction; S. K. James Barkdull, Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Indiana; and Sir Knight Duane L. Vaught, Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Indiana were present and took an active part in all of the proceedings.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 36 were present, 6 were absent, 7 were excused and 1 open for appointment. The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 139 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 12 for the year 2006 with 202 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Holy Land pilgrimage Committee report again showed that due to the unrest in the Middle East, the Grand Encampment canceled the 2007 pilgrimage. If all goes well this year, the hopes are that they will be able to again make the trip in 2008.

The Educational Loan Foundation Committee reported that 1 loan of \$3,000.00 was made during the year and that outstanding loans totaled \$43,731.40 at year's end. There was 1 loan paid off last year totaling \$10,500.00. The decision by the Education Foundation Board to offer a scholarship this year came to fruition. Steven J. Barton, PGC, PDC presented a check in the amount of \$5,000 to Wayne E. Pruner, Director of Planned and Major Gifts at the Christian Theological Seminary for the benefit of our first scholarship recipient, Terri Thorn. She is a second year Masters of Divinity student. The Educational Foundation has committed to give \$5,000 in scholarship money to CTS for the next 2 years after which we will re-evaluate our progress.

The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and H.E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 received the traveling award for selling the most ads.

Forty-Five Sir Knights, Ladies and guests attended the Easter Sunrise trip to Washington, DC. Our first stop was Philadelphia where we had a private tour of the major historical district. We then toured the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania building. This was a real highlight for all of us as this is one of the most beautiful Masonic buildings in existence. It took forty years to build, with all volunteer labor. We then traveled to Washington, D.C., and the Indiana delegation, joined by a number of others, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery. Due to the inclement weather and a scheduling problem, Grand Master Richard B. Baldwin was unable to assist in the wreath laying. Three Sir Knights traveling with us were honored by being chosen to assist Grand Commander Rodney A. Mann with the wreath laying ceremonies. The Easter sunrise service was also held indoors because of the very cool weather.

ELECTIONS: The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate except for No.'s 37. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Grand Commander's "Christmas Message"

The Christmas season is a wonderful time of the year for Christians throughout the world, especially for the Knights Templar to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Christmas music often starts with the Thanksgiving celebration. Songs of Santa and his elves plus the reindeer make the young children and we older children grin from ear to ear. But there is another Christmas song that brings the real meaning of Christmas home to all of us. *Silent Night* is my favorite and this is the story of its birth.

It was Christmas Eve of 1818, in the old Austrian village of Oberndorf. Throughout the village, people were readying themselves for the much-anticipated Christmas Eve service at St. Nicholas Church and the beautiful music of the season. The children's choir had come to the church for rehearsal, but found the old organ had played its last note. Franz Gruber, the organist, and Father Joseph Mohr, the young priest was very upset, as there would be no beautiful organ music this Christmas Eve. The children returned to their homes very disappointed.

Father Mohr had always loved music. He earned his way through school by playing the guitar. As his small room in the house of the church sexton was stuffy, he opened his window for a breath of fresh air. The snow-covered valley lay silent under the stars. These were the same stars that had shone the night Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Father Mohr closed his window and sat down at his desk. He would try to write a little song that every child and adult would understand. He would tell how the shepherds watched over their flocks by night, the glorious light, and the angel who announced the birth of the Son of God. If he could write the song and have Franz Gruber compose a melody, it would save the Christmas Eve service. Father Mohr wrote six verses.

When he finished, he headed for the Gruber home. After being welcomed, downing some gingerbread and cider, Father Mohr read his words to Franz. After hearing the words, Franz smiled and said; "I will try".

The priest and the organist were waiting in St. Nicholas when the young singers arrived. He told them of the new song and gave them some instructions. "Herr Gruber and I will sing in harmony and you will join in on the last two lines:

'Schlafe in himmlischer Ruh.' Now listen."

Father Mohr played a few chords on his guitar. Then they began to sing: "Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht....." It was the first time *Silent Night* had ever been heard. The tenor voice of the priest carried the melody, and the organist's deep voice sang in harmony.

Soon it was time for the service to begin. The church filled with families from the village. They seemed puzzled. The candles were glowing, but no organ music. Before starting the service, Father Mohr explained what had happened. Then he announced that he had a surprise for them. Many people raised their eyebrows when they saw the guitar. After all, a guitar in church was unheard of.

However, Father Mohr's guitar had never sounded better and the melody of the new carol opened the hearts of young and old alike. At the end of the service, everyone said to Father Mohr and Herr Gruber to be sure to include their new carol next year, and that they all wanted to sing it.

And so my word of mouth, the new carol passed from village to village and soon from country to country. The authors were soon forgotten, but the song lived on and on.

Joseph Mohr and Franz Gruber gave the world one of its very best Christmas songs. Every Christmas in a special little chapel in Oberndorf, people of all races gather to hear *Silent Night* sung as it was for the first time so many years ago, by two voices accompanied by a simple guitar. This is their way to say thank you.

And so let us all keep *Silent Night* in our hearts as we attend church and sing praises to our Lord.

Grand Prelate's Christmas Message 2007

John wrote: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

About 15 years ago, I was required to create a personal statement of faith, a valuable process which forces a person to examine not only what he or she believes but also how he or she sees God.

Christ taught us to address God as "Father," but the word Christ used, "abba," has more the flavor of "daddy" than of "father;" someone you can run to and get a hug. At the time I wrote my statement of faith I was the father of a young man who had just entered middle school. As I was a father trying to raise my son, I thought of myself as a son, who God was trying to raise. And it was then I began to see parallels.

As our son became older and entered a new stage in his education, we tried to loosen the reins, to give him more independence. So, instead of standing over him and insisting he do certain things at certain times under our direct supervision, we tried establishing a list of rules, which we posted on the refrigerator. At the top of the list, "Homework must be completed before the television is turned on."

You can imagine how well that went over. The only thing that changed was that instead of yelling at him about not doing his homework, we now yelled about his not following the rule which demanded he do his homework.

That was what was going on in my life when I wrote my statement of faith. And as I thought about how I was trying to raise my little addition to the human race, I began to see in the Bible the techniques God used to raise the entire human race.

I saw Him constantly interacting with His creations in the Garden of Eden, and I saw those creations seeking, taking independence. I saw Him trying punishment in the form of Noah's flood. I saw Him try a list of rules in the form of the writings of Moses. None of these techniques worked. So God tried something new; He sent us a big brother to love us and lead us by example.

And at this season, we celebrate the arrival of that "big brother," the birth of the baby who grew up to show us the way and to give his life that we might live. It defies all human logic that our savior should arrive as a baby. But luckily, God does not use human logic. He decided our savior, our "big brother," could only lead us if He experienced all that we experience; that He must be not only fully God but also fully human. Only thus would we follow His example.

So this season we celebrate a birth that took place more than 2,000 years ago. It happened in a backwards part of the Roman Empire, in a poor family that had no link to greatness except the earthly father had a family link to a powerful king who reigned a millennium earlier.

The Gospels tell us the baby grew up knowing somehow that he was different, knowing that he had a special mission. Somehow he acquired such knowledge of Scripture as to be addressed as "rabbi." Yet, he acquired none of the earthly trappings of success. He probably owned nothing beyond what he wore or carried. He traveled but a few miles from the place of his birth. He was executed for his teachings at 33 years of age. And during those few years probably only a few hundred people had ever heard him speak.

But he left behind disciples to spread the Good News. And in that good news we learned how he lived so that we could follow his example. We learned he died for us, bearing our sins that we would share eternal life with him.

Let us never forget that we as Knights Templar are each, in our own ways, Disciples of Christ, of Jesus, the big brother that God sent to us in the form of a baby to show us the way we should go.

"Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us."

This prayer is known as the Agnus Dei after its first three words in Latin, and has been a feature of the Catholic Mass for some 1,300 years. ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was surrendered.

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Wabash No. 37 – Chartered April 20, 1893. Chartered arrested April 10, 2008, and merged into St. Anselm, U.D.

Bluffton No. 38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne No. 4.

Delphi No. 40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette No. 3.

Lebanon No. 43 – Chartered April 20, 1899. Charter surrendered August 15, 2000 and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

New Castle No. 44 Chartered April 19, 1900, Charter surrendered January 1, 2006 and merged with Knightstown No. 9.

Princeton No. 46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette No. 15.

Brazil No. 47 – Chartered May 12, 1904, Charter surrendered April 21, 2006 and merged with Greencastle No. 11.

Rushville No. 49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville No. 6.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941,

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006).

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
