Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

William H. Koon II, GCT M. E. Grand Master (2007 - 2012) of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar President of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc.

S.K. Koon was born in Lima, Ohio on March 12, 1949 to William H. and Vivian Brown Koon. He is a graduate of Bath High School, and attended the Ohio State University. He is a member of the Columbus Grove United Church of Christ. Bill is married to Elizabeth Jane Thornley, and they reside less than a mile from the family farm where he grew up near Columbus Grove, Ohio. They have a daughter, Andrea Koon Gillespie; son-in-law, Adam Gillespie; two grandsons, Adam Kade Gillespie, Silas Robert Gillespie; and son, William Steven Winebrenner. Bill is the President of Lord's Enterprises Inc. and Republic Mills Inc., both family agri-businesses including, livestock feed manufacturing, grain elevators, and a farming operation. He is involved in many professional and civic organizations, both locally, and statewide.

Masonically, Bill is a Senior DeMolay of Fidelity Chapter in Lima, and holds the Chevalier, Cross of Honor, Active Legion of Honor, is an Active Member of the International Supreme Council Order of DeMolay, and in 2006 was invested with the DeMolay Grand Cross. He was raised a Master Mason in 1970 in Ada Lodge No. 344, and demitted to Rufus Putnam Lodge No. 364 in Columbus Grove, where he served 3 years as Worshipful Master. In 2001 he became a dual member of Ft. Amanda Lodge No. 706 in Lima. He is a Past High Priest of Lima Chapter No. 49 RAM, and Past Illustrious Master of Lima Council No. 20 R&SM. In 2008 Bill was appointed the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Romania R&SM near the Grand Council of Ohio. He was Knighted in Shawnee Commandery No. 14 by his father on March 13, 1971, and was elected Eminent Commander in 1980. He is a member of Shawnee Commandery No. 14 Drill Team, marching in 7 Triennial Drills beginning in Chicago in 1973, including twice as Captain. He is a member, and Charter Commander of St. George Commandery No. 76, Ivanhoe Commandery No. 54, Van Wert, OH, St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, Denver, CO, Frankfort Commandery No. 4, Frankfort, KY, and Blaney Commandery No. 5, Tremont, IL. In addition to Ohio, Bill is a member and voting delegate of the Grand Commanderies of Ohio, Colorado, Illinois, and Kentucky. In 2006, Bill was elected an Honorary Member of the Wyoming Black Horse Troop.

Sir Knight Koon first served the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio, as an Aidede-Camp to S.K. William J. Faul, KCT, during his term as Grand Commander and received the Meritorious Service Award for his efforts in 1981. Bill served the First Division of the Grand Commandery of Ohio as Deputy Division Commander from 1985 - 1987, and was appointed Grand Sentinel by Sir Knight Frank W. Crane, KCT, REGC in 1987. He was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio on September 13, 1996. In 2007 he was declared a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio and its Jurisdiction, PHA. In 2009 he was made an Honorary Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Virginia. In June 2009 he was elected an Honorary Past Commander of King Ferdinand Commandery No. 1 in Bucharest, Romania, and at the LXIV Triennial he was elected an Honorary Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Romania, which was the first official action taken after the formation of that Grand Commandery.

Bill served the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA, as a member of the Easter Sunrise Breakfast Committee, and an ad-hoc member of the Committee on Drill Regulations from 1991 - 1994, and was Co-Chairman of the Committee on Drill Regulations during the

1994 - 1997 Triennium. He served 8 years as the personal Aide to S.K. Ned E. Dull, GCT, MEPGM of the Grand Encampment, and as the Affinity Coordinator for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation MasterCard program from 1991 to 1999. Bill was invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple by the Grand Encampment in 1992, and is currently the Deputy for the Ohio KCT Program. He was appointed Department Commander of the East Central Department for the 1997 - 2000 Triennium. Bill was elected Right Eminent Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment on August 15, 2000 in Nashville, Tennessee. Upon Installation into that Office, he was invested with the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple. On August 16, 2006, he was installed as Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment. In 2007, he was appointed Grand Representative of the Great Priory of the United Masonic, Religious and Military Orders of The Temple and Sepulcher and of The Hospital of Saint-John of Jerusalem and of Palestine, Rhodes and Malta for France near the Grand Encampment, and in 2009 was advanced to the Honor and Dignity of the Knight Grand Cross (pro causa). Upon the resignation of S.K. Richard B. Baldwin, GCT, MEGM on August 28, 2007 for reasons of health, he was installed as Most Eminent Grand Master by S.K. Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. On August 18, 2009, he was elected by acclamation as Most Eminent Grand Master for the LXV Triennium, and was installed the next day, again by Sir Knight Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. Five Days later he was made an Honorary Member and Honorary Past Supreme Grand Master of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada.

Illustrious Brother Koon is a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Toledo and a dual member of the Valley of Dayton, receiving the Thirty-Third Degree from the Supreme Council Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, NMJ, in Grand Rapids on September 23, 1997. In June, 2004 he was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Valley of Toledo, and in 2008 was elected Chairman. In 2007 he was made an Honorary Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) of the Valley of New Orleans, Louisiana.

He is a member of appendant organizations including, Royal Order of Scotland; Zenobia Temple AAONMS of Toledo, OH, their Crusader Unit, and the Lima Shrine Club; Charter Sovereign and current Recorder of Charlemagne Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine in Lima, OH, Dual Member of Holy Grail Conclave, in Dayton, OH, Honorary Member of St. Leonard Conclave, in Jackson MS, St. Hilary Conclave, Ft. Wayne, IN, Lafayette Conclave, Athens, OH, St. Columba Conclave, Cincinnati, OH, and served the United Grand Imperial Council of the Red Cross of Constantine as Grand Herald 1999 - 2000, Intendant General at Large 2002 -2003, and was invested with the Knight Commander of Constantine by the Imperial Council RCC of France in 2007; Past Preceptor of Prince of Peace Tabernacle X, HRAKTP, Past Grand Preceptor of the Grand College of America, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, and awarded the GC (Grand Cross) of the Order, One of Five Honorary Members of the Grand College of Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, York, England, and recipient of their Certificate of Merit. In 2009 he was Knighted in Rose of Sharon Priory No. 2, Knights of the York Cross of Honor and advanced to the rank and dignity of Knight Grand Cross of the York Cross of Honor with one Quadrant. He is an honorary member of Lily of the Valley Priory No. 1. Bill was the Charter and Past Chief Adept, IX° Grade, Ohio College SRICF, Honorary Member of Illinois College, New Jersey College, and Wisconsin College SRICF, in 1998 he was elected Junior Deputy Supreme Magus, and invested with the rank and title of Knight Grand Cross (KGC), and on February 8, 2007, he was elected Supreme Magus of the High Council SRICF, and on February 7, 2008 was awarded the Knight Grand Cross (KGC) of the former SRIG (Societas Rosicruciana in Gallia), he has been honored as an Honorary Past Supreme Magus of the SRIC (Societas Rosicruciana in Canada), and SRIR (Societas

INSPECTING OFFICER SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT RIGHT EMINENT GRAND CAPTAIN GENERAL, OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA



SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT, P.G.C. (IN) Right Eminent Grand Captain General

Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. He graduated from North Montgomery High School and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In December 2000 he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm, during which time he was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. Since 1995 he has been with Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C. in Bloomington IN. Since October 2008 he has been president of that firm. Professionally, not-for-profit entities are his primary specialty. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants.

His Masonic history began on April 30, 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Vaught was initiated, passed and raised a Master Mason in Montgomery Lodge, no. 50, in Crawfordsville IN. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1993 receiving the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. He served on several Grand Lodge committees and was appointed as the Grand Representative of Oregon. He was elected the 157th Most Worshipful Grand Master of Indiana for 2007 – 2008. In May 2008 he was elected a Trustee of the Grand Lodge and in 2009 became president of the board of Trustees.

Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry in 1977. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon and in 2007 the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Arkansas.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service and Knight Commander of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught was later appointed to the finance committee of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Vaught is a Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and has served as Secretary of his council for the last ten years. He is currently chairmen of the Grand Council AMD finance committee.

Duane Vaught is currently serving as Puissant Sovereign of St Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and as an officer of St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross, of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSCRIF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Knights of Pythias, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, and Indiana Past Commanders Association. In 2005 he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, NMJ. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

In August 2007 he was appointed and installed to the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment KT when that office became vacant upon the regretted resignation, due to health, of Grand Master Richard B. Baldwin and the advancement of the other members of the Grand Encampment line.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) I recommend that the Grand Commandery hold two Templar Academies or leadership development classes, one in the North and one in the South.

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Indiana:

The Permanent Funds of the Grand Commandery are invested through Raymond James & Associates, Inc. The Trustees reviewed the investment account in March 2010 with representatives of Raymond James & Associates, Inc. The funds are invested in a moderate growth account with a ten year investment horizon. The fund consists of Mutual Funds, Cash & Equivalents. During the past 12 months, the funds have increased in value by 39.012% to \$272,244. The fund has outperformed the S&P 500 by 5% per year since 2007 when the funds were reinvested with Raymond James & Associates, Inc. The account is down in value by 3% since December 31, 2007.

The Grand Commandery withdrew \$10,000 for operations this Templar year. The Trustees directed Raymond James & Associates, Inc. to keep the investments in the moderate growth account with a ten year investment horizon.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 2010

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through July 30, 2010, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

 - b. Meet with them as a Commandery or by yourself.

- b. Show them they are valuable members to the Commandery
- c. Give them something to do other than as an Officer.

New pamphlets have been passed out as we visited throughout the state. The <u>Battalion Commanders</u> visit all Lodges in our respective Battalions, as well as the Commandery. Knights Templar Educational Foundation Committee Report

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Commandery Officers, and Sir Knights:

After much discussion two years ago, the Educational Foundation Committee, decided to discontinue giving loans to students and began awarding scholarships. Initially one scholarship will be given. Eventually, we hope to award two, one will go to a student who is studying to be a minister of the Christian faith and the second would go to a teacher or teachers who are expanding their education in mathematics or science. The amount of each would be \$5000.00

Also, it was decided that we would enter into a three year agreement with Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) to supply a \$5000.00 scholarship for a student who is working on a master degree in divinity. CTS assumed the responsibility to research the needs of their best students and present to the committee a deserving student. Last year we presented the third scholarship to CTS and the committee is now looking at a new Theological Seminary to support. It appears, as of this writing, we will support

a Seminary up near the Fort Wayne area. This new Seminary will also assume the responsibility to research the needs of their best students and present to the committee a deserving student.

The second scholarship remains a more difficult to present, because the committee felt that we did not have the ability to select the teacher or teachers for the second \$5000.00 award. We have discovered the Indiana Department of Education does not have a "clearinghouse" that can help us in selecting deserving teachers for this award in math and science. It is the wish of the committee that during the coming year we can decide on a method of solving this problem, however, with our savings being reduced by the effects of the economy, we have decided to put this on hold until things improve.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT FOR 2010

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Distinguished East, and fellow Sir Knights:

The finance committee recognizes we are a part of the York Rite and we all need to share in its financial needs. We also recognize we are a part of the Grand Encampment and they are the reason we exist as they are where our charter is from. Without them we have neither charter nor Knights Templar in Indiana.

The last five years have been troubling times. Many friends are no longer employed and are looking for work. Those working and were planning on retiring in the past couple of years or the next five are now trying to keep the job they have in order to keep up with the loses in their 401Ks and retirement funds. Social Security recipients for the first time in twenty years have not seen an increase in their checks when they arrive. Grand Encampment caused a large increase in our dues in 2006. The past two years, the Grand Chapter and Grand Council have found it necessary to increase the dues for our York Rite. We applaud them for their efforts and hope they have a long range plan to secure the future of each Grand and subordinate body. Your finance committee has been aware of those events and has been holding back in hopes of a recovery of our Permanent Fund. In the past your Grand Commandery has taken as part of the budget between \$10 and \$15,000 from that fund to operate the Grand Commandery each year. In 2006 we passed legislation to insure our long term viability of the Permanent Fund by requiring \$1.00 of each members dues be placed in the Permanent Fund. The fund must remain above certain moving levels contributed to it to with-draw funds from it. In 2006 we did not draw from the Fund but used the operating money we had on hand. In 2007, 8, and 9, we all know what happened to the market. Our fund is now \$40 to \$50,000 below the level where we can with-draw from it.

Your finance committee is proposing the following to recover and a five year plan to insure future growth.

- 1. Increase Knighting fees to the Grand Commandery from \$10.00 to \$20.00. [vote to change IN Law]
- 2. Increase dues by .50 each year to make up for loses in membership. [This increase must be voted on each year at this annual session.]
- 3. Suspend section 612 of the Grand Commandery Law, requiring \$1.00 per member be place in the permanent fund, for a period of 5 years. [vote to change IN Law]
- 4. Place addition funds [decreasing for five years] in the Life Membership Plan to help with the recent increase of Grand Encampment and Grand Commandery dues increases.
- 5. Institute a \$5.00 assessment on all dues paying members to include Life Members for a period of five years.

While the above isn't an insurance policy for everything which may happen, it will give the Grand Commandery the funds necessary to operate for the next five years, with some funds for cash reserve. It will also give time for the market to recover and we are hopeful the Permanent Fund will have in

excess of \$300,000 as it was in 2006. This will give us the necessary \$15,000.00 to operate a well run Grand Commandery in future years without any further dues increases.

RESOLUTION

Temporary omit part of Permanent Fund Requirements Increase Knighting Fees

Whereas Section 610 Reads:

SECTION 610 (403). The revenues of the Grand Commandery shall consist of fees (1) for Charters issued to Commanderies within its jurisdiction, which shall be the sum of \$100.00, (2) a fee of \$10.00 for each Knight Templar created therein and (3) an annual per capita an annual per capita as approved each year at the preceding annual Grand Conclave, plus such annual per capita amount as shall from time to time be assessed by the Grand Encampment, K. T., U. S. A., upon each member thereof, and (4)

all fees and dues that may be charged to or provided to be paid by the Commanderies and the members thereto to the Grand Commandery, all of which shall be paid on or before the lst day of February each year; also said revenues shall consist of interest and profits on deposits and invested funds. Provided, that Commanderies may remit by vote at a Stated Conclave the dues of any member having attained a record of 50 years as a Knight Templar and the Commandery shall not be required to pay Grand Commandery dues upon such members whose dues shall be thus remitted. (Revised April 2006)

Nor shall the Commandery be required to pay to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation the assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of their inability to pay dues. (Section 19 Grand Encampment 1961.) The Commandery shall be required to pay to the Grand Commandery the annual Knights Templar Eye Foundation assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of 50 years of membership. (1992)

Whereas the membership continues to decline and expenses increase therefore section 610 shall read

SECTION 610 (403). The revenues of the Grand Commandery shall consist of fees (1) for Charters issued to Commanderies within its jurisdiction, which shall be the sum of \$100.00, (2) a fee of \$20.00 for each Knight Templar created therein and (3) an annual per capita an annual per capita as approved each year at the preceding annual Grand Conclave, plus such annual per capita amount as shall from time to time be assessed by the Grand Encampment, K. T., U. S. A., upon each member thereof, and (4) all fees and dues that may be charged to or provided to be paid by the Commanderies and the members thereto to the Grand Commandery, all of which shall be paid on or before the 1st day of February each year; also said revenues shall consist of interest and profits on deposits and invested funds. Provided, that Commanderies may remit by vote at a Stated Conclave the dues of any member having attained a record of 50 years as a Knight Templar and the Commandery shall not be required to pay Grand Commandery dues upon such members whose dues shall be thus remitted. (Revised April 2006)

Nor shall the Commandery be required to pay to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation the assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of their inability to pay dues. (Section 19 Grand Encampment 1961.) The Commandery shall be required to pay to the Grand Commandery the annual Knights Templar Eye Foundation assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of 50 years of membership. (1992)

Whereas Section 612 Reads:

SECTION 612 (**Resolution No.7.**) For each member subject to, and for which per capita fees are received, \$1.00 of the per capita of this Grand Commandery shall be paid into the Permanent Investment Fund of this Grand Commandery in order to partially finance the operations of this Grand Commandery.

The permanent and un-expendable portion of the fund shall be \$279,096.00 as of December 31, 2005 plus all per capita fees and contributions contributed to the fund after that date.

Each year, beginning with the 2007-2008 Grand Commandery year, the permanent fund shall transfer to the general fund, for operations, five percent (5%) of the previous calendar year end value of the permanent fund except that such transfer shall be limited as follows. The maximum annual transfer shall be no more than the amount that would reduce the permanent fund as of the previous calendar year end to the permanent, un-expendable balance of the fund. (Revised April 2006)

Whereas our Permanent Investment Fund has declined by 35% in the past, and while recovery is expected in the future. Section 612 shall be suspended during the years of 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014.

GRAND INSPECTOR GENERAL REPORT

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of Indiana,

I would like to direct your attention to pages 35 and 36 in the advanced proceedings. You see on the far right of the pages are a ritual total score. I would like to explain that that score is the total score of open close score and the ritual score. All the ritual work is now being scored as part of the total score. What we intended to do this year was to try to achieve parity across the state so there was no difference in how the inspections was run be it New Albany or be it Hammond the same criteria was used to judge each Commandery. We did that by revising the form to achieve that parity and try to instruct the Battalion Commanders on how we wanted that work done and how we want it scored. I really believe we did achieve parity because if you go down and look at the right hand column you will see that there is very little difference in the scores. You can compare your score with that of the Battalion or in a different Battalion, or the entire state. The next thing we want to look at is the activity scores. The total activity scores point out two important things one is we need more activities. But you may be aware that there are many things you can do to improve that score. I think one of the greatest things you can do is community involvement. We need to get the members involved. If they don't want to do ritual work, Why not get them involved in charity in the community? We need to get involve locally and we need to get involved in the community, I think that's a real good opportunity. Included in that total score is a column called leadership. This is where it all begins Sir Knights it begins with leadership and under leadership we have two different categories. A one year plan and a five year plan. The one year plan is what you are going to use to the year you are commander. But the real important one is the five year plan. This is where you have the finical plan, how you're going to have your Commandrey plan for the finance for the next five years. You also need a membership plan; they don't just walk in the door how do you get them? The condition of your equipment, does it need repaired or replaced? How are you going to do that? These are thing that need to be in your five year plan. I am happy to report that the number of Commandery who has a five year plan is higher this year so I am glad to see that. I would like to thank Sir Stanton Davis, Sir Knight Wayne Sheets and the Battalion Commanders who helped compile this report.

REMARKS FROM A MINISTER WHO TRAVELED TO THE HOLY LAND Reverend Amanda Hines of the First Christian Church of Richmond Indiana

Thank you. It is a joy to be here with you, to have an opportunity to express my appreciation for the amazing gesture you have given me, the trip to the Holy Land. I want to share a few things about that trip and I know I can't share it all. I will just pick a couple. One of the ways that I have been able to share this trip with the congregation is with pictures. We have a screen we use during worship and every chance I get to sneak one of the pictures in, I do that. We have pictures of the sights of the scriptures. This coming Sunday, the scripture we are using is John 21 which is the story of Jesus appearing after the resurrection by the Sea of Galilee. It's an amazing story of how the Disciples come ashore and they came, and they eat a meal and sit with Jesus and when Jesus walked along the shore with Peter and said "feed my sheep". I have a few pictures of that. That will be used to help people visualize what it looked like and the place where these things happened.

Other ways are of seeing is a first century tomb. I took a few pictures of tombs and one of them is a first century tomb I show during Easter with the children's moment. We show the picture of a big empty room, this is what it looked like. I said it was a great big rock and it was rolled out of the way and this is what it looked like. It helped to give the children of the congregation a visual picture of the image. But it's also changed the way that I read scripture. I read about a place and I can now see that place. There are Churches built on many of these sites. So it not just the site we are seeing when we see these places, it's the faith of the many generations which came before. So a church that may have been built two hundred years after Christ, pretty close to a site to mark a place, where people have journey throughout the centuries and prayed there and remembered the stories. So that's part of that experience for me and so I go back, every time I read one of the stories about that location.

There are certain pictures I wanted to talk about. When I first got back that Sunday, we were starting a study about in Church called Unbinding Your Heart and it is an experience in prayer. So there's a great big prayer wall right in the gathering area, of our church, where people would come in and put our prayer concerns. In Jerusalem I got to see the Prayer Wall, and got to experience the Prayer Wall. So I had pictures I brought back about the Prayer Wall and a nice piece of art that I brought back that showed the Prayer Wall. When I was there I prayed at the Prayer Wall and I prayed several different prayers and wrote them down on a slip of paper and you see pictures of people putting them in the Prayer Wall. I got to do that. I put prayers in the wall. One of those prayers was for you. I have a copy of that prayer and I have a copy of that here with me and I want to read that prayer to you and I want to tell what they do with these prayers. Three or four time a year, the prayer wall is cleaned out to make more room for people to put more prayers there. They take the prayers. They don't burn them and they don't just throw them away. They bury the prayers on the Mt of Olives. So the prayer that is there for you will one day be removed and buried on the Mt. of Olives. This is my prayer for you; Thank you Lord for the Knights Templar and for the work they do. Thanks for their commitment to bring pilgrims to Israel and for the very generous journey they provided me and the group that came with me. Thanks especially for Knights Templar of Indiana, my sponsors. May my experience become a blessing to others as it has been a blessing to me. May you bless the Knights Templar in their work.

That is my prayer for you and in appreciation for the trip that I was able to take. Now back to the prayer wall at Church. The prayer wall has been removed, but one of the things I don't think you noticed yet Bob, but one of the things I just talked about at a meeting last week was continuing our prayer team that will remove the prayers from the wall and continuing to pray and continuing that Prayer Wall will take a different form we don't know yet what form it will take, but that is one thing we plan to continue at church is to continue a place to place our prayers.

One other thing I wanted to tell you about is two hundred years ago Napoleon left Israel and in the process burned Israel and all the greenery that made Galilee and the whole area so beautiful. He burned

it away, burned down to rock, to the limestone. One of the things Israel over the last 60 years has really worked hard to do is to make it green again and trees are being planted and Galilee is green again because of the great work that is being done in that effort. There is a forest for the Knights Templar where people have come, pilgrims have come and planted trees. I don't know you if have contributed to that or not but there is a whole forest green with trees from the Knights Templar. As part of our pilgrimage we had an opportunity to go there and to plant trees. Our leader Duane Kimberly from Ohio had been requested to plant 18 trees from the Knights Templers here in the United States but we also got invited to plant some additional trees, Our group planted including the 18, 64 trees, so there are now 64 trees in Israel that would not have been there were it not for our trip.

I want to tell you about Joppa, the place where we planted the trees. My family when I was young had a Christmas tree farm for a few years, and we would take a post digger and put a hole in the ground to put a little seedling in and cover it up. I was expecting that when we went out, that the hole was going to be ready for us when we walked out. The holes were already dug, however the hole was really big. So not only did we get to plant the tree but we got to put a lot of dirt back in the hole and then put the tree in and as I was looking over my shoulder as I was walking back in I thought some of these people didn't put enough dirt back in the hole. I am thinking what's going to happen with the first rain or when you water these trees? So I asked what are you going to do about these trees, is someone going to come back and fix them? He said "Oh Yea you know that money you paid to plant those trees"? It's not for planting the tree, it's to pay the people to come and fix the holes so the trees will live". So these trees will likely live despite the big holes.

Another thing we were told is there are rocks out in the fields. There are rocks all over the place, big rocks some of them are right beside the holes and we were told don't move the rocks. You know why you don't move the rocks? There are snakes under the rocks. So I tried to walk as far away from the rocks as possible.

With this opportunity to plant trees, I planted one tree in your honor. So there is one tree planted in your honor with the many trees in the Knights Templar Forest in Israel.

One thing our tour guide said to us when we left was we had put down roots, the tree roots; we have put down roots in Israel. You have also put down roots in Israel.

So I want to thank you, I have a certificate that a tree was planted in honor of you in Israel and a copy of the prayer in case you would like that. The certificate was received by Sir Knight Bobby Frazer, Thank you so much for the amazing opportunity.

REMARKS FROM SIR KNIGHT DUANE L. VAUGHT Most Worshipful Past Grand Master of Indiana Right Eminent Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar USA and Inspecting Officer

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Most Worshipful Grand Master, and friends: I begin of course by bringing you greeting on behalf of our Most Worshipful Grand Master William Howard Koon II often introduced as the sequel. I want to recognize and thank the attendance of the Grand Encampment Staff that are here today. Right Eminent Department Commander Robert Cronk, thank you for coming over from Illinois. Our very own Steve Barton, Past Department Commander who was here. Steve Nelson Past Department Commander, from North Central who is with us this weekend. As you heard mentioned earlier he is so far the only announced candidate for the office of Grand Captain General at the next triennial. He has brochures and they look very good and I have told him I only heard one complaint and that was that running marathons may not set a good example. But it takes all kinds. It takes all kinds.

I have said again and again how much Freemasonry and Templary mean to me and how fortunate I am to be able to come to event, like this. But I am also proud of my home state, I have been able to go to a lot of Conclaves in different states and you know, they are all good, but some are better. Without putting anybody else down, let me make note of a couple of things which are particularly pride worthy here in Indiana. One is the participation and corporation of our membership. Now I will go to some Conclaves and members will be in parties, not good parties with food and drink but bad parties. Like Washington DC, where people from this region, are distrustful of people from that region. Or people who will follow leaders in one area but not trust the leaders in another area of the state. Around Indiana I don't see those actions much. By enlarge; the people in this room are loyal and committed to the success of this organization. While you may not always agree, but then the next question if you are a disagreeable sort of person, you probably agree, with the person you disagreed with, the person you just disagreed with, a minute ago, and are now found someone else to disagree with. You are not trying to block, you are trying to do what's best for the organization. You listen to the reports and you may agree or disagree, but you have faith that the officers leading this organization are also doing what they think is best. They are trying their best to give you a good Grand Commandery and a good Order of Templary in this state. Some time it takes doing things we don't enjoy like getting up at 5:00 in the morning. Sometimes I don't enjoy that but I do it. Some of you did that to get here in time for the session. Sometimes it means putting out some extra money you could have spent for something to go to an extra movie. I don't know. It's not like \$5.00 is a lot of money. It's just sometime we talk like it is. I think Indiana has a finance committee that spent a hard bit of time figuring out what can we do? What do we have to do? They don't just say well let's just ask for more money. No, they held off a year or two trying to ease these things in, trying to work it out. When they get to the point of like nope this is what we need to do. They have the honesty to stand up and tell you the truth. To tell you straight up the facts and put it on a screen and invite questions. I think part of the reason the members in Indiana, be it Grand Commandery or Grand Lodge have this spirit of corporation is because we know our leaders are being honest with you and they are trying to do the right thing. That gives us a lot better opportunity to move ahead than if we spend our time distrusting each other. Then we can move on to other fun and other kinds of parties, the ones that do have food and beverages.

Now, it's coming up on three years that I have been Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment and this is the third time I have been here as Grand Captain General at this conclave. On two of these occasions, I have been the inspecting officer. One other time and now today, I am the Representative for the Grand Master and therefore get to give more than a thirty second speech. I give many speeches. I have my material and many of you who have to give speeches know that you when you have good

material you use it routinely. The speech you heard when I was here the last time, I've used in a bunch of other states. I was thinking do I gave them that again because after all I have been practicing it and it has been two years. But I decided maybe you could be of better service as my test subject for new material. Maybe when I go to another state where I have already been once, maybe I need to give them a different speech to, so I can of build up a little catalog of speeches. So you get to choose some new material and you get to judge whether this is bonus or a burden but if you think it's a burden you need not tell me about it.

There is a song I like by Pink Floyd. It starts with "Ticking away the moments that make up a dull day you flitter and waste the hours in an offhand way. Kicking around a piece of ground in your home town. Waiting for somebody or something to show you the way". So I want to ask you, did you waste your time today? If any of any of you feel you have wasted your time by being here today? Well I am sorry for that, because that is genuinely sad. I'll tell you that for myself, I think it is a privilege to get to come to things like this conclave, and be with our brothers and Sir Knights. Was it a waste of time, did you accomplish anything today? Maybe you didn't make any money being here. Would you have been better off to have gone to a movie, or spend the day watching television? I think this is a pretty good use of time. But the song also tells us, if are we doing anything positive, and we had a good time it was not a waste. Are you in your individual sphere be it the weight we are going to put on the next Grand Commander or the weight we are going to put on the new Sir Knight to learn the next ritual part. REMARKS BY THE MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER OF MASONS FOR THE STATE OF INDIANA CHARLES F. MARLOWE

Thank you Right Eminent Grand Commander, That's my speech. It is my please to be here today and I would like to introduce a couple of the Grand Lodge officers here today. The man who just took the pictures is Carl Culmann, he our Grand Flash or our Grand Photographer. Also we have George Weister our Grand Chaplin, Worshipful George Ingles, he is our Junior Grand Warden, and Most Worship Brother Duane Vaught was Grand Master in 2007 – 2008. It is my pleasure to be here today gentlemen, I listened to your proceeding, and I think you are on the right track. You are headed in the right direction. You even had a section on membership. Good for you, because a lot of Lodges don't even think about it. A lot of appendant bodies have lost sight of membership. As you have declining membership as we do, you must think about membership. One of the things I think you can do is to take a look at our web site. On the Grand Lodge web site to the members section. Put your Lodge number and your member number in and register. In the members section, we have created an education section. We have created little vinyets. You can draw off these videos intended to be educational information for lodge education programs. I would very much like to see all the appendant bodies in it. I know you have a video out there, and Grand Encampment has one. Your only opportunity to get members is from those who have already been raised, so those who are searching around looking for something to do that night, maybe they will see something about DeMolay that night, or Scottish Rite or Royal Arch, but why not make it the Commandery. So when someone is out there looking for some Masonic education to present to the Lodge, it can put the Commandery in a very good light.

I want to relate to you a letter I received from a young Mason with some complaints about how Masonry exists, and I think that we can fix it. He joined when he was 21, he went thru the fraternity. He received his first three degrees, and in his first paragraph he ask what happened to the fellowship? Good point. There are Lodges where fellowship is just lost. It's just not there. He talked about being raised to the sublime degree and not being ready for it. Not being prepared to be raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason. I found that interesting but at the same time, I have to think about my experiences in the Lodges over the last few years and there are a lot of Lodges I don't know maybe the majority where the candidate is simply unknowing about what we are doing and why we are doing it. What he going through and why he's doing it. It seems to me that we should have some kind of a program ahead of time to explain to this young man just exactly what he's going through. To me it doesn't matter whether it is the Grand Commandery that put that program together at a Masonic event or Royal Arch or anybody else. It doesn't matter, the point is that this young man should be advised as to what is he going through, and why he's going through that. It should be his mentor but that's not something that's

always happening. So that's just something I thought I would throw out there for you to think about. Because then your member approach will have a take action part and I think that's appropriate You need to take action. You need to take action with the Blue Lodge its self. We may be in positive territory or we may not. It's very hard for me to tell because our number go from January to January and I serve from May to May, but I can tell you this, there is work in every Lodge I've been in and there is a lot of work in every Lodge I've been in.. I believe that that Blue Tsunami I talked about at my installation is just on it, so you should be in position to take advantage of it. Then you have to ask yourself, as a membership committee, what is our master plan? What are we trying to present? You have to have a message. If your message is that we are Christian part of Masonry then that is your message. But you have to put it in a format where you are not imposing on admission into the Lodge itself. I think that could be easily accomplished. Then you need to test yourself to see if you have accomplished your own goals. Set a goal and see if you can reach that goal and test yourself and if you don't reach that goal you need to find out why because then you will be able to re-establish goals and have incite about how to better succeed. Past failure is how you improve for the future. Now in our open houses, I was hoping to have everybody represented, and in many, Knights Templar was represented. I think they did OK out there. They were able to get out there and get their message across. There's going to be another open house this year. With the new Grand Master, I think that's a wonderful opportunity for you to be there to get your message out there, some time a pamphlet no matter how good it looks isn't going to answer all the questions. These are young men who want to see something electronic. They want to it in a format they understand. We have gone to great lengths to develop this web site. It was started a couple of years ago probably during your year Duane, Even before that. It has taken all this time to get it to this point, so it's an involved process and very sophisticated web site so take advantage of it. If you have one you want to link into it, contact the Grand Lodge to make that happen.

This young man goes on to say, which I think is appropriate, that we need Masonic education as Masons and to continue our reasons for coming to Lodge. A consistent reminder is the fact that as Masons we can never have too much illumination, no matter what degree we hold. This is a young man. What he is saying, is I am into this light but I don't think the search should ever end. To me there is an opportunity for all of us to provide to all our young Masons the kind of education young men want. So that as we get older and begin to back out of these things, these young men will step up and do the same thing for the next generation coming up.

Don't be afraid of change. You have to change to survive, because if you are afraid of change, you are going to be afraid of being irrelevant. And if your numbers drop to low, you are just going to be irrelevant

I want to think you for this opportunity to be with you the hospitality and you have shown me. And thank you for the efforts you have shown because this helps Blue Lodge Masonry. Every time you bring somebody in, it brings a good light on Masonry. Again thank you for your hospitality, and I appreciate your time.



Monday evening was set aside for the Indiana delegation to attend a state dinner. Dinner arrangements were made by our Grand Commander at an excellent restaurant within the Hotel Roanoke. The Grand Commander invited the delegation from South Dakota and Wisconsin to join us. We had a very nice size group for fellowship and dinner. A good time was had by all.

Tuesday morning, the elections were held and William H. Koon, II, GCT, Grand Master, was elected to a full term as Grand Master. David Dixon Goodwin, II, GCT, Deputy Grand Master, was elected to a full term as Deputy Grand Master, David Sid C. Dorris, III, GCT, Grand Generalissimo was elected to a full term as Grand Generalissimo and Duane L. Vaught, GCT, Grand Captain General, was elected to a full term as Grand Captain General. Lawrence E. Tucker was re-elected as Grand Recorder and James M. Wilson, Jr., GCT, GT was elected to a full term as Grand Treasurer.

On Tuesday, The Grand Commandery of Romania was chartered and the Grand Line was installed by SK Koon. These presentations were followed by special presentations of distinguished clothing to SK Koon. The African Sir Knights dressed up SK Koon as a King or leader of their country. We look forward to seeing pictures on the Grand Encampment web site. The Romanians also presented SK Koon with the uniform of their leadership and made him the first Honorary Grand Commander of Romania.

Legislation:

2009-01 Section 237(b) (a) Definition of KTCH Jewel: Amended on the floor to provide for jewel on the uniform vs. the jewel on a cord, worn around the neck. Both will be available: PASSED 8/17/2009.

2009-02 Section 41 (h) Definition of ending date for Annual Report: The Annual Reports will be compiled as of membership of December 31st. Annual reports will be automatically compiled from the new YARIS data base of membership: PASSED 8/17/2009.

2009-03 Section 19 No Sir Knight may be elected to the office of Grand Master or Deputy Grand Master who is a presiding officer in any other State or National Masonic Body: DEFEATED 8/18/2009.

2009-04 Section 10 and 120 Dual Members are excluded from Grand Encampment annual per-capita and assessments: DEFEATED 8/17/2009.

2009-05 Section 10 and 120 Any proposal to increase Grand Encampment per-capita must be held over to the next Triennial: DEFEATED 8/17/2009.

2009-06 Section 10 and 120: Add: "Except/however that no per-capita tax dues shall be levied upon any member of a Grand or Subordinate Commandery that has attained 50 years or more of service": DEFEATED 8/17/2009.

2009-07 Section 1.5 To add a mission statement to the Constitution: "The preeminent mission of this fraternal organization shall be the Support and Defense of the Christian Religion": WITHDRAWN 8/17/2009. (This would have implications with the tax code and defined us as a religious body).

2009-08 Section 237 (b) (d) Change the statute that defines the nomination process for the KTCH. "One nomination may be made from each Grand Commandery, regardless of number of members, plus one additional nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery for each 5,000 members or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year": PASSED 8/17/2009.

Tuesday was to finish up miscellaneous business followed by the Official Grand Master's Banquet. A wonderful steak and shrimp dinner was enjoyed.

Wednesday morning was set aside for the installation of the new Grand Encampment Officers. Indiana's Duane L. Vaught was installed as Right Eminent Grand Captain General and Austin C. Gray, Jr. was installed as Duane's Aide.

General Order No. 1 Brown

Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

- 1. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exceptions:
 - The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
 - A fellow Grand Line Officer will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- 2. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, and Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officers upon his arrival.
- 3. The records Inspection shall consist of:
 - A report on the membership efforts.
 - Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
 - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
 - Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 4. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 5. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer. The inspection process may be completed over two meetings, with one meeting for the Reception inspection and another meeting for the conferral of the Order of the Temple. The full inspection may be done in one day, if desired. All inspections must be complete by November 30, 2009.
- 6. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Reception and Order conferral. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.

- 7. An Inspection may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies participating together for an official inspection, when approved by the Battalion Commander. Points for the inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has <u>nine</u> (9) or more of its members present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander).
- 8. The participating Commanderies will open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form using the Ten Man or Twelve Man Opening in accordance with the most recent official interpretation of the Ritual and official Indiana Asylum Tactics. Fifty (50) points for a Closes Inspection and one-hundred (100) points for a public Reception will be added to the Activities Sheet for that Commandery or divided among the participating Commanderies.
 - A Commandery of Knights Templar shall be opened in Full Form with Rehearsal of Duties then closed (If the Order of the Temple is being done at another time).
 - Upon completion of each inspection and prior to closing, the Inspecting Officers shall give his remarks first, and then the Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official Representative, shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him, as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander will be the final speaker.
 - Violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a no score for your inspection and thus require an additional inspection scheduled by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.
 - The public may be invited into the Asylum while the Commandery:
 - The Commandery receives the Commander
 - The Commander receives Distinguished Guest
 - The sword manual is performed
 - The Commandery is inspected for uniform
 - The Triangle is formed
 - The United States Flag and lecture is given
- 9. The participating Commanderies will exemplify the Full Ceremonial of the Order of the Temple. Commanderies may separately or jointly confer the Ceremonies in accordance with one of the following options at the time and place with the consent of the Battalion Commander. The inspection of the Order of the Temple may occur anytime after May 1, 2009 and prior to November 30, 2009.
 - A single Commandery may perform the Order of the Temple for point as graded by the Order of Temple score sheet by the Battalion Commander and staff, if the majority of parts are filled by the inspected Commandery or Commanderies.
 - Same as above with the exception that up to three (3) Commanderies in the Battalion may participate with the points divided among the Commanderies based upon the level and percentage of participation.
 - An Instructional meeting may be held instead of any, or all, ritualistic work when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General, deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.
- 10. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report of each Commandery to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion

of the inspection. A full report of the Inspections will be discussed at the winter meeting and present for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.

- 11. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 12. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the
 new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him
 become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all
 questions that he and his family pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 1st of each year for the preceding year. "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237½ of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
 - (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
 - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider all nominations made by Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in any one year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
 - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by him to the Grand Master.
- (5) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof.

The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the Commandery uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate of Award shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall be the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof shall be sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Bluffton No. 38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne No. 4.

Delphi No. 40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette No. 3.

Lebanon No. 43 – Chartered April 20, 1899. Charter surrendered August 15, 2000 and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

New Castle No. 44 Chartered April 19, 1900, Charter surrendered January 1, 2006 and merged with Knightstown No. 9.

Princeton No. 46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette No. 15.

Brazil No. 47 – Chartered May 12, 1904, Charter surrendered April 21, 2006 and merged with Greencastle No. 11.

Clinton Commandery No. 48 – Chartered May 12, 1904. Charter surrendered on June 4, 2009 and members merged into Terre Haute Commandery No. 16

Rushville No. 49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville No. 6.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932.

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941,

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

Trinity Commandery No. 62 changed its name to Prather Commandery No. 62 at the 2009 Grand Conclave held April 24, 2009.
