The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Sir Knight Duane Lee Vaught, Past Grand Commander of Indiana (2001–2002) and serving as Grand Captain General, was elected to remain in the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment at the 64th Triennial Conclave, August 2009, in Roanoke Virginia.

Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. He graduated from North Montgomery High School and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in accounting. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In December 2000 he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm, during which time he was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. Since 1995 he has been with Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C. in Bloomington, IN. Since October 2008, he has been president of that firm. Professionally, not-for-profit entities are his primary specialty. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana State CPA Society, and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants.

His Masonic history began on April 30, 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana, and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active).

Vaught was initiated, passed, and raised a Master Mason in Montgomery Lodge, No. 50, in Crawfordsville, IN. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge No. 95 in 1993 receiving the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. He served on several Grand Lodge committees and was appointed as the Grand Representative of Oregon. He was elected the 157th Most Worshipful Grand Master of Indiana for 2007 – 2008. In May 2008, he was elected a Trustee of the Grand Lodge and in 2009 became president of the Board of Trustees.

Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry, and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry in 1977. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon and in 2007 the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Arkansas.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service and Knight Commander of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St. Anselm Commandery UD. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001–2002. Sir Knight Vaught was later appointed to the Finance Committee of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Vaught is a Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15 Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and has served as Secretary of his council for the last ten years. He is currently chairmen of the Grand Council AMD finance committee.

Duane Vaught is a Past Puissant Sovereign of St. Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and Past Receptor of St. Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests. He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross, of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSCRIF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Knights of Pythias, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, Indiana Past Commanders Association, and Goose and Tater. In 2005 he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, NMJ. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

In March 2007 he announced his candidacy for the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment. In August 2007, plans then took a surprising turn while attending the Supreme Council Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite when he was appointed and installed to that office when it became vacant upon the regretted resignation, due to health, of Grand Master Richard B. Baldwin and the advancement of the other members of the Grand Encampment line. After two years service in that office, he now begins a three year term continuing that work.

In August 2009, he was elected Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo and in August 2012 he was elected Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master.

He became a town marshal in Gaston and later became a Muncie Police Officer in 1972. Larry went on to become Deputy Chief of Police in 1992.

Larry has an associate degree in Building Construction Technologies. He also has attended the University of Louisville, University of Virginia, Northwestern University plus two years at Ball State University. Larry is a graduate of the FBI National Academy. Larry is currently a Real Estate Professional and an Indiana Venture Capitalist. Larry was an elected office holder in Delaware County eight years.

Larry was elected to two 4 year terms as township Trustee Assessor and 2 terms as Precinct Committeeman.

Larry is a past board member of Big Brothers & Big Sisters and a past board member with the Mental Health Association. Larry was also an Explorer Scout Advisor earning the Commissioner Award for East Central United States.

Larry and Suanna belonged to DeSoto United Methodist Church were Larry served on many boards and together he and Suanna taught Junior High Sunday School. They now belong to New Burlington United Methodist Church where Larry serves on the Pastor Parish Committee.

Larry's Masonic Career started in April 1962 by receiving the DeMolay Degree. Larry was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason in December 1986 at Whitney Lodge #229 in New Burlington, Indiana, and in 1995 served as Worshipful Master. He is a dual member of Parker Lodge No. 630 serving as Worshipful Master there in 2010. He served on the Indiana Masonic Home Board finance committee during the years of 2012 and 2013. He was appointed as Representative to Kansas for the Grand Lodge of Indiana in 2012.

He joined the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite in 1987 and also belongs to the Valley of Indianapolis and the Valley of Ft. Wayne where he is currently the Senior Warden in the Darius Council Princes of Jerusalem, and also belongs to the Knights of St. Andrew.

Larry joined the Muncie York Rite in 1993, became Commander of Muncie Commandery #18 in 1998 and 1999. He was also Illustrious Master of Muncie Council #16 in 1999 and High Priest of Muncie Chapter #30 in 2000. Larry is an officer in the Holy Royal Arch Knights Templar Priests Gennesaret Tebernacle No. XVII, and an officer in St. Basil Conclave Red Cross Constantine. Larry is also a member of Royal Order of Scotland, J. Herbert Nichols Priory #73 and Indiana Priory #8 KYCH, Indiana Past Commanders Association, Currently serving as Sovereign Master of Willard M. TRUSTEE'S REPORT – 2012-13

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery and Sir Knights of Indiana.

The Trustees met in Kokomo on June 21, 2012 and again on October 2, 2012 in Greenwood to discuss the monies held by the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

It was discussed and determined that we move the monies being held by Raymond James to Morgan Stanley, Smith Barney. The monies were moved in the final week of December 2012.

As of March 31, 2013 the balances of the funds are as follows:

Permanent Fund: \$324,146.28 Education Fund: \$217,706.17

The Trustee's also oversee the Life Membership Fund which is currently invested in two Certificates of Deposit and cash.

The plan's goal is to have a conservative low-risk allocation of equity, fixed income, alternative investments and cash investments, designed to achieve a higher rate of return than 100% fixed income investment with less risk than a 100% equity investment.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

We continue to show progress in the recovery of our permanent fund. The Trustees have moved our permanent fund to Morgan Stanley. With the \$5.00 assessment and the \$.50 increase in percapita, we generated enough funds to operate last year without taking anything out of the permanent fund. If our finances remain as they are at the present time we will be in position to start returning funds to the permanent fund in the next year or so.

As we proposed in a package in 2010, a \$.50 cent increase in per-capita each year for the next five years was to offset the drop in membership. This increase was to be voted on each year.

The Finance Committee recommends that the per capita be increased by .50 cents this year.

Two projects were discussed and recommended this year. First was the membership incentive program and second, the ritual recognition program. These programs will be covered under separate proposals. The finance Committee approved the new programs for next year.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through January 22, 2014, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To: SK Bobby J. Roberts - Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Sir Knights:

The Problem:

For the last 43 years running, or since 1969, the membership of the Knights Templar in the State of Indiana has been decreasing. Numerous programs and various attempts at advertising and marketing have had success, but not enough to change the continuing downward trend of our membership.

Member Get a Member Solution:

The 2012/2013 Program of "Member Get a Member" had some limited success, but I am afraid that the numbers continue to show a downward trend.

On December 31, 2011 – Membership in the State of Indiana was 3,889 Sir Knights On December 31, 2012 – Membership in the State of Indiana was 3,770 Sir Knights

This represents a decrease of 119 Sir Knights, which is much better than the 353 that we lost last year, but nonetheless, still represents a drop in membership.

Again, the "Member Get a Member" is a very simple program, easily accomplished by any SK and has vast merit.

Fundamentally our Membership problem has not changed. Even with the advent of the Grand Commandery Membership Cord Program, even with the Grand Encampment Membership Program, and even knowing the massive issue and problem that we face with membership in general, our SK's are not motivated to go out to their Blue Lodges and recruit new Sir Knights.

Compounded with the ever decreasing Blue Lodge population, battling membership is going to be an increasingly difficult problem.

Membership Development Plan For 2013:

A new program will go into effect in 2013 for membership development which is to encourage an increase in Knighting's in Indiana Commanderies.

The basis of the plan will reward Commanderies who increase their membership by at least seven percent during a calendar year. For 2013, the number of members on the Commandery roll on January 1, 2013 will be used as the basis of the award. If a Commandery increases the number of Knightings during the year of 2013 by at least 7 percent of that January 1 number of current Sir Knights, it will be eligible for the financial reward. An increase of anything under 7 percent,

will not be rewarded. The number of suspensions, demits, or deaths has no bearing on the outcome – only the number of Knightings.

If a Commandery meets the minimum 7 percent increase, then that Commandery will receive a stipend of \$20 for ALL candidates Knighted (not the number of Knightings over 7%) during that calendar year, ending December 31, 2013.

At the end of the calendar year, the Grand Secretary will determine the amount that the winning Commanderies would receive, and deduct that amount from the per capita and assessment from the Grand Commandery. (No actual check will be sent to the Commandery, but the amount to be received will be so deducted).

In an effort to have Commanderies be on time to pay their annual per capita and assessments, if the local Commandery Recorder is late in paying the amount due to the Grand Commandery, the stipend will be negated.

This membership plan has been approved by the Finance Committee and has been put into the new budget. The plan has also been approved by the Executive Committee and Membership committee.

RITUALISTIC REWARD PROGRAM April 26, 2013

Whereas; There is a need to encourage more Sir Knights to memorize ritualistic work for the exemplification of the Orders of Knighthood and also to recognize the efforts of those Sir Knights in learning their parts

Therefore be it resolved that the Grand Commandery proposes the following Ritualistic Reward Program:

The Ritualistic Awards are to be based on the three Orders conferred. The award is to be a bar which may be worn on the uniform to signify the level of proficiency, along with a certificate to be printed with the level of proficiency. **All work is to be done from memory and in full form**. All work done is to be attested by the Recorder as to what part was done and by whom. When sufficient requirements are satisfied for a particular level of recognition the Constituent Recorder will submit the information on the proper form to the Grand Recorder for the correct manner of recognition.

Point System

The total points for each Order are based on the number of words for that part. Then that number is divided by 10 and then rounded up or down to the next 5.

There will be three levels of proficiency:

1. Pilgrim	255	(15% of Total)
2. Warrior	600	(35% of Total)
3. Knight	1455	(85% of Total)

The "Opening" and "Closing" Rituals are not to be considered in the point totals. There is no consideration for the short forms of "The Illustrious Order of the Red Cross" or "The Order of Malta."

The applicant will complete an application indicating the parts he has performed. He will sign the application and present it to his local Recorder for his signature and seal. The Recorder will then forward the application to the Grand Recorder along with a fee of \$10.00, to cover the cost of the bar and certificate. The Grand Recorder will then send the award to the local Recorder for presentation.

The proposed Ritual Award Program will necessitate the following changes to the Law.


SECTION 920 (d) (RESOLUTION No. 10) RITUALISTIC AWARD

The Ritualistic Awards are to be based upon the memorized performance of the ritual of three full-form Orders conferred. The award is to be a bar of three different varieties (described below) approximately 3/8" X 1-3/8" which may be worn on the uniform to signify the level of proficiency. All work done is to be attested by the Recorder as to what part was done and by whom. When sufficient requirements are satisfied for a particular level of recognition the Constituent Recorder will submit the information on the proper form to the Grand Recorder for the correct manner of recognition.

- A. The bars shall be a die struck brass soft enamel pin with two (2) clutches.
- B. There shall be one (1) Bar for each level of proficiency. There shall be three (3) levels of proficiency:

Pilgrim	255 Points	(15% of Total)	
Warrior	600 Points	(35% of Total)	*
Knight	1455 Points	(85% of Total)	-

- C. No more than one ritual bar shall worn on the uniform at a time
- D. Ritual Bars are to be returned to the Grand Recorder upon advancement to next level of proficiency
- E. The Ritual Bar is to be worn to the right of the ITA bar as follows:

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION & VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN 2012 -2013

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

As has been stated in reports for the last two and one half years, the Eye Foundation now makes grants to researchers and institutions in the field of eye diseases and conditions. This largely is due to current patient privacy laws and the enactment of federal health care. Also, by allocating Foundation funds in this manner, more people, world-wide will be favorably affected.

The Foundation had realized that instead of devoting most of its resources to childhood eye problems, the vast amount of funds was being expended for cataracts of adults, and that since many states had programs covering this problem, only persons in about twenty-five percent of the states were receiving benefits.

Research accomplished through the efforts of the Foundation has made great strides in treating children with strabismus (crossed eyes) and new non-surgical treatments have been developed to deal with this condition.

The Senior Eye Care program done in partnership with Eye Care America and the Foundation of the American Academy of Ophthalmology does continue.

Past Commanders: The same as for Eminent Commanders, except that the color shall be of bright red.

SECTION 950:

Eminent Commander: Emerald-green silk velvet, one and three-quarter to two inches wide by four inches long, bordered with one row of embroidery of gold bullion or gold Mylar 1/4 to 3/8 inch wide. A passion cross with a halo embroidered of silver shall be in the center. (April 2013) Generalissimo: During his incumbency in office - the same color as for Commander, with Square surmounted with the Paschal lamb in place of Passion cross.

LIFE ANNUITY MEMBERSHIP PLAN

The life Annuity Membership Plan, is not an Annuity and as such in the following all reference to Annuity be stricken.

There is no compensation for anyone and I would move that all reference to that be stricken. Reference to special assessment should also be stricken.

Reads:

LIFE ANNUITY MEMBERSHIP PLAN

SECTION 680 (484). (a). NAME OF PLAN. The name of this plan shall be "Life Annuity Membership Plan" of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, hereinafter, sometimes referred to as the "plan."

- (b). QUALIFIED KNIGHT TEMPLAR MAY PARTICIPATE. Any Knight Templar in good standing whose dues are paid for the current year in a Commandery may become a participant in the plan. Such person is hereafter sometimes referred to as a "qualified Knight Templar".
- (c). ADMINISTRATION of the plan. The plan shall be administered by the Grand Trustees, in accordance with the provisions of the Grand Encampment and Indiana Statutes as a separate fund.
- (d). DETERMINATION OF PURCHASE PRICE. The purchase price shall be determined by multiplying the current Commandery dues times a factor, which is determined by the age of the qualified Knight Templar on December 31 of the year the application, is received by the Grand Recorder. The Commandery dues is defined as the amount of money collected yearly from each member of a Commandery, which includes a combination of the Commandery operating dues and the Grand Commandery per capita tax. The Commandery dues definition does not include special assessments for a Commandery. The Grand Commandery per capita tax will either include or exclude the \$1.00 Eye Foundation assessment, depending upon whether or not the applicant is a Life Sponsor in the Eye Foundation.

- (e.) PAYMENT OF PURCHASE PRICE. The purchase price of a Life Annuity Membership shall be paid in a single sum at the time of application.
- (f.) REVISION OR DISCONTINUANCE OF PLAN BY GRAND COMMANDERY. The Grand Commandery of Indiana may revise the purchase price or other provisions of the plan, or it may discontinue the plan, provided however, the purchase price or other provisions may not be revised or the plan discontinued for any existing fully enrolled participant, if the plan is in effect

in the Grand Commandery of Indiana except as hereinafter noted, and any such revision or discontinuance of adoption of the plan by the Grand Commandery shall only be effective after filing a resolution with the Grand Recorder 60 days prior to the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, 30 days written notice thereof by the Grand Recorder to each Constituent Commandery Recorder, and adoption at the Annual Conclave by three-fourths, affirmative vote of those delegates present.

- (g.) APPLICATION BY OR FOR A QUALIFIED KNIGHT TEMPLAR. A qualified Knight Templar may purchase a Life Annuity Membership or any person or persons or any Commandery may purchase a Life Annuity Membership for a qualified Knight Templar, by submitting the following to the Commandery Recorder: a) Completed application, in duplicate, on a form prescribed by the Grand Trustees and by the required payment in full, as determined in Section d. The Commandery Recorder shall promptly transmit the duplicated application form, with the required payment, to the Grand Recorder.
- (h.) EFFECTIVE DATE OF LIFE ANNUITY MEMBERSHIP. Upon receipt by the Grand Recorder of the copy of the duplicated application form and the required payment, then the applying Knight Templar shall become a participant in the plan through the Grand Commandery. The Life Annuity must be purchased and submitted to the Grand Recorder on or before November 30 in order for the plan to go into effect the following year.
- (i.) CERTIFICATION OF LIFE ANNUITY MEMBERSHIP. Upon receipt of the full purchase price by the Grand Recorder, he shall issue a Certificate of Life Annuity Membership to the participant. Such certificate shall be signed by the Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder under the seal of the Grand Commandery. The Grand Recorder shall forward such certificate to the Commandery Recorder for proper presentation.

- (1) PER CAPITA TAX OR DUES INCREASES OR DECREASES, SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS. Future increases or decreases in the Grand Commandery per capita tax or participant's Commandery operating dues shall have no effect upon the payments made by the Grand Trustees to the local Commandery. If the local Commandery dues have changed after the applicant became a life member, the Grand Trustees will pay the amount of current Commandery dues, not the amount of the Commandery dues when the application became effective.
- (m) REFUNDS DISCIPLINARY ACTION No refunds shall be made from the plan to any participant or any other person, estate or any Commandery for any reason, as death, demit, expulsion, or suspension No participant shall be exempt from disciplinary action as provided in the Indiana Statutes. In the event of the suspension or expulsion of a participant, the Grand Trustees shall discontinue to pay to the participant's Commandery any amounts which would

have been paid had the participant not been suspended or expelled Any participant who has been suspended and subsequently reinstated shall also have his Life Annuity Membership reinstated.

- (n) DUES CARDS On or before January 1 of each year, the Recorder of a participant's Commandery shall issue a regular dues card without any special designation to the participant with a full paid membership, as long as he is in good standing in his Commandery.
- (o) PLURAL MEMBERSHIP IN ANOTHER INDIANA COMMANDERY A qualified Knight Templar may purchase a Life Annuity Membership in any Commandery in which he holds regular membership, or he may purchase Life Annuity Membership in one Commandery and be a regular dues paying member in another Commandery.
- (p) TRANSFER OF LIFE ANNUITY MEMBERSHIP FROM COMMANDERY TO ANOTHER COMMANDERY Upon written notification of the qualified Knight Templar to the Grand Recorder, a Life Annuity Membership in one Commandery may be transferred to a Life Annuity Membership in another Indiana Commandery In the event that two or more Commanderies consolidate, the Life Annuity Membership of the participant shall be transferred to the Commandery whose charter remains in effect.
- (q) SURRENDER OF CHARTER In the event of the surrender of a charter of a participant's Commandery, any amounts which would have been payable by the Grand Trustees to the participant's Commandery shall be paid to the Grand Commandery General Fund until the participant affiliates with another Indiana Commandery, after which date all future payments by the Grand Trustees will be made to the Commandery with which the participant has affiliated.
- (r) MEMBERSHIP IN A NON-INDIANA COMMANDERY If a participant holds or acquires a membership in a non-Indiana Commandery, no payments shall be made by the Grand Trustees from the fund to such non-Indiana Commandery.
- (s) GRAND TRUSTEES TO ACCOUNT It shall be the responsibility of the Grand Trustees to hold and administer such assets of the plan as may be transmitted to their keeping and to distribute earning in accordance with provisions of the plan. The Grand Trustees shall maintain adequate records of the payments for each participant in the plan and may pay all necessary costs of such administration from earnings on assets held. Provided, also, that should excess plan earnings be insufficient, costs of administration shall be paid from general revenues of the Grand Commandery. The Grand Trustees are empowered to employ such persons or services as necessary for the administration of the plan without further approval from all standard accounting practices in the maintenance of the records of the plan, and the plan shall be audited annually by such outside accounting firm as may be approved by the Grand Commandery or the Executive Committee thereof. At the annual Conclave, the Grand Trustees shall submit a written report of their administration of the plan together with the audit report.
- (t) GRAND TRUSTEES TO INVEST Funds held by the Grand Trustees for the plan shall be invested so as to gain maximum return commensurate with absolute safety of principal and shall be limited to obligations of the United States Government or fully insured deposits of a commercial bank or savings and loan association domiciled in the State of Indiana.
- (u.) GRAND TRUSTEES TO DISTRIBUTE EXCESS REVENUE In the event that the plan shall produce income in excess of the amounts actuarially necessary to meet projected plan

obligations, the Grand Trustees may recommend to the Grand Commandery that amounts be distributed from the fund. Provided, however, that such distributions shall be made only upon approval of the Grand Commandery at the Annual Conclave and provided further that an analysis to determine such excess funds shall be made and reported to the Grand Commandery at least every five years.

- (v) GRAND TRUSTEES TO PRESCRIBE RULES AND REGULATIONS The Grand Trustees may and shall prescribe such rules and regulations as shall be necessary or desirable for administration of the plan; provided that no such rules or regulations shall be in conflict or contrary to any express provision of the statutes, bylaws and regulations of the Grand Encampment, the Grand Commandery or civil law. LIFE MEMBERSHIP PLAN

SECTION 680:

- (A) NAME OF PLAN. The name of this plan shall be "Life Membership Plan" of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, hereinafter, sometimes referred to as the "plan."

A qualified Knight Templar may purchase a Life Membership or any person or persons or any Commandery may purchase a Life Membership for a qualified Knight Templar, by submitting the following to the Commandery Recorder: A completed application, in duplicate, on a form prescribed by the Grand Trustees and by the required payment in full, as determined in Section d. The Commandery Recorder shall promptly transmit the duplicated application form, with the required payment, to the Grand Recorder.
- (H) EFFECTIVE DATE OF LIFE MEMBERSHIP. Upon receipt by the Grand Recorder of the copy of the duplicated application form and the required payment, then the applying Knight Templar shall become a

participant in the plan through the Grand Commandery. The Life must be purchased and submitted to the Grand Recorder on or before November 30 in order for the plan to go into effect the following year.

- (I) CERTIFICATION OF LIFE MEMBERSHIP. Upon receipt of the full purchase price by the Grand Recorder, he shall issue a Certificate of Life Membership to the participant. Such certificate shall be signed by the Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder under the seal of the Grand Commandery. REMARKS FROM SIR KNIGHT LARRY W. BROWN, PGC INDIANA EAST CENTRAL DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

Well it's really a pleasure to come to Indian to be your East Central Department Commander. I am just more than pleased, this is my home and you guys are the Grand Commandery of Indiana just in case you are confused I hope you know what I meant.

I've been to Michigan, as a Department Commander I've been to Kentucky as a Department Commander, and Ohio and when I am there, people take me by the arm and show me where to go and what to do. I walk into Indiana and you got to find your own way buddy. You got to find the hospitality room and I did know where it was. But it's really exciting to be here.

The first thing I would like talk about is the Department Conference we had here in Indianapolis a month ago. Being right here in Indianapolis I thought I had a little bit of an edge. I was in Ohio and I offered the guys in Ohio a challenge, that they couldn't bring enough people to beat Indiana. Well they smoked me, right here in Indianapolis, and then at the end of the day it came time to put names down for the leadership course. Every State brought me there names. They all had a few here and there. Then came Ohio. They had a list and another list and another list. I am not going to issue anymore challenges to OhioI can't keep up with them.

I want everybody in Indian to know you are all welcome to the attend the Department Conferences. It's educational, it's a great day, a good time to break bread and make new friends. Next year it will be in Michigan but the year after that it comes back to Indianapolis. We are going to try to bet Ohio, and Illinois and Michigan and Kentucky. The Grand Encampment is putting on a great Leadership class. I would advise everyone to attend the Leadership Classes.

I would like to talk about the Easter Sunrise Services of Grand Encampment. I didn't go to Washington D. C. this year but I did go to Kansas City. They now, have two besides Washington D.C. the one in Kansas City and they started another a couple of years ago in San Diego, CA. It was a great success. I was the only one from Indiana there. I take that back there was another Sir Knight there but I don't see him here right now. But I got on the Kentucky bus and they treated me like I was the greatest guy in the world. Sir Knighst I want you to know you can travel to these different Conclave. You can go to Kentucky, you can go to Michigan, Illinois, Ohio, North and South Dakota. I just want you to know you are welcome to go to all these Conclaves. So go and enjoy yourself, and fellowship with other Sir Knights. You will find that they are all just great people just as you are here.

Long Range Planning is where I believe Templary needs to go. Once you have long range planning in place and all the officer and Sir Knights have agreed to begin to go in a direction. When you have the long range plan in place you are looking to the future and you are traveling down the same road. You are not turning things upside down you aren't changing thing and the members know the Knight Templar are headed in one direction, because you have a plan. When you change in the middle of a plan it may not be a bad thing but without that plan it takes a long time to get there. So if you are going to make change make small changes and be sure that everybody wants to be headed in the new direction.

You need a vision, and Indiana does very well in every category I am going to talk about. A good vision has leadership development in it. It has a pplan to improve ritual. It has pride in your order and improve public awareness. I think Indiana does a great job in the vision. I am not saying the other states don't do a great job, I am here in Indiana today. We have the ITA school for the leadership, what I think is a great class, just don't leave is as great. You need to tweak it a little each year. We have ritual we have started the new ritual pin here in Indiana. I have looked it over and it's going to be tough to get one of those pins but it can be done.

Public Awareness is one of the most important because it will lead to new Sir Knights and perhaps new Symbolic members. Take your Commandery out there and get in a parade. Go to lodge to do Flag lectures or whatever it may be. Take pride in what you have and I see in it in this room I see it everywhere I look. You all have that pride or you wouldn't come here in uniform looking good as you all do. I think Indiana is on the right track the same as for the other states.

I didn't mention Pennsylvania but I know they have a great Grand Commander and is a great state the same as the rest of us. You all are Knights Templar and are very proud to be here and I and very proud to be here with you.

REMARKS BY THE INSPECTING OFFICER SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT, GCT RIGHT EMINENT DEPUTY GRAND MASTER, OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA PAST GRAND COMMANDER OF INDIANA AND PAST GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND LODGE ON INDIANA

I bring you greeting from David Dixon Goodwin our Most Eminent Grand Master, who is I believe in Romania, which means I am having a lot more fun. A few of you were at Triennial and Romania is one of our newer Grand Commanderies. They are still trying to get some things right and are having a few problems.

At Grand Encampment we have tried over the last two trienniums, and even before that, we have stepped up the pace. We are trying to move this fraternity forward and are trying to make things better. I trotted out before that the magazine is better than it used to be and I haven't heard any arguments about that. Well that was four years ago. What have you done for me lately?

The Department Commander has talked about the leadership program, which we are doing in conjunction with General Grand Chapter and General Grand Council. Those who have attended them are raving about how good they are, at least what I am hearing. Is Sir Knight Carson Smith in the Room? I believe you have attended them? Carson is not known for being shy about what he thinks. Talk to him afterwards if you have any doubts. We have been putting a lot of effort into these. People tell us that they are getting something out of it, and that's what makes it worthwhile.

Eye foundation of course you have heard about the big change starting three or four years ago, stopping the surgeries and moving into grants. The program is really starting to take off. We have increased the number of applications for grants. We are having higher quality of applications and we don't give out all the money that is in the budget, because we only fund good programs. We are giving out something like 8.5 million dollars in the budget next year. That's the money from the Eye Foundation and that's going into the kind of research that prevents the need for the type of surgery we use to provide. Early on the Eye Foundation was really big in fixing cross eyes, there is virtually not anymore of that type surgery. Part of the reason is, I'd like to take full credit, but some of the reason that surgery in not needed is because of the research the Eye Foundation is helping to provide, is to eliminate the need for surgery. There are a lot of other things that are being worked on and those grants are being presented in different places. One of those grants will be presented this coming summer is in Indiana. There wasn't any here last year but I believe there were two here the year before. There are addition things the Eye Foundation is working on. We are now working on permanently endowed chairs at universities of school of ophthalmology, eye surgery. For one of these chairs we are talking about places like the Mayo Clinic, Cleveland Clinic, or Children's Hospital. Some of these chairs may cost a million dollars or a million and a half dollars. We don't have to fund them all at once but just imagine where we are taking the Eye Foundation in the next ten years. We have site planed visits for the Mayo Clinic to consider them for the first endowed chair. If we like the arrangement and the money is agreeable, we may fund that chair in 3, 5 or 7 years before we are fully paid up for that chair. Once we have

it endowed, at that medical school that is forever the Knights Templar Chair at the school of ophthalmology. But once that is done we won't be done because we'll find another deserving institution. In twenty years we may be looking back and there are half dozen chairs of ophthalmology of Knights Templar. The Knights Templar will be known as the ones who see into the future of eye surgery.

We were working on cleaning up the Laws of Grand Encampment at the last session. Three years from now look for more housekeeping in that area. Some changes are big some are small but they are all about trying to make improvements, because that what moves this fraternity forward.

I am proud to be a member of this fraternity here in Indiana. Not that we are unique but that is where I am standing today and we are going to talk about some of the good things going on here in Indiana.

We have done in the past with great success the lanyard program for membership achievement. Now the program is headed by Virgil Humphrey. This program has been a huge success in Indiana, with some 300 Sir Knights being eligible to wear these cords.

Our committee on Ritual could have come here today and told us again that ritual is important and it what binds us to the Order ant that we really should try to do better. We hear that all too often. Well it's important. But they have done something. They have designed an award for those who excel in ritual, which was noted that is not going to be easy to earn. But that it's going to mean something, it's going to mean something to the person who gets that award, it's going to mean something to the person who see it, because they are going to know this guy has done something special. This committee has done something. It has tried to make this Grand Commandery better. It's giving reorganization to the people who do it and do it well.

Those people who have worked so hard during the last five year will remember there was a little blip in the economy. Right? OK, we took our hits on that two, and a lot of people in this Commandery have worked very hard to deal with that. Could I have all the people who have served as a Trustee, on the finance committee or in some other way stand please? These guys put in a lot of work to see that our Grand Commandery is finically stable. These things don't just happen, they happen because people who care put some effort into it to move the fraternity forward for all of us.

Indiana isn't special because every state, every Grand Commandery can do that. They do and things are happening.

My good friend here from South Dakota, knows the Grand Commandery wasn't all it could be. But they are making progress. It's amazing how much progress that Grand Commandery has made in the last half dozen years.

Hawaii, we have had a Commandery in Hawaii for a century. They decided they wanted to have a Grand Commandery, but they don't have enough Templar to form a Grand Commandery. Last August it was granted.

Panama has had Commanderies for well over a hundred years. They starting about the same time we did that little construction project we did down there by Teddy Roosevelt. Last summer they too said we want a Grand Commandery, we want more.

Why do we have Commanderies in Portugal, in Romania, in Italy? Because they want what we have and because it's so easy for us to take it for granted here because we've had it a long time. But look at the people who haven't had it and see how desperate they are to have what we have. What we have we just need to make it better.

The Grand Commandery in Indiana, we aren't bating a thousand, but we are out there swinging and trying to make it better. This Grand Commandery will have its ups and downs, but we're trying to make it better, and that's the lesson for our Commanderies they need to do the same. That's what we all need to do.

I do have just one other thing to do. On my way here I was looking in my brief case and I have two only two Knights Templar wall calendars and three pocket calendars. Let's see which one is it Dwight Lanmans says he likes and the other one is a waste? Dwight "I already got them I said it and I meant it and they are good." All right, there you go, with an endorsement like that. I just have a few. Many of you have been donors and have received this kind of thing in the mail. This year's supply I can give them out. If you would like one they are free, but if you like it please remember the Eye Foundation, because we are doing some great things.

Again, it's just a joy to be back here in my home Grand Commandery to be here with all of you. Let's do this again next year.

REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT GEORGE A. INGLES, JR, KCT, PGC GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND LODGE ON INDIANA

Sir Knights please be seated.WOW Back home again. This as you just heard really cool to be back here. Sir Knight Duane warned me back when, that this is the hardest thing you have to do, as Grand Master, was to speak at the York Rite Grand Sessions, because you have the same or mostly the same audience of all your speeches. However with the change to Grand Chapter moving it to two weeks ago there is time for everyone to forget what I said at that time. The speech I made last night I think everybody slept through that so I'll just replay that one, again tonight.

The calendars that were here reminded me of something that happened. About a year ago we were at Vista Lodge and we were finishing an installation of officers. George Weister, Masonic Home Foundation Employee, got up and said he had a few calanders left if anyone wanted one. So I got up and went back to George, knelt down in front of George and he handed me one. Then he said you know, we send these out to those who contribute to the Home Foundation. So I am thinking, how do I get out of this one? So as I rose, I said I just want to thank you George, my daughter really appreciated this, because my wife and I already have one.

I would like to, on behalf of the Grand Lodge, thank the Grand Commandery, because of the number of time you have supported the Grand Lodge at the different event we have had during this past year. We have numerous times asked you to come out and be a part of the public events. It is greatly appreciated when it happens. You don't necessarily get all the thanks you should get at that time but it is greatly appreciated. Sir Knight Terry Kehrer, I was trying to tell the guys, to drink water, and said guys Drink water, drink, drink, Terry believes now. After nearly passing out from dehydration, he fell down on top of my wife at the Courthouse Annex Dedication in Winchester last summer. It was a hot day, and you didn't quite make but your assistance is greatly appreciated.

I hope we have a large turnout in about a month from now down at the Grand Lodge at our Annual Communications. I've asked the Captain General elect to do the lines a little bit different, so everyone sees the stream of Sir Knights. We have in the past done a counter march and I don't see it as impressive as it could be so, I have requested it be a little different. Distinguish Guests I've noticed one that came in late. I am going to take this opportunity to introduce him. Sir Knight Andy Jackson, the late, Sir Knight Andrew R. Jackson, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander it is a pleasure to see you here in our Grand Commandery Sir.

One of the things I have been task with before I get out of this present job. Is, how do you find leaders? They tell me I have done a good job this year of getting things done. I said I don't do anything. I just go get somebody else to do it for me. How do you do that?

Some time back maybe 30 plus years ago I was president of our local union and dealing with the state president of our union and he asked me. Do you want to be a good leader? Of course, I said yes. He said get out in front of the pack and run like mad. I said, OK. He then asked do you want to be a great leader. I said sure. He replied, look over your shoulder to see where they are going. So when you have a bunch of guys out there doing things and you are in front. It's a good idea to look over your shoulder to see where they are heading, to see if you were heading in the right direction to lead them. That has to be number one for any leader.

I met a guy from Pennsylvania in 1982 when I attended my first Grand Commandery Conclave. I was either the Junior or Senior Warden of my Commandery and didn't have a clue what I was doing and knew maybe two other Sir Knight at that conclave. All of these purple boards, green boards, red boards meant little if anything to me, all these guys who must know everything and must be someone special.

I sat at a table, I don't know how I got there, must have just picked one and sat down. After dinner they started to look for a guy in the audience someone to give an award to. I didn't know what they were doing. However I now know I will never receive it, and I happen to think it is one of the most prestigious awards that anybody can receive. They finally settled on the guy setting next to me and they presented him with the Knight Templar Cross of Honor. They presented to two Sir Knights that evening. He returned and sat beside me. He didn't have a lot to say, but as the years have passed I've gotten to know him a little better.

His name is Charles Garnes. In 1970 he ran for Grand Junior Warden and didn't make it. He got mad at the Grand Commandery, went home and stayed there. He didn't return to the Grand Commandery until that night. But what he did was turn his York Rite around; he took the numbers from 250 to 430. He didn't want anything to do with the grand bodies he took his local bodies and moved them miles ahead. The name doesn't mean a lot to you, but he later served as Grand Commander of PA and is an Honorary Past Department Commander, He has done a lot for the Grand Encampment. He has done a lot for the Sir Knight in PA. He lead by example, that's what he was all about he was the guy out in front, he was out there pulling people in, just like the Sir Knight back in the corner there. Sir Knight I believe has one hundred and thirty-seven. It that about the right numbers of petitons you have signed Carson? Oh. I see one thirty-eight, but whose counting. Thank you Sir Knight Carson. That number of 138 is about a year's worth of Knighting in this Grand Commandery, so we all need to do what Carson does. He says he just asks and that is all you need to do is to ask.

I think the one thing missing in this whole finding leaders picture is, you must become a friend. I would like to draw you a mental picture of what my friend looks like. No it's not my wife, it's not Larry Brown setting over here. My best friend looks like; picture a square, a box about so by so. On one side draw a loop around go to the other side draw a loop around on each side of that box. Up at the top front of the box a nice big circle of the one side and another on the other side, big circles, with just a couple of little dots in the center of each. Now in about the center draw a little arrow, and just below that just a little slit. That box is my friend on each side is the ear that little slit that's the mouth, and those big eyes. I am just so amazed at the story you are telling me, I just can't believe it! That is so fabulous! That's what your friend is that's what he looks like. If you can do that, if you can sit and listen to what's going on to every person, you will be a great leader. Because when you do listen, you are going to find out what that person does. What their passion is where they are going to, and where they are going in life. When the time come when you need someone to do something, whatever it is. Tap that person on the shoulder and say, you are a real expert in selling cars or you are a real expert in selling ice cream and I need you to go out and sell membership. You are a salesman and I know you can sell or I know you can do something for the eye foundation because... But you've got to listen. Listening is the important part of the whole thing. I think I have been a good leader and the reason for that is I am wearing out. This ear, I can't hear anything and this one has a hearing aid in it. So I am wearing out. I can't be much of a leader anymore I can't hear. So if you can imagine what your friend looks like just be a friend to everyone, just be a friend. Listen intently to what going on, be that box, be a good leader listen. I think Charley Garnes is a good leader I call Charley a lot and he's still

listening. Listening is what makes you a good leader so listen and lead. Our total loss is about 150 losses. If you call your members if you call they will stay members of your Commandery and of your lodges. Call and listen

Before I leave this, I have now been doing this to long. I can't leave it on a serious note. People have heard that elephant joke and want to hear it again, I don't understand that. Anyway! In an Irish court room the judge said to a double homicide defendant. You are charged with beating your wife to death with a hammer. A voice in the back of the room yells out YOU S.O.B. The judge says; you are also charged with beating your mother-in-law to death with a hammer. Voice in the back of the room yells out YOU ROTTEN S.O.B. The judge stops and says to Patty in the back of the room, I can understand you anger and frustration at these crimes. But no more out busts from you or I will charge you with contempt. Is that understood? Patty stands and says but for fifteen years I've lived next door to that jerk and every time I've asked to borrow a hammer he said he didn't have one.

BATTALION MEETINGS & ACTIVITIES

Grand Recorder: The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 155 for the year 2011-12 with 155 new Sir Knights having been created. Star Recorder of the Year: This Award, based on criteria set up by the Grand Commander and Grand Recorder and will be announced at a later date.

Grand Treasurer: The Grand Treasurer presented his annual financial report.

Holy Land Pilgrimage: The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee reported that no ministers went to the Holy Land this year.

Trustees: The Permanent fund is invested with Raymond James in a moderate growth account with a ten year investment horizon. This has been a recovery year for our investments with Raymond James. For instance, in April of 2007, we invested \$299,622.96 and \$229,147.86 in the General Fund and Education Fund, respectively with Raymond James. The investment market turned sour in February of 2009. At that time the above investments declined to \$189,612.02 in the General Fund and \$141,106.12 in the Education Fund. As of this writing, the investments have not returned to the values of 2007, but they are very close. As of April 2012 the permanent fund sits at \$297,940.11 and the Education fund sits at \$210,957.07.

Necrology: The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 115 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. After Grand Prelate, Randal P. Ellington gave his report, Duane L. Vaught, GCT, PGC, REGG read a eulogy in memory of Sir Knight Karl Edwin Applegate, KCT, PGC, PDC. Sir Knight Steven J. Barton, KCT, PGC, PDC then gave a eulogy for Sir Knight Willard Meredith Avery, GCT, PMEGM of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Education Foundation: The Educational Foundation Committee will continue to award a \$5000.00 scholarship to Christian Theological Seminary (CTS). The committee has contacted several theological seminaries in the northern end of the state but we were unsuccessful in finding a seminary that would accept money from a Masonic organization.

Therefore, it was decided that we would enter into another three year agreement with Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) to supply a \$5000.00 scholarship for a student who is working on a master degree in divinity. CTS assumed the responsibility to research the needs of their best students and present to the committee a deserving student. The committee is looking forward to working with CTS again.

Crusader: The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and Richmond Commandery No. 8 received the traveling award for selling the most ads. There were 11 Commanderies that sold ads for a total of \$2,125.00. The book cost \$938.14 to print so we had a profit of \$1,186.86 for the Holy Land Pilgrimage fund.

Elections: The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies except for St. John #24, LaValette #15 and Apollo #19 were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Grand Commander-elect Bobby J. Roberts then announced the following appointments: Harold D. Black, GP; Marvin L. Rees, GO; Harrison E. Lackey, KCT, KTCH, HPGC, Grand Marshall; Terry L. Kehrer, GStdB; Kurt A. Begue, GSwdB; David C. Willoughby, GW; and Michael F. Robbins, GS.

Finance: SK Henry E. LaHurreau. KCT, PGC and Chairman of the Finance Committee said although the finances of the Grand Commandery are slowly improving, they are still behind where we were in 2008. So as we proposed two years ago, we will increase the per capita \$.50 this year and maintain the \$5.00 assessment for the third year. Motion passed.

In summary the per capita now looks like this: Grand Encampment: \$9.00. Grand Commandery: \$10.50. Eye Foundation: \$1.00 (not assessed if member is a Life Member of the Eye Foundation). In addition, the Grand Commandery also imposed a \$5 per member assessment on all members, including Life Members and 50-year members.

Honorary Memberships: The following Sir Knights were presented with Honorary Membership to the Indiana Grand Commandery: George F. Brooks, Jr., Kentucky; Roy A. Ickes, Michigan; and D. Mark Wilson, Illinois. Sir Knight George F. Brooks, Jr. responded for the Red Cords.

Easter Sunrise: The Annual Easter Sunrise Trip was to Alexandria, VA. A chartered bus left on the morning of April 4th 2012 from the Marriott East in Indianapolis in route to Philadelphia, PA. The bus was filled with 27 Sir Knights and 27 ladies and family members including children. On Thursday morning we toured the Philadelphia Constitution Mall and Memorial Park and were treated to a very informative guided tour of the historical sites. After lunch we toured the Grand Lodge Masonic Temple in downtown Philadelphia and enjoyed the splendor of this beautiful facility. We then headed to Alexandria, Virginia. On Friday morning we toured Mount Vernon and were treated to a most delightful lunch in the restaurant at Mount Vernon. Friday evening we all enjoyed a very relaxing pizza-party for fellowship and friendship. Saturday morning we visited Arlington National Cemetery and presented the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknowns. In the afternoon, we visited the Monument Memorials adjacent to the Lincoln and Washington Monuments in DC. The Grand Masters Banquet was held Saturday evening. After a breakfast buffet on Sunday morning we attended the Easter Sunrise Service with the Grand Encampment. We were all blessed with the most beautiful sunrise, sunny-skies and pleasant temperatures for the outside Easter Sunrise Service on the steps of the George Washington National Masonic Monument. We departed and enjoyed a safe bus trip home.

Distinguished Service Awards: Eighteen (18) Sir Knights and four (4) Friends were nominated to receive this award, which may be given to two Sir Knights and two Friends in each Commandery annually for outstanding service. As usual, these names are not divulged until the presentations are made in the individual Commanderies.

The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

Knights Templar Cross of Honor

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237.5 of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA, a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight (or Knights, depending on Grand Commandery membership counts) of each Grand Commandery once each year.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. It is to be noted that this award is to be made only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or Member. No elected Grand Commandery or Grand Encampment officer, past or present, is eligible to receive the award. This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider has been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric labors.

Should your Commandery desire to make a nomination for this award, you will use the following procedure.

- 1. Pass a resolution in your Commandery, naming the Sir Knight to be nominated.
- 2. Write to the Grand Recorder for a nomination form.
- 3. Read the instructions on the reverse side of the form. Fill it out and forward it directly to the Grand Commander, Bobby J. Roberts, 538 S Meridian St, Winchester, IN 47394-2338.

The nomination form must be in the hands of the Grand Commander prior to <u>February 1, 2013</u>. Incomplete forms and those received after that date <u>will not</u> be considered. Your Commandery should reconsider those Sir Knights who have been nominated previously but who have never received the award.

This Bulletin shall be read at the first State Conclave of each Constituent Commandery following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237-1/2 of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR**, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits.

 No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
- (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a nomination form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, and Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon.
 - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
 - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider nominations made Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in anyone year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
 - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by to the Grand Master.
- (5) The **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR** medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof. The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.
- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

The sixty-fifth Triennial Conclave officially began on the 10th of August with many committee meetings taking place. On Friday the 10th, the drill Judges and Captains had their meetings. Early on Saturday morning, the class "A", "B" and "C" class drills were held at the Plaza Ballroom while the "D" class drills were held in the Plaza Ballroom Foyer. Indiana fielded two "C" teams this year. Greenfield Commandery No. 39, Captained by SK David Miller took 4th place and Raper Commandery No. 1, Captained by SK Wayne Sheets took 7th place. Congratulations to all that worked hard and participated.

Sunday evening began with Divine Services. A beautiful service was performed by the Grand Prelate of the Grand Encampment. Following the service, a reception was held for William Howard Koon, II, Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States. It had various reception lines for the dignitaries as well as all the trappings that would accompany such a distinguished meeting.

The sixty-fifth Conclave began with the presentation and introduction of honored guests. Grand Master William Howard Koon, II then officially convened the session. The Most Eminent Grand Master then delivered his allocution, followed by a beautiful memorial service commemorating the loss of over 100 members of the Grand Encampment over this past triennium. Tucker was re-elected as Grand Recorder and SK James McCrorry Willson, GCT, HPGM, GT was re-elected to another term as Grand Treasurer.

Most Worshipful Grand Master George A. Ingles, Jr. placed the name of Duane L. Vaught, GCT, REGG in nomination for the station of REDGC.

The remainder of the session was to finish up miscellaneous business. The Official Grand Master's Banquet took place Tuesday evening. We were entertained with some beautiful opera music prior to a very delicious dinner and some great fellowship.

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. Each Commandery shall be inspected by its respective Battalion Commander, with the following exceptions. Substitutions may be made only as authorized by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The Inspection shall consist of a report on the Commanderies' membership efforts, examination of the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery. No inspection shall be considered complete until the Commandery shall have participated in a Reception as described in paragraphs eight and nine below.
- 4. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander.
- 5. Each Inspecting Officer will send a Notice of Inspection courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder in advance of the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request certain reports to be completed. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival.
- 6. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so may cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.
- 7. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Deputy Grand Commander, the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the Commandery inspected. A Full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given at the Annual Conclave.
- 8. Receptions: Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive the Commander, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Lines, Personal Inspection, form the Triangle and perform the Flag Ceremony. Those will have the addition of 50 points for a closed and 100 for a public reception to the activities score sheet for that Commandery. For Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the 50 or 100 points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work providing however, that there are at least 6 members of each Commandery present in order for a Commandery to accumulate points. For those Commanderies that will attend an Instructional no score will be awarded only Inst. shall appear in this column.
- 9. A Full Form Opening with subsequent Order shall be voluntary, and may be held with other Commanderies as agreed to by the Battalion Commander. An optional Instructional will be held in each battalion. Each Commandery must participate in one of the three options listed below.
 - a) Those Commanderies performing a separate Opening, Closing and Order will have the addition of up to 200 points to the activities score sheet for the Commandery.
 - b) Those Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work again provided there are at least 6 members of each Commandery present in order for a Commandery to accumulate points.

- c) To assist in the proficiency of the work, eight different instructional meetings throughout the State will be scheduled and conducted by the Battalion Commanders. Commanderies in attendance will receive additional points on the activity sheet on a per-officer and member attending bases at the discretion of the Battalion Commander.
- 10. The full form Opening and the conferring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent official interpretations thereof. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used.
- 11. The Battalion Commander will schedule (2) two Battalion meetings for information and/or ritual instruction during the year.
- 12. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the visit. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to supply or provide any assistance that another Commandery may need. If an actual candidate is present the quality of the impression made upon such candidate shall be of prime importance.
- 13. Upon completion of each Reception, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first. The Inspecting Officer will then call for comments from the sidelines. Finally, the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times, if the Grand Commander is not present, the Inspecting Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Commander is present, he will be the final speaker unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance in which case the Grand Master will be the final speaker.
- 14. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 15. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

16. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

ITEM NO. 4 Constituent Commanderies are strongly urged to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag at the opening of each Stated and Called Conclave.

ITEM NO. 5 A Constituent Commandery is not required to obtain special permission in order to meet and conduct business jointly with Chapter and/or Council. Such authority is found in Section 65(c) of the Laws of the Grand Encampment.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006. Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

St. John No. 24 Chartered April 2, 1873. Charter surrendered January 2, 2012 and merged with Frankfort Commandery No. 29.

Jeffersonville No. 27 - Chartered April 26, 1876. Charter surrendered October 13, 2008, and merged with New Albany No. 5.

Wabash No. 37 – Chartered April 20, 1893. Chartered arrested April 10, 2008, and merged into St. Anselm, U.D.

Bluffton No. 38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne No. 4.

Delphi No. 40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette No. 3.

Lebanon No. 43 – Chartered April 20, 1899. Charter surrendered August 15, 2000 and merged with Frankfort No. 29.

New Castle No. 44 Chartered April 19, 1900, Charter surrendered January 1, 2006 and merged with Knightstown No. 9.

Princeton No. 46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette No. 15.

Brazil No. 47 – Chartered May 12, 1904, Charter surrendered April 21, 2006 and merged with Greencastle No. 11.

Clinton Commandery No. 48 – Chartered May 12, 1904. Charter surrendered on June 4, 2009 and members merged into Terre Haute Commandery No. 16

Rushville No. 49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville No. 6.

Goshen Commandery No. 50 – Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered May 16, 2006, and merged with Elkhart No. 31.

Mishawaka No. 51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Tipton No. 52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo No. 36.

Winchester No. 53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No. 18.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941.

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010).

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the Commandery will be voting to permanently move the Charter to Dubois Lodge, subject to approval at Grand Conclave 2010. (Approved April 24, 2010)

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
