Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24,1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

INSPECTING OFFICER SIR KNIGHT JEFFERY A. BOLSTAD, RIGHT EMINENT DEPUTY GRAND MASTER GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA



SK Jeffrey A. Bolstad R.E. Deputy Grand Master Lewistown, MT SK Jeffrey Alan Bolstad has lived his entire life in various places in Montana. He was raised on a farm in extreme NE Montana, just a few miles from Saskatchewan and North Dakota. He studied at Montana State and Brown Institute of Broadcasting, which spawned a radio career that lasted 10 years. Eventually he was fortunate enough to be able to open up his own business as a State Farm insurance agent. SK Jeff began his Masonic journey on May 7, 1990 and has been heavily involved in the craft ever since. He was knighted at Bozeman in February 1998, then served as Grand Commander, and NWDC. He was elected GCG August 21, 2018 at Indianapolis. He has served in many leadership positions across the Masonic spectrum. He has filled the pulpit at several rural churches as an interim pastor over the years and also enjoyed reffing high school and college basketball. He has 2 sons and 6 grandchildren.



SIR KNIGHT DAVID J. KUSSMAN, GCT MOST EMINENT GRAND MASTER, GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Sir Knight David J. Kussman, was born in Houston, Texas, on Easter Sunday morning, April 5, 1953. His father, Frederick J. Kussman, Jr. was an active Mason in Texas and later in California. His mother, Hazel E. Kussman, was active in both the Order of Eastern Star and the Social Order of the Beauceant, serving several times as President. Sir Knight Kussman is a graduate of Loara High School in Anaheim, California, and attended Fullerton College and August Vollemer University majoring in Criminal Justice. He received his teaching credential from the University of California in Los Angeles. He completed his ministry studies at Cottonwood Leadership College, School of Ministry and Leadership. Sir Knight Kussman was ordained in 2011 and has served as an associate pastor at Plaza Bible Church in Anaheim and Catch the Flame Ministries, Inc. Sir Knight Kussman is a retired Police Sergeant from the Anaheim Police Department, completing thirty-four years of service.

Sir Knight Kussman was married to Lady Kimberly Ann (Schmidt) Kussman from 1988 until her passing in 2015. They were blessed with three children, two daughters and a son. His family currently now consists of six grandchildren: three boys and three girls.

Sir Knight Kussman met Lady Kimberly J. Burnett, PSWP, CT, of Columbus, Ohio at the 67th Triennial in Indiana. Ms. Burnett has served as Supreme Worthy President of the Supreme Assembly of the Social Order of the Beauceant. Their friendship has blossomed into a loving relationship and Ms. Burnett will be travelling with Sir Knight Kussman as often as her busy schedule permits.

In the Symbolic Craft Lodge, Brother Kussman was Initiated, Passed and Raised in Mother Colony Lodge No. 750, Free and Accepted Masons of California in 1979. In 1991, Mother Colony Lodge No. 750 and La Miranda Lodge No. 778 consolidated and became La Mirada Lodge No. 750 with Brother Kussman serving as the Worshipful Master. He transferred his membership to Anaheim Lodge No. 207 as an affiliated Past Master. Brother Kussman is also a member of the Southern California Research Lodge and the Southern California Past Master's Association.

In York Rite, Capitular Masonry, Companion Kussman was Exalted in Fullerton Chapter No. 90, Royal Arch Masons, where he served as High Priest in 1987. He was Consecrated in the Order of High Priesthood, served as an Inspector for the Grand Chapter of California, and decorated with the Grand Chapter Meritorious Service Award and Grand High Priest's Distinguished Service Medal.

In York Rite, Cryptic Masonry, Companion Kussman was Greeted in Santa Ana Council No. 14, Cryptic Masons, where he served as Illustrious Master in 1997. He received the Order of the Silver Trowel and served this body as Thrice Illustrious Master. He served the Grand Council as an Inspector and Assistant Director of Ritual. Companion Kussman was decorated with the Grand Master of Ish Sodi Award from the Grand Council and is a Companion of the Secret Vault within the Order of the Secret Vault of the General Grand Council Cryptic Masons International.

In York Rite, Chivalric Masonry, Sir Knight Kussman was Knighted in Fullerton Commandery No. 55, Knights Templar, where he served as Commander in 1986 and 1987. Ordained a member of the Past Commander's Association serving as both Virtual Prior and Actual Prior. He served the Grand Commandery as Inspector and Assistant Director of Ritual. He also served as a member of the Drill Team Committee, serving on three different drill teams. He was honored after seventeen years as Drill Captain Emeritus form Orange County Commandery No. 36. Sir Knight Kussman received the Knight Templar Meritorious Award twice from the Grand Commandery of California and decorated with the Knights Templar Cross of Honor in 2005. Sir Knight Kussman was appointed to the Grand Commandery line in 2002 and served as Right Eminent Grand Commander in 2010-2011. During his term as Grand Commander, California hosted the first Grand Encampment Western States Easter Celebration in Los Angeles. For his efforts, the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, College of Honors, created him a Knight Commander of the Temple.

His service to the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the United States of America began in 2012, when Grand Master David Dixon Goodwin, GCT appointed him as the Southwestern Department Commander for the 66th Triennium. Sir Knight Kussman was elected Grand Captain General for the 67th Triennium and decorated with the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple. He was elected Grand Generalissimo for the 68th Triennium. In August 2021, Sir Knight Kussman was elected Deputy Grand Master.

Sir Knight Kussman is a member of The Sovereign Order of Knights Preceptor.

Ordained a Knight Priest in St. John the Baptist Tabernacle No. LXVI, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, where he served as Preceptor and Registrar. He holds the title of Knight Commander in the Order. He served the Grand College of America, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, twice as Grand Chaplain and is currently serving as Grand First Pillar.

In the York Rite College, Companion Knight Kussman was Initiated into Southern California York Rite College No. 110 and served as Governor in 2005. He was elevated to the Rank of Associate Regent (Order of the Purple Cross). Knight Companion Kussman served the York Rite Sovereign College of North America as Deputy Grand Governor and as Grand Governor of California.

Sir Knight Kussman is a Life Member of Los Angeles Priory No. 27 and Sierra Pacific Priory No. 71, where he served as Prior. Sir Knight was coronated a Knight York Grand Cross of Honor with one quadrant by the Convent General Knights of York Cross of Honor.

He received the degrees of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry in the Valley of Santa Ana, Orient of California. He is a Past Venerable Master of the Orange County Lodge of Perfection and Past Commander of Orange County Council of Knights of Kadosh. He served his Valley for ten years as Chaplain, and on the Investments Committee. Invested with the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour and Coroneted a 33° Inspector General Honorary. Created a Noble in Al Malaikah Temple, Oasis of California, now a member of El Bekal Temple.

In the invitational Masonic orders:

Installed a Knight Companion in St. Croix Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, where he served as Sovereign. Is currently serving the United Grand Imperial Council as Intendant General for the Division of California-Southern. Received and Admitted in California College, Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, and holds honorary memberships Golden State College and Concordia College. He has received his IX° Grade, having served the High Council as Chief Adept for the three Colleges in California. He is currently serving as High Prelate and Deputy Treasurer General. Cousin Kussman is a Past Excellent Chief of Brian Boru Council No. 38 Knight Masons and was honored with the Order of Brian's Harp. He served the High Council Knight Masons of the United States of America as a Superintendent for California. Charter Member of Signet Council No. 230, Allied Masonic Degrees, where he served as Sovereign Master, and is a recipient of the Red Branch of Eri. Appointed to the progressive line of officers of the Grand Council Allied Masonic Degrees serving currently as Junior Grand Deacon. Awarded the Knight Grand Cross of the Red Branch of Eri. Recipient of the 4th Grade in the Ancient and Masonic Order of the Scarlet Cord. Advanced and Promoted a Knight Companion of the Royal Order of Scotland in the Provincial Grand Lodge of the United States of America. Charter member of Lone Star Chapel No. 45 and a member of Trinity Chapel No. 12, Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon. Initiated into Santa Ana/El Toro Chapter No 250, and Camp William Biehl, Heroes of '76, serving as Chapter President and Camp Commander. Currently serving as Chaplain. Dual Membership with Joseph H. Pendleton Chapter No. 243 and Pasadena Chapter No. 265.

Made a Fellow of the Grand College of Rites of the United States of America. Currently serving as Grand Chancellor of the Grand College awarded the Knight Grand Cross.

On March 12, 2022, a special conclave of the Grand Encampment was convened at which time Sir Knight Kussman advanced by succession and was installed as the 61st Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, USA.

Sir Knight Trent was born in Dayton, Ohio and later moved to Mt. Vernon, Ohio where he graduated from high school. He was awarded Bachelors Degrees in Business Administration and Philosophy from Wittenberg University and he also holds a Masters Degree from the Air Force Institute of Technology.

He has been employed by the U.S. Air Force for more than 30 years and is a Senior Manager in Procurement.

Biography of Sir Knight Randal Ellington, GPE

Sir Knight Randal P. Ellington is married to his Lady Dee on October 23rd 2018 and her family has an extensive Masonic background. He was born into a Masonic Family on May 31st, 1970 with his Father Carl being a Member of Cumberland Lodge #726 and his Sister Carla who is a Majority Member of Bethel #67 Job's Daughters and his Brother Roger who is a Senior DeMolay of Cumberland Chapter Order of DeMolay and my Mother Claudine who decided that it was more important that she just wanted to be a Mom and support her family with their Masonic and other endeavors, she did not belong to any Masonic Ladies Organizations but was very involved with the DeMolay Mother's Club and Scouting with both of her son's, Job's Daughters Bethel activities with her daughter Carla and also Home Extension Club, . When Randal turned 13, he was already a Boy Scout, his father and "Dad" Dale Herthel were coffee buddies and his father came home one day with a petition for DeMolay that was signed by Dale's son, Phil Herthel and was informed by his Father that was the way to go.

He was Initiated into the William Hacker Chapter Order of DeMolay in Shelbyville in 1983. He then proceeded up through the ranks and then served as Master Councilor in 1985 for the first time, he had the honor of presenting MWB George R. Tolen, Past Grand Master and also a Senior DeMolay from William Hacker Chapter with his 50yr DeMolay pin at his installation. MWB Tolen was Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge in 1985. He then took a little time off from the Masonic Fraternity and then Farmers Lodge #147 and his mother read in the newspaper that a public meeting talking about re-forming the David Conger Chapter Order of DeMolay in Flat Rock was going to take place. He attended and met Senior DeMolay Roger S. VanGorden, PGM and Russell Hamner, Jr., Treasurer of Farmers Lodge #147 who knew his Father and several other Brothers. He was told by MWB VanGorden that he got to speak about DeMolay since he was the youngest in the group. After attempting to help reform the DeMolay Chapter by initiating members through Franklin Chapter and being involved for a while, he was then asked why he hadn't joined the Lodge by Brother Jeffery Beaver who's son Mike was one of the DeMolay's, he then asked for a petition and then proceeded to join the lodge where he took his Masonic Degree's in 2001. After a failed attempt to reform the David Conger DeMolay Chapter he became more involved with the Franklin Chapter Order of DeMolay and has served on the Advisory Council ever since. Once he joined Farmers Lodge #147 he served in his first office of Senior Deacon in 2002 and became Worshipful Master for the first time in 2005 and then again in 2015.

He has been very fortunate to serve as a twice Past Master, Past Secretary other also Offices and is Farmers Lodge #147's current Secretary. He then petitioned Shelby Chapter #20, Shelby Council #3 and Baldwin Commandery #2 where and took the York Rite Degree's and Order's in a 1 Day Class in 2002. - 2) Promote and continue to support Lawrence V. Kaminsky UD. The presentations given at these meetings are a way for our members to continue to learn and grow. I commend the officers and members of LVK for working on making these presentations readily available for all Sir Knights to use in gaining more knowledge about our fraternity.
 - 3) The R. Frank Williams award should be continued.
- 4) Continue building the Indiana Templar Academies and encourage attendance by all tenured and new Sir Knights. Future ITAs could focus on each degree to help all Sir Knights become more proficient in each.
- 5) Continue to leave the Newby-Avery-Vaught banquet open to all Sir Knights. The Fellows of NAV are important, but it is also important that those Sir Knights who perhaps are unable to financially support NAV with a Fellow are allowed the opportunity to participate in this event.
- 6) Pick a degree for Inspections that all Commanderies will use. We have faced challenges with consistency in scoring for Inspections due to the distinctions of each degree. Using only one will allow the Battalion Commanders and Deputy Battalion Commanders to be trained on how to score that specific degree.
- 7) Continue the Ritual Competition and Drill Competition. While participation is not what we would like to see, we need to encourage Sir Knights and Commanderies to take part in both
- 8) Continue the Holy Land challenge coin fundraiser and continue to promote sending ministers across the state.

Conclusion

I started the year with the goals mentioned at the start of this document. I have seen an increase in the involvement and level of enthusiasm in Commanderies across the state. Sir Knights are wanting and willing to learn new parts and become more active in their Commandery. We "old" members must be willing to let newer ones do these parts, and we need to encourage and support them.

I visited most of the Commanderies in the state, either for an inspection, reception, or stated meeting. I did miss a few, and I apologize to those Commanderies that I was unable to visit. I found during this past year just how quickly time goes and how challenging it can be to try to fit everything in.

Whether I met the goal of serving you, the Sir Knights of Indiana, is something that only you can answer. There is no way for this to be measured by me. I only hope that you feel that I did indeed meet this goal.

I set off on this journey many years ago that has only been possible with a great deal of support from many people. It is hard to believe that the year has passed so quickly and it is now time to turn the leadership of Knights Templar of Indiana over to the next Grand Commander and his officers. I have every confidence that they will continue to promote and support our Commanderies during the upcoming year. I look forward to watching the continued growth and excitement for Commandery in the state of Indiana.

200 – Group Dynamics

400 – Influential Communication

These courses may be attended online (the x01 class) or in-person (the x02 class).

How do I earn the Leadership Award Coin?

The Leadership Award Coin is a prestigious symbol of your commitment to learning and practicing masonic leadership principles.

The coin is given out for completion of the in-person classes. These classes are held at various events and are designated as the x02 classes.

When you attend the 102 you will receive the *Personal Effectiveness* coin segment. Attending the 202 class will earn you the *Group Dynamics* coin segment and attending the 402 class will earn you the *Influential Communication* coin segment.

Online class completion does not earn a coin segment. You must attend an in-person class.

Who should consider this program?

Any member of the Masonic family may participate. We do ask that the youth be mature. For guidance, a young gentleman or lady who is between 14 and 18 and has a mature outlook may be admitted. Admission is always at the discretion of the instructor.

How is the Program structured?

The program consists of three (3) courses, which are titled *Personal Effectiveness* (100), *Group Dynamics* (200), and *Influential Communication* (400). Each course is offered in an online (x01) and an inperson (x02) experience. The in-person classes are held at the Grand Encampment Department Conferences and other events by demand.

Graduation from the program means you have completed at least one class each course, either online or inperson for each course. Keep in mind that there is always more to learn, and you are welcome to repeat any of the classes when they are offered.

Will I receive a certification after completing this program?

You can print a completion certificate for yourself anytime upon completion of each class.

How much does the program cost?

There is no cost for the class itself. If you are attending an in-person class at a conference, there may be a fee required for the conference. You will be responsible for registering for the conference and paying their fee, paying for any meals you wish to have, and your hotel and travel expenses.

2003 00 Proposed Amendment to Section 654 page 8, of the Grand Commandery of Indiana Laws
Updated through April 29, 2022

As written:

REPRESENTATIVES, ECT, AT GRAND ENCAMPMENT CONCLAVES

SECTION 654: Each Grand Officer who is an official delegate or his proxy and each Past Grand Commander who shall be present in attendance at, and representing this Grand Commandery, in the Grand Encampment of the United States, shall be entitled to receive from the funds in the hands of the Grand Treasurer of this Grand Commandery Five Dollars for each day spent in officially attending the Conclaves of the Grand Encampment,

also the further sum of Five cents per mile for each mile necessarily traveled by the most direct route from a place in Indiana going to and returning from such Conclaves PROVIDED, that a past officer of the Grand Commandery, who is already a member of the Grand Encampment, acting as a proxy for an officer of the Grand Commandery to the Grand Encampment shall not receive dual payment for per diem and mileage for attending the Conclaves of the Grand Encampment as such proxy, all others, either as proxies or members of the Grand Encampment shall receive payment as herein provided.

Changed to Read as Follows:

REPRESENTATIVES, ECT, AT GRAND ENCAMPMENT CONCLAVES

SECTION 654: The Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo and the Grand Captain General or their proxies are the official Representatives of this Grand Commandery and are required to attend the Triennial as such and will have all Transportation, Registration fees and Lodging paid from the Triennial Fund referenced in Section 725.

Each Past Grand Commander who shall be in attendance at, and representing this Grand Commandery, is responsible for their own Registration Fees and Lodging at the Triennial, and shall be entitled to receive from the funds in the hands of the Grand Treasurer of this Grand Commandery a per diem as outlined in Section 725, also the further sum allowed by the IRS (Charitable Organization) per mile for each mile necessarily traveled by the most direct route from a place in Indiana going to and returning from such Conclaves. If the use of commercial transportation is used (flying, train, bus) will cover the cost of using "coach or economy", PROVIDED, that a past officer of the Grand Commandery, who is already a member of the Grand Encampment shall not receive dual payments for per diem and mileage for attending the Conclaves of the Grand Encampment as such proxy.

Holy Land Pilgrimage Bar & Jewel (Awarded for pre-determined donation amounts)

ITA Bar (Optional bar can be worn in lieu of present decoration)

Past Commanders Association Bar (Optional bar that may be worn in lieu of PSA Jewel)

Bar Racks (Adopt the use of a multi bar holder that keeps bars aligned and promotes ease of placement on uniform)

Resolution to Grand Commandery Law

A Resolution was received to add Section 917 to the Laws of the Grand Commandery and read as follows.

Proposed by: SK William Short, SK Randy Darling, SK David Miller, II, SK Doug Patmore

A Resolution to amend the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana by adding a Section 917.

- WHEREAS: Competitive Drills have long been a tradition and integral facet of Indiana Templary.
- WHEREAS: participating in drills is crucial for the exemplification of the Commandery Orders.
- WHEREAS: it is readily apparent that those trained in drills display a sense of unity, discipline, and military bearing which serves as an example for all Hoosier Templars.
- WHEREAS: Drill Team members are dedicated to many hours of practice, sacrificing their time, energy, and fortune in preparing for and attending drill competitions.
- WHEREAS: experienced drill members are enabled to instruct in sword skills and tactics that serve to benefit all Indiana Commanderies.
- WHEREAS: there is no current form of uniform accoutrements specific to Drill Team members as drill bars are awarded to all who participate in pass in reviews.
- WHEREAS: a proper acknowledgment is necessary to recognize and reward drill members for their perseverance, fidelity, and loyalty to the advancement of Templarism.
- WHEREAS: Competitive Drills have declined over the past several years, and a highly visible form of recognition would serve to incentivize Sir Knights to augment existing or forming new Drill Teams, as they aspire to attain the right to wear the coveted Drill Cord.
- WHEREAS: a means of displaying and rewarding the pride in Templar Drills that these Sir Knights possess, is well earned, and long overdue.
- RESOLVED: that a shoulder cord in the fashion of the membership cord, consisting of gold and white, the first color being the outside color, be approved for wearing on the right shoulder of Sir Knights who are active Drill Team members, thereby recognizing those Sir Knights for promoting, expanding, and perpetuating the legendary Indiana Drills tradition.
- RESOLVED: that a shoulder cord of white and gold, reversing the active membership colors, be approved for wearing on the right shoulder for those Sir Knights who have actively participated in drills for a period of not less than 10 years, that may be worn thereafter, thereby honoring their long commitment and sacrifices in preserving the storied history of Indiana Drills.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that owing to the innate knowledge of the respective Drill Captains, it shall be the sole discretion of said Captains to determine eligibility of/and awarding of Drill Cord

Action of the Grand Commandery on the Resolution to add Section 917. There was a discussion on the floor of the Grand Commandery and Jurisprudence Advised that this be sent to the Uniform Committee to be evaluated and back to the Proposers and that it would lay over till the 170th Annual Conclave and would fall under Unfinished Business.
